Minutes of Meeting

The Board of Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors held a regular meeting on April 25 & 26, 2013 at the Board Office, 1510 E. Watertower, Ste. 110, Meridian, ID 83642 to conduct Board business. The meeting convened at 8:00 a.m. on Thursday, April 25, 2013 with the following Board members present: David Bennion, John Howe, George Wagner and George Murgel. Also present was David L. Curtis, Executive Director, Jim Szatkowski, Deputy Director and Jennifer Rowe, Administrative Assistant.

i. AGENDA REVIEW

Are there any new agenda items? The Board added a discussion of rescheduling the June Board meeting as New Business Item #21. A report from the NCEES Western Zone meeting was added as New Business Item #22.

I. READING OF MINUTES

1. Review Minutes of the February 4 & 5, 2013 Board meeting.

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Howe to direct staff to develop minutes of meetings held on February 1, March 8, and March 11 to consider personnel matters. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Wagner to direct staff to note in the minutes of the February meeting that items that were on previous consent agendas and have been acted on should be accounted for and removed from the consent agenda. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Wagner to approve the minutes from the February 4 & 5, 2013 meeting as amended. Motion passed unanimously.

II. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA

1. The following items have been continued at previous meetings and staff is unaware of any activity relating to these matters:

- a. FY11.11 Erickson, Chad, Standard of Care. Mr. & Mrs. Badertscher submitted a complaint regarding the survey work of Chad R. Erickson. The work included locating a previous corner which was apparently incorrectly and previously located by Carl Edwards and others. The location of this corner affects a Badertscher's

property line as well as several others. Mr. Erickson submitted a detailed response to the complaint. Staff has notified the Badertschers that the complaint lacks the requirements for a formal complaint and will be considered a request for inquiry. Pending outcome of litigation. Mr. Erickson has provided a response from his client's attorney.

- b. FY11.09 Holladay Engineering, Conflict of interest, Standard of Care relating to Emmett Waste Water Treatment plant.
 - c. FY13.06 Ruen, Darius, ROPR. Pending resolution of litigation and a determination of whether there are substantive matters to be further investigated.
 - d. FY13.10 Bartolome, Todd A., ROPR. Pending decision to move forward from Mr. Ruen.
- 2. David Widmer, PLS announced his candidacy for NCEES President-Elect.
 - 3. Northwest Nazarene University will have a mock-ABET visit and self-study done by November 2013.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Howe to note the consent agenda and direct staff to provide an update on all remaining items at the next meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- 3. The Board discussed Flood Relief Specialists at their previous meeting. Some additional information was received on this matter from Mr. Judge.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Dr. Murgel to authorize the Chair to write a letter to Mr. Judge and ask if he wants to file a complaint against anyone. The Board cannot act unless Mr. Judge provides details relating to lenders, surveyors, "outfit in Texas", etc. If that information is available, please provide it. Motion passed unanimously.

- 6. Centric Corporation no longer holds a current Certificate of Authorization but continued to maintain the dba "Centric Engineering" in Idaho. Attorney Kane wrote to Centric as directed at the February meeting and informed them that they must maintain a Certificate of Authorization to continue to use that name. Mr. Kane reported that Centric Corporation renewed their Certificate of Authorization. The Board noted the information.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

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6. Concerns were raised about HB 265 relating to Idaho Code section 54-1218. These concerns were addressed during the legislative session and amendments to the bill were filed. The bill as signed into law was acceptable to the engineering community. The Board noted the information.
7. Mr. Ramey was unable to meet the CPD requirements due to extenuating circumstances.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Dr. Murgel to authorize the Chair to write to Mr. Ramey and ask for CPD log and attendance records for period prior to audit period as well as the current audit period. In the event the PDH's are insufficient, the Board will allow up to a year to make up any deficiencies. Any PDH's used to make up that deficiency will not count for the current renewal period. Motion passed unanimously.

8. Brett Smith requested that the Board review SPCC plans.

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Wagner to authorize Mr. Kane to write to Mr. Smith and tell him that if he wants to seal SPCC plans on projects physically located in Idaho he must be licensed as a Professional Engineer in Idaho. Motion passed unanimously.

9. Staff received a request to include engineers and surveyors data in a study the Dept. of Labor is conducting using college graduate information in Idaho and tracking them through their professional careers. The Dept. of Labor requested to use our licensing database to correlate the data from other sources including the universities and colleges. Besides the publicly available information on the website, they wanted to access the social security numbers, or a portion of the number (such as the last four numbers), to match students with licensees. Staff requested an opinion from Attorney Kane's office regarding this matter and a further discussion of the use of the SSN in the NCEES Enforcement Exchange.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Dr. Murgel to authorize the Chair to write to Mr. Riley and let him know that we will not release social security numbers of our licensees or certificate holders. Motion passed unanimously.

10. Mr. Howe requested a discussion of one of the requirements of 55-1906(2) be included on the agenda.

Mr. Clark, PLS joined the meeting.

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Wagner to indicate that the Board interprets "any" to mean "all" and invite licensees and stakeholders to submit information on why

all previous corner records should not be listed. The Board authorized staff to write article relating to this subject for the NEW BULLETIN. Motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Clark left the meeting.

12. A Professional Land Surveyor requested guidance from the Board on the CPD requirements.

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize the Chair to write to licensee and let licensee know that since he has not renewed his license, he cannot practice. At such time as he chooses to renew he should check with the Board staff and they will let him know what he will need to do to bring his continuing professional development status current. Motion passed unanimously.

13. Alltech Engineering Corp. requested permission to use their business name in Idaho. They do not perform engineering services.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Dr. Murgel to authorize Attorney Kane to write to Alltech Engineering Corp. and notify them that they can do business under a DBA which does not include the word "engineering" in it. Motion passed unanimously.

14. Dr. Reichmuth requested that he be exempt from the CPD requirement based on extenuating circumstances.

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Wagner to authorize the Chair to write to Dr. Reichmuth and let him know that he needs to complete the log of qualifying "activities" as defined in the Administrative Rules that are outside his normal job activities. Motion passed unanimously.

16. NCEES sent a confirmation letter of services that will be provided beginning January 1, 2014, to be signed by the Board.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Dr. Murgel to authorize the Chair to sign a letter of agreement subject to review and approval by Attorney Kane of the final version. Motion passed unanimously.

19. Tim Haener submitted questions relating to the position of Project Manager.

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize Attorney Kane and Mr. Szatkowski to work with Mr. Haener to better define the issue and report back to the Board at the June meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Curtis left the meeting.

FY10.28 Allen, Brian J., Surveying Practices Standard of Care. A Petition for Judicial Review was filed relating to this matter.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Howe to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Wagner, yes; Dr. Murgel, yes and Mr. Bennion, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

The Board noted the information.

Mr. Curtis returned to the meeting.

FY13.08 Seaverson, Jason, ROPR. Attorney Naylor negotiated a Stipulation and Consent Order for this docket.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Howe to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Wagner, yes; Dr. Murgel, yes and Mr. Bennion, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Dr. Murgel to authorize the Chair to sign the Stipulation and Consent Order and close this docket. Motion passed unanimously.

FY13.12 Elgee, Tim, Unlicensed Practice

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Wagner to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Wagner, yes; Dr. Murgel, yes and Mr. Bennion, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Dr. Murgel to authorize Attorney Kane to write to Mr. Elgin and let him know that he must be licensed to offer the services he indicates on his web site or we may seek an injunction or criminal prosecution. Motion passed unanimously.

FY13.13 Mountain West Transformer, unlicensed practice

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Wagner to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d).

Roll call vote results; Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Wagner, yes; Dr. Murgel, yes and Mr. Bennion, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Dr. Murgel to wait for a response to Mr. Szatkowski's original letter. If a timely response is not received, authorize Attorney Kane to write to Mountain West Transformer and let them know that they must be licensed to offer the services indicated on their web site or we may seek an injunction or criminal prosecution. Motion passed unanimously.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Review Strategic Plan Objectives. As part of the Zero Based Budgeting exercise, staff reviewed the Strategic Plan in relation to the agency needs, mandates and mission. Staff proposed changes to the Strategic Plan based on this exercise. Staff was directed to incorporate the suggested changes and present to the Board at the June meeting.

Stephen Parke and Dan Lawrence of Northwest Nazarene University joined the meeting.

5. NNU received a memo from Dr. Milligan and updated their curriculum based on his concerns.

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Wagner to consider the NNU program as a Board approved program pending receipt of a letter from EAC/ABET that the Readiness Review does not indicate a problem with the curriculum. Motion passed unanimously.

Stephen Parke and Dan Lawrence left the meeting.

2. Subcommittee Updates

- a. Item Writing (Mr. Howe, Mr. Elle and Mr. Young): At the last meeting the subcommittee informed the Board that the items have been approved and sent to the psychometricians for inclusion in the item bank. The Board noted the information.
- b. Structural Engineers Subcommittee (Mr. Bennion and Mr. Elle): The subcommittee will explore what type of projects should be restricted to structural engineers. Staff was directed to procure laws from other jurisdictions regarding structural engineering requirements. Mr. Bennion and Mr. Elle will coordinate a meeting with the stakeholders. The Board noted the information.

- c. International Mobility Subcommittee (Mr. Wagner and Mr. Elle): The subcommittee will study (1) NCEES administering and selling exams internationally the result of which may be outsourcing of engineering jobs. (2) Foreign engineering students gain their education in the US and then cannot stay. (3) Foreign engineering students gain their education outside the US but come to the US to practice. (4) Foreign engineering students gain their education outside the US, pass the NCEES exams, but do not reside in the US but request licensure in the US. The subcommittee, staff and Board Counsel will further study the existing statutes and rules and see how they apply to consideration of applicants who have been educated and/or licensed in a foreign country and/or has obtained their experience outside the United States. Mr. Wagner will coordinate a meeting with Mr. Elle and Mr. Curtis. The Board noted the information.
 - d. Surveying FAQ (Frequently Asked Questions) Page Subcommittee (Mr. Howe and Mr. Elle): The subcommittee reviews changes to the surveying laws and assists staff in updating the Surveying FAQ web page. Mr. Howe and Mr. Elle are working with Mr. Szatkowski to keep the FAQ's current. The Board noted the information.
 - e. MOE (Master's or Equivalent) for Engineers Subcommittee (Mr. Wagner and Dr. Murgel): The subcommittee will form a task force of interested and affected professional and technical societies to review potential legislation focused on MOE for engineers. Mr. Wagner and Dr. Murgel to pursue the issue and see if a coalition of stakeholders (all disciplines and societies) can be developed. Mr. Wagner has a list of professional organizations that are stakeholders. Mr. Curtis conducted a survey of NCEES Member Board Administrators regarding discipline versus generic licensing and whether there were variable requirements for licensure in different disciplines. Mr. Wagner will coordinate a meeting with the stakeholders. Staff directed to find contacts with the various technical societies and government agencies. The Board noted the information.
 - f. Principal Definition Subcommittee: (Mr. Wagner): The subcommittee will gather input from stakeholders regarding possible definitions for "principal" prior to rule promulgation. Attorney Kane will further research Idaho Code requirements of conflict of interest of elected officials and develop suggested changes to Rules of Professional Responsibility for consideration by the subcommittee and stakeholders. Subcommittee met March 7, 2013. The Board is promulgating amendments to the Administrative Rules. The Chairman dissolved this subcommittee.
4. There were changes to the original procedure relating to implementation of Computer Based Testing in 2014. The education restriction may ease use of the

“Automatic” option for exam registration. The Board noted the information and will take this matter up at a future Board meeting.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Dr. Murgel to elect Mr. Wagner as Vice Chairman. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Dr. Murgel elect Mr. Elle as Secretary. Motion passed unanimously.

5. The Washington Board is considering an electronic/digital seal/signature guideline for PE/PLSs.

The Board directed staff to develop an Idaho Guideline for use of digital signatures for review by the Board at the next meeting and consideration for inclusion in FAQ's.

15. Staff drafted a NEWS BULLETIN for the Board's review.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Howe approve the NEWS BULLETIN with additional articles about corner records, CPD logs and Open House for Mr. Curtis. Motion passed unanimously.

17. Staff discussed Executive Order 2007-07 with the Board in regards to reimbursement of license fees for staff. The Board noted the information.

18. Andrew McLeod, PEng. and Kim Allen, PEng. sent letters to Mr. Curtis and requested that they be presented at the Board meeting. The Board noted the information.

21. Rescheduling June Board meeting.

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Howe to reschedule the June Board meeting to June 5 & 6, 2013. The meeting will begin at 8:00 a.m. on June 5th and continue through June 6th as necessary. Motion passed unanimously.

22. Report from Western Zone meeting.

Mr. Howe reported on the Surveyor's Forum at which the issue of the inclusion of "engineering surveys" in the definition of the practice of engineering was discussed. Surveyors were not in favor of the Task Force recommended changes to the definition and favored leaving the definition as is.

Mr. Bennion reported that Ric Moore was elected Secretary-Treasurer. Next year's meeting will be held in Lincoln, Nebraska. The issue of the structural engineer licensing model was discussed and there may be a task force created to try to resolve the issue. The Industrial Exemption Task Force was interesting. "Junk webinars" are a problem for continuing professional development. President Elect Patty Mamola will create a Task Force to help consistently evaluate foreign experience. Mr. Bennion told NCEES that they should charge a premium for exams administered in foreign countries.

The Board recessed at 5:10 p.m. on April 25, 2013.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Dr. Murgel to continue the application of Gordon Crawford for licensure as a professional engineer especially qualified in mechanical engineering on the basis of comity with his licensure in Washington pending passage of the Fundamentals of Engineering examination. Motion failed with Mr. Howe voting in favor of the motion.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Dr. Murgel to approve the application of Gordon Crawford for licensure as a professional engineer especially qualified in mechanical engineering on the basis of comity with his licensure in Washington. Motion passed with Mr. Howe voting against the motion.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Dr. Murgel to deny the application of Matthew James Huelsman for licensure as a professional engineer especially qualified in civil engineering on the basis of comity with his licensure in Oregon. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Howe to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Wagner, yes; Dr. Murgel, yes and Mr. Bennion, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

The Board reviewed the remaining personnel funds for FY13 and noted the information.

The Board directed staff to add an article to the NEWS BULLETIN about a potential fee increase.

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


