Minutes of Meeting

The Board of Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors held a regular meeting on August 31 & September 1, 2011 at the Board Office located at 1510 E. Watertower St., Ste. 110, Meridian, Idaho 83642 to conduct Board business. The meeting convened at 8:10 a.m. on Wednesday, August 31, 2011 with the following Board members present: James H. Milligan, David Bennion, George Wagner, and John Elle. Also present was David L. Curtis, Executive Director, Jim Szatkowski, Deputy Director, and Jennifer Rowe, Administrative Assistant.

Attorney Mike Kane joined the meeting.

i. AGENDA REVIEW

Are there any new agenda items? Mr. Wagner indicated that he would like to discuss issues relating to the international mobility of PE and LS license holders. This topic will be added to the agenda as NEW BUSINESS Item #20.

Ron Hodge, PLS, President of the Idaho Society of Professional Land Surveyors, joined the meeting.

I. READING OF MINUTES

1. Review Minutes of the June 7-8, 2011 meeting.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Elle to approve the minutes of the June 7 & 8, 2011 meeting as distributed. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe absent.

2. Review Minutes of the Board Retreat, August 4-5, 2011.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Bennion to approve the minutes of the August 4 & 5, 2011 meeting as distributed. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe absent.

II. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA

1. The following items have been continued at previous meetings and staff is unaware of any activity relating to these matters:

- a. FY10.09 Lund, Michael, Rules of Professional Responsibility. A preliminary investigation was authorized. On advice of Counsel, the investigation was halted pending the outcome of an investigation by the Office of the Attorney General. An ORDER extending the time until 6 months after the end of litigation has been signed.

- b. FY10.18 Forsgren Associates, Inc. Rules of Professional Responsibility. This matter was continued pending the outcome of civil litigation.
- c. FY11.09 Holladay Engineering, Conflict of interest, Standard of Care relating to Emmett Waste Water Treatment plant. This matter was continued pending the outcome of civil litigation.
- d. FY11.11 Erickson, Chad, Standard of Care. Mr. & Mrs. Badertscher submitted a complaint regarding the survey work of Chad R. Erickson. The work included locating a previous corner which was apparently incorrectly and previously located by Carl Edwards and others. The location of this corner affects a Badertscher's property line as well as several others. Mr. Erickson submitted a detailed response to the complaint. Staff notified the Badertschers that the complaint lacks the requirements for a formal complaint and will be considered a request for inquiry. Staff found that the matter is already under litigation and is scheduled for trial in September 2011. This matter was continued pending the outcome of civil litigation.

- 2. With a recent renewal, a license holder included a note for the Board regarding on-line renewals.
- 3. Stephen Parke provided an update on the engineering programs at NNU.

While reviewing the Consent Agenda, the Board questioned why disciplinary matters that are in litigation are included. Attorney Kane explained the pitfalls of parallel investigations and why it is best to postpone these matters until such time as the civil litigation is resolved.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Wagner to approve the Consent Agenda with no further action. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe absent.

Ron Hodge left the meeting.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

- 4. A licensee inquired of the Board whether or not a "Finders Fee" violates IDAPA 10.01.02 Sec. 009.01?

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Bennion to authorize the Chair to write a letter to Nels Trygstad and inform him that the Board is of the opinion that to enter into that relationship with the Realtor would be a violation of IDAPA 10.01.02.009.01. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe absent.

6. The Board considered input from stakeholders on possible statutory amendments for final markup of strike-and-underscore changes to submit to the Legislative Council. The Governor's office informed us that they will not allow us to request legislation to provide applicant's with an earned doctoral degree an alternative path to licensure that does not include taking and passing the PE exam. Mr. Curtis discussed his meeting with Tammy Perkins and Wayne Hammond from the Governor's Office.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Wagner to authorize staff to proceed with bill preparation relating to postponement of Board action for pending disciplinary or exam irregularity. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe absent.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Bennion to authorize staff to proceed with bill preparation relating to eliminating the requirement that applications be submitted under oath. Staff directed to prepare amended rules pending passage. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe absent.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Elle to authorize staff to proceed with bill preparation relating to residency requirement. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe absent.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Wagner to authorize staff to proceed with bill preparation relating to allowing a PLS in the same business entity to place interior monuments if the original surveyor is unavailable. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe absent.

7. A licensee inquired whether or not the Board has a policy on software developers being called engineers?

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Bennion to authorize the Chair to write to Mr. Fleishman and let him know that the Board is of the opinion that we have no control over what titles a company uses for their positions. If the position involves the practice of engineering as defined in Idaho Codes Section 54-1202 and those services are being offered to the public, then they must be licensed as a professional engineer. The Board thanks Mr. Fleishman for raising the issue and will continue to better define what constitutes the practice of engineering. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe absent.

10. A Kootenai County Building Official had questions relating to the authority of building code plan examiners and building inspectors who are not licensed engineers.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Bennion to authorize the Chair to respond to Mr. Ankersmit as noted in the linked attachment with the introductory comment that engineers should cooperate with the building officials. In addition to that, if the Building Official does not have the expertise to do a thorough and appropriate review of the

construction documents, they should seek assistance from a person who possesses that expertise. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe absent.

12. Engineered Control Systems Inc. is requesting that the Board allow the use of the term "engineered" in the company name.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Elle to authorize Attorney Kane to write to the firm and inform them that the Board declines to waive objection to the use of the name which implies engineering capabilities in disciplines of engineering for which there are licensing examinations. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe absent.

17. Mr. Anderson requested that the Board allow his license to lapse until such time as he can complete the required CPD.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Bennion to authorize staff to contact Mr. Anderson to negotiate a Stipulation and Consent Agreement to allow him to earn the CPD necessary to make up the deficiency. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe absent.

18. Sno Engineering Inc. is requesting that the Board allow them to use the assumed business name SE Group in Idaho.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Elle to authorize Attorney Kane to write to Sno Engineering Inc. and notify them that the Board waives objection to their use of the assumed business name, but we are concerned that their letter implies that they may be offering services which would fall under the definition of the practice of engineering in Idaho Code. Inform them that unlicensed practice is a criminal misdemeanor. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe absent.

19. Staff asked the Board to clarify what constitutes a "resident" for the purpose of applying to sit for an exam in Idaho.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Wagner to authorize Attorney Kane to work with staff and define "resident" for staff's use in advising exam applicants. The Board will review the conclusion at the next meeting. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe absent.

VI. CONSIDERATION OF DISCIPLINARY MATTERS

The following three Disciplinary Dockets were discussed at the Board Retreat and Stipulation and Consent Orders were accepted for all three pending receipt of the administrative penalties. Staff requested permission to close these dockets upon receipt of the administrative penalties.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Wagner to authorize staff to close these dockets upon receipt of the administrative penalties. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe absent.

FY10.28 Allen, Brian J., Surveying Practices Standard of Care. The Administrative Hearing on this matter has been rescheduled for March 5 & 6, 2012 at the Board office.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Bennion to continue this matter to hearing. Motion passed unanimously.

FY11.04 TCGroup, Inc., unlicensed – no COA. Certificate of Authorization number 2738 was issued to TCGroup, Inc. on June 17, 2011. Staff recommends that this matter be closed.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Elle to close this docket. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe absent.

FY11.15 Smetana, John D., standard of care. We received the attached letter from the Attorneys representing the complainant in the subject matter indicating that the litigation is complete and there is little to be gleaned from the matter since it was settled through mediation and settlement amounts are confidential.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Wagner to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Elle, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Bennion, yes; and Mr. Wagner, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Wagner to authorize staff to conduct a preliminary investigation in this matter. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe absent.

FY11.18 Unger, Douglas, ROPR statements. Mr. Kane sent a letter to the complainant as directed.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Wagner to close this docket. Motion passed unanimously.

FY11.19 APEX Manufacturing Solutions, LLC, unlicensed practice. The Board continued this matter at the June meeting. No response was received from APEX.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Wagner to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Elle, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Bennion, yes; and Mr. Wagner, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Bennion to authorize Attorney Kane to write to APEX and notify them of the requirements of Idaho Code as well as consequences of non-compliance (i.e. injunction, prosecution). Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe absent.

FY12.01 Burton, Thomas, Failure to follow Board Order. Mr. Burton's license to practice as a professional land surveyor in Washington was revoked for failing to follow an ORDER of the Washington Board. Mr. Burton is a licensee in Idaho.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Elle to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Elle, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Bennion, yes; and Mr. Wagner, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Bennion to authorize staff to negotiate a Stipulation and Consent Order regarding his PLS license in Idaho. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe absent.

Mr. Bennion left the meeting.

FY12.02 All Seasons Landscaping, unlicensed practice

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Elle to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Wagner, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; and Mr. Elle, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Wagner to authorize the Chair to sign a letter to complainant, note letter from attorney explaining misuse of term "engineering". As unlicensed persons we can only seek injunction or criminal prosecution and we choose not to do so in light of the compliance. If you feel that you have been fraudulently billed for services labeled "engineering" you may have redress. The Board authorizes the Chair to sign a letter to respondent informing them of consequences of unlicensed practice. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe and Mr. Bennion absent.

FY12.03 Morey, Charles & Gilbert, Troy, Standard of Care

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Elle to authorize staff to conduct a preliminary investigation into this matter. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe and Mr. Bennion absent.

Attorney Kane left the meeting.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

3. Tom Ruby requested the Board's guidance relating to a project. Mr. Elle communicated with Mr. Ruby and may have answered his inquiry. Mr. Ruby did not send additional information and has communicated informally with Mr. Elle.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

2. Staff presented an Expense Reimbursement Summary for the Executive Director from June 1, 2011 through August 15, 2011 for the Board's review.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Elle to approve the Expense Reimbursement Summary as presented. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe and Mr. Bennion absent.

3. Staff provided an update on the Board's financial status as of July 31, 2011 as well as a final summary for FY2011. The Board noted the information.
5. Changes have been made to Idaho Code Title 65, Chapter 5 relating to Veteran's Preferences in employment. Staff provided a draft policy for the Board's review.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Elle to accept the draft policy as presented. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe and Mr. Bennion absent.

8. EAC/ABET and TAC/ABET will be reviewing programs at ISU this fall. Does the Board want to send an observer?

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Wagner to name Mr. Szatkowski as Board Observer for the EAC and TAC visits. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Bennion and Mr. Howe absent.

9. Staff made its annual presentation of the "Satisfaction Survey" with recommendations.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Elle to authorize the staff to contract for services to make applications web-based not to exceed \$2,500. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe and Mr. Bennion absent.

11. Does the Board want staff to invite the Deans from ISU (Engineering programs and Geomatics program), UI, BSU, BYU-Idaho, and Mr. Parke from NNU to the November 7-9, 2011 meeting?

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Elle to authorize staff to invite the Deans to the November Board Meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

15. Mr. Monlux was selected for CPD audit. He has submitted his log but there is a question as to whether or not his teaching would count as PDHs.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Elle to authorize the Chair to send a letter to Mr. Monlux and state that his explanation of "regular work" is not adequate. The Board will not allow PDH's for multiple presentations of the same course. The Board requests that he submit an explanation of what he does for a living, including the teaching of these courses. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe and Mr. Bennion absent.

Mr. Bennion rejoined the meeting.

16. Staff completed a draft FY2011 Annual Report for the Board's review.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Wagner to approve the FY2011 Annual Report as presented and authorize the Chair and Secretary to sign. Motion passed with Mr. Howe absent.

Mr. Howe joined the meeting.

Attorneys Kane and Naylor joined the meeting.

An ORDER extending the time until 6 months after the end of litigation has been signed. Mr. Naylor reviewed these matters and provided his opinion for the Board to review.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Elle to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Wagner, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Bennion, yes; and Mr. Elle, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Bennion to dismiss and close FY08.23a due to the fact that it is beyond the statute of limitations. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize the staff to negotiate Stipulation and Consent Orders for Mr. Bessaw and WGI. Failing that, authorize the filing of a formal complaint and schedule a hearing. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Wagner recused.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Elle to direct Attorney Naylor to communicate with the complainant regarding dismissal of FY08.23a. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Wagner recused.

Attorney Naylor left the meeting.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Review Strategic Plan Objectives. The Board reviewed the Strategic Plan and made no further changes.
2. Subcommittee Updates
 - a. Item Writing (John Howe and Gary Young): The subcommittee will report to the Board on the preparation of the final State Specific exam by TEST, Inc. and its deployment.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Elle to direct staff to schedule another item writing workshop in conjunction with the 2012 ISPLS Annual meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

- c. Obligation to Communicate Discovery of Discrepancy (David Bennion and George Wagner): Language was drafted for a Proposed Rule.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Wagner to authorize staff to complete rule promulgation using “may” rather than “shall” at the end of the section being amended. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Wagner to dissolve this subcommittee. Motion passed unanimously.

- d. Idaho Code 33-356 allows that School Districts may seek to qualify for a reduction in building replacement value calculations for qualified, newly constructed public school buildings... and requires that these buildings be designed with an Integrated Design process and have Fundamental Building Commissioning performed. The code also directs the Division of Building Safety to assist schools in accessing the technical and educational

support needed to implement the processes of integrated design and fundamental commissioning. They've promulgated IDAPA Rule 07.03.01.038 to provide this information. It states that DBS maintains a list of qualified Commissioning Agents who are certified by the Building Commissioning Association (BCA). The BCA's Certification Program does not require the individual to be a PE, but PE's are able to become certified. The Board previously addressed this commissioning issue in response to an inquiry by DPW in 2001. Mr. Szatkowski reviewed the website and it seems that the offending material has been removed.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Elle to direct Mr. Wagner and Mr. Bennion to liaise with ACEC-Idaho regarding possible conflict of statutes on building commissioning and engineering practice. Motion passed unanimously.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

Ron Hodge, PLS joined the meeting.

14. The Board responded to a question from Ron Hodge at the June meeting. Mr. Hathaway had some additional questions on the same subject.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Elle to authorize the Chair to write to Mr. Hathaway and inform him that the law does not require monumentation of points on a line unless that point is a corner as defined in Idaho Code. Motion passed unanimously.

Attorney Kane left the meeting.

13. Frances Hood, ITD, requested the Board's input on the use of GPS due to recent developments.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Elle to authorize the Chair to write to the Idaho Congressional Delegation pointing out the need for GPS signals that are not disrupted by other users in the radio frequency bandwidth. We do not object to the expansion of the broadband network capability. This is not an issue to protect the practice of land surveyors and engineers, but an issue that impacts many facets including engineering, construction, precision agriculture practices, navigation, etc. Staff directed to send a copy to the Governor, Frances Hood at ITD, the Department of Lands, ISPLS, ISPE, and ACEC. Motion passed unanimously.

Ron Hodge left the meeting.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

2. Subcommittee Updates

- e. Structural Engineers Subcommittee (David Bennion and John Elle): The subcommittee will explore what type of projects should be restricted to structural engineers. SEAI has been contacted and will provide feedback in the near future. The Board noted the information.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

1. Reports by Board Members and Staff of activities since the June Board meeting. All Board Members, Mr. Curtis and Mr. Szatkowski attended the Board Retreat in Riggins, Idaho and the NCEES Annual Meeting in Providence, Rhode Island. In addition, Mr. Szatkowski attended a Law Enforcement Task Force Committee meeting; attended an ITD SWPPP subcommittee meeting and attended the Sustainable Building Task Force Committee meeting. Mr. Curtis attended the PNWER meeting in Portland, Oregon. Mr. Bennion attended the ITD SWPPP subcommittee meeting. Mr. Howe attended the EPS Committee meeting in Clemson, South Carolina and the ISPLS Board of Governors meeting in McCall, Idaho. Mr. Elle corresponded with Mr. Ruby regarding a surveying issue. Mr. Milligan attended the Civil PE Exam Committee meeting in Clemson, South Carolina; attended PNWER in Portland, Oregon and attended the ITD SWPPP subcommittee meeting.

20. Mr. Wagner asked the Board to discuss international mobility for professional engineering and land surveying licenses. Mr. Wagner addressed 4 issues.
 1. NCEES is on track to administer and sell exams internationally the result of which may be outsourcing of engineering jobs.
 2. Foreign engineering students gain their education in the United States and then cannot stay in this country and apply their education here.
 3. Foreign engineering students gain their education outside the United States but then come to the United States to practice.
 4. Foreign engineering students gain their education outside the United States, pass the NCEES exams, and do not reside in the United States but request licensure.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize the creation of a subcommittee chaired by Mr. Wagner and including Mr. Bennion, to further study this issue and how we might take our concerns to NCEES and address them in Idaho statute. The subcommittee will work toward action items that can be presented to the Western Zone at the 2012 meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

21. Attorney Kane requested an increase in his allowable hourly rate from \$125 per hour to \$135 per hour.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Bennion to approve the requested increase in hourly rate. Motion passed unanimously.

- Cerenico Gozo Madrona for licensure as a professional engineer especially qualified in civil engineering on the basis of comity with his licensure in California.
- Gary Panariello for licensure as a professional engineer especially qualified in structural engineering on the basis of comity with his licensure in Florida and California.

Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Bennion to deny the application of Timothy Elden Bryan for licensure as a professional engineer especially qualified in mechanical engineering on the basis of comity with his licensure in Washington. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Bennion to approve the application of Chris Dalton Hamilton for licensure as a professional land surveyor on the basis of comity with his licensure in Wyoming. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Elle to continue the application of Hanna Sloan for licensure as a professional engineer especially qualified in civil engineering on the basis of comity with her licensure in Colorado pending additional documentation. Motion passed with Mr. Milligan and Mr. Wagner opposing the motion.

NON-STANDARD – EXAMS

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Wagner to deny Ryan Aafedt's request for waiver of the Fundamentals of Engineering examination and approve Ryan Aafedt's assignment to the FE upon receipt of an application. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Bennion recused.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Wagner to assign Daniel J. Friesen to the Fundamentals of Engineering examination. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Wagner to assign Jairo Hernandez to the Principles and Practice of Engineering examination in the civil discipline. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Elle to continue the application of Eric J. Howard for the Principles and Practice of Surveying examination pending additional documentation. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Elle to reaffirm the Board's previous decision in the application of Jordan Hristov for the Principles and Practice of Surveying examination. Motion passed unanimously.

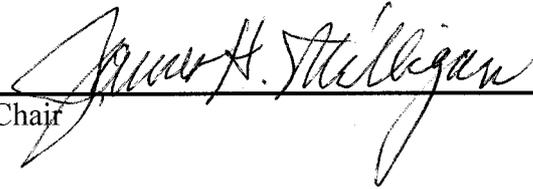
