Minutes of Meeting

The Board of Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors held a regular meeting on November 14 & 15, 2013 at the Board Office, 1510 E. Watertower, Ste. 110, Meridian, ID 83642 to conduct Board business. The meeting convened at 8:00 a.m. on Thursday, November 14, 2013 with the following Board members present: John Howe, George Wagner, John Elle and George Murgel. Also present was Keith Simila, Executive Director, Jim Szatkowski, Deputy Director and Jennifer Rowe, Administrative Assistant.

- i. **AGENDA REVIEW** - Are there any new agenda items? A complaint was received and will be added to the agenda under Disciplinary Matters FY14.04 through FY14.07. A signed Stipulation and Consent Order was received for FY13.18 and will be added for the Board's review.

**IV. NEW BUSINESS**

13. The Board will meet with Deans and Representatives from the Idaho Colleges of Engineering. The Board met with Aaron Schellenberg of BYU-Idaho, Rich Brey of Idaho State University, Arya Ebrahimpour of Idaho State University, Amy Moll of Boise State University, Duke M. Bulanon of Northwest Nazarene University and Larry Stauffer of the University of Idaho. Each made a separate report to the Board on the status of their respective programs. Some of the items discussed included: enrollment, ABET accreditation status, curricula, the progress of faculty licensure and changes being made for CBT testing.

**III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

5. The Board discussed a proposed language change to Idaho Code 54-1212(3) with the Deans.

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Elle to approve the language as modified by the Board. Motion passed unanimously.

6. Mr. Simila drafted a proposed rule change that expands the use of credentials evaluations to include all non-EAC/ABET accredited engineering programs.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Dr. Murgel to accept the proposed rule change as written and direct staff to provide similar language for comity applications at the next Board meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

**IV. NEW BUSINESS**

November 14 & 15, 2013

14. The Board discussed the transition to CBT and student certification of enrollment status.

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Elle to approve the new Engineer Intern/Surveyor Intern application form pending opinion by counsel if SSN can be changed to collect only the last 4 digits. Motion passed unanimously.

### **III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

#### **2. Subcommittee Updates**

- e. MOE (Master's or Equivalent) for Engineers Subcommittee (Mr. Wagner and Dr. Murgel): The subcommittee will form a task force of interested and affected professional and technical societies to review potential legislation focused on MOE for engineers. Mr. Wagner and Dr. Murgel to pursue the issue and see if a coalition of stakeholders (all disciplines and societies) can be developed. Mr. Wagner has a list of professional organizations that are stakeholders. Mr. Curtis conducted a survey of NCEES Member Board Administrators regarding discipline versus generic licensing and whether there were variable requirements for licensure in different disciplines. Mr. Wagner will coordinate a meeting with the stakeholders. A contact list has been created and the subcommittee will set up a meeting with the stakeholders. The Board discussed this matter with the Deans and invited the Deans or other university representatives to participate in the subcommittee discussions.

#### **I. READING OF MINUTES**

1. Minutes of the September 5 & 6, 2013 meeting.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Dr. Murgel to approve the minutes of the September 5 & 6, 2013 meeting as distributed. Motion passed unanimously.

#### **II. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA**

1. The following items have been continued at previous meetings and staff is unaware of any activity relating to these matters:
  - a. FY11.11 Erickson, Chad, Standard of Care. Mr. & Mrs. Badertscher submitted a complaint regarding the survey work of Chad R. Erickson. The work included locating a previous corner which was apparently incorrectly and previously located by Carl Edwards and others. The location of this corner affects a Badertscher's property line as well as several others. Mr. Erickson submitted a detailed response to the complaint. Staff notified the Badertschers that the complaint lacks the requirements for a formal complaint

and will be considered a request for inquiry. Pending outcome of litigation.

- c. FY13.06 Ruen, Darius, ROPR. Pending resolution of litigation and a determination of whether there are substantive matters to be further investigated. Pending outcome of litigation.
- d. FY13.10 Bartolome, Todd A., ROPR. Pending decision to move forward from Mr. Ruen.

The Board noted the items on the Consent Agenda with no further action.

### **III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

- 1. Review the Strategic Plan Objectives. The Board noted this item with no further action at this time.
- 2. Subcommittee Updates
  - a. Item Writing (Mr. Howe, Mr. Elle and Mr. Young): The subcommittee needs to come up with an additional 19 items for item bank. Mr. Szatkowski contacted TEST, Inc. to find out what content is needed for test questions and sent to subcommittee members. This item was continued for discussion at the next meeting.
  - b. Structural Engineers Subcommittee (Mr. Bennion and Mr. Elle): The subcommittee will explore what type of projects should be restricted to structural engineers. Mr. Bennion and Mr. Elle will coordinate a meeting with the stakeholders. This item was continued for discussion at the next meeting.
  - c. International Mobility Subcommittee (Mr. Wagner and Mr. Elle): The subcommittee will study (1) NCEES administering and selling exams internationally the result of which may be outsourcing of engineering jobs. (2) Foreign engineering students gain their education in the US and then cannot stay. (3) Foreign engineering students gain their education outside the US but come to the US to practice. (4) Foreign engineering students gain their education outside the US, pass the NCEES exams, but do not reside in the US but request licensure in the US. The subcommittee, staff and Board Counsel will further study the existing statutes and rules and see how they apply to consideration of applicants who have been educated and/or licensed in a foreign country and/or obtained their experience outside the United States. Mr. Curtis created an analysis for the subcommittee and Mr. Wagner, Mr. Elle, Attorney Kane and the staff will review how existing statutes apply. George Wagner and John Elle will discuss legal options for evaluating/restricting PE applicants who have no

US engineering experience, but are requesting licensing in Idaho by comity with Counsel. Can the board disapprove comity requests based on no US experience, or would we need legislation or rule changes to restrict applicants? The subcommittee met and concluded that requiring 2 years of US experience would be an acceptable policy. Education and examinations are already covered by existing law. Staff directed to draft proposals for next meeting on US experience requirement.

- d. Surveying FAQ (Frequently Asked Questions) Page Subcommittee (Mr. Howe and Mr. Elle): The subcommittee reviews changes to the surveying laws and assists staff with updating the Surveying FAQ web page. Mr. Howe and Mr. Elle are working with Mr. Szatkowski to keep the FAQ's current. This item was continued for discussion at the next meeting.
- f. Project Manager (Mr. Bennion): Mr. Haener submitted questions relating to the position of Project Manager. Attorney Kane to work with Mr. Szatkowski, Mr. Bennion and Mr. Haener to go over this information. A change to the definition of engineering in 54-1202 was drafted. ACEC will pursue legislation to include "coordination of engineering design, etc" in lieu of including "project management". Mr. Bennion met with ACEC and with AGC and was informed that they would take to their Board and get back to us.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Dr. Murgel to approve language as drafted by the subcommittee. Motion passed unanimously.

- g. Legislative Idea for Surveying (Mr. Howe and Mr. Elle): Work with ISPLS on changes to the statute regarding the Board's ruling that "any" means "all" with regard to corner records that must be identified. Subcommittee will work with ISPLS to bring law change back to board in September, if needed. This legislative idea has been tabled until next year.

- 3. Discuss the Board composition. Mr. Simila wrote talking points expressing the need for 2 land surveyors on the Board and reasons to increase the size of the Board to 7 members.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Elle to direct staff to discuss with ISPE, ISPLS and ACEC-Idaho. Motion passed unanimously.

- 4. Mr. Simila presented a draft legislative proposal for amending Idaho Code 54-1216 to include "completion of administrative requirements of renewal." This addresses the law that says when you pay your renewal fee, you are renewed.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Dr. Murgel to approve draft language for FY2015 legislative session. Motion passed unanimously.

7. NNU provided the results of the mock ABET visitation for the Board's review.

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Wagner to approve acceptance of the NNU program and allow their students to be assigned to the FE exams. Motion passed unanimously.

#### IV. NEW BUSINESS

1. Reports by Board Members and Staff of activities since the September Board meeting. Mr. Howe attended the ISPLS Northern Chapter meeting in October. Mr. Wagner attended a meeting of the International Mobility Subcommittee in November. Mr. Elle attended a meeting of the International Mobility Subcommittee in November and the September ISPLS Southeast Chapter Meeting. Mr. Szatkowski attended a meeting of the International Mobility Subcommittee in November; attended the NNU mock ABET visit and the ASCE-ISPE joint meeting. Dr. Murgel attended the October EPE meeting in Clemson, SC and attended the October FE Exam Subcommittee meeting in Clemson, SC. Mr. Simila made a presentation to ECE students at the University of Idaho; attended the University of Idaho ABET accreditation visit; attended the APEGBC meeting in Canada; attended an ACEC-Idaho meeting in Ketchum; attended an ISPLS Southwest Chapter meeting; attended the NNU mock ABET visit; attended the ASCE-ISPE joint meeting and attended an ISPLS Chapter meeting.
2. Staff provided an update on the Board's financial status as of October 31, 2013. The Board noted the information.
3. Staff prepared an Expense Reimbursement Summary for the Executive Director for September 2013 through October 2013 for the Board's review.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Elle to approve the expense reimbursement summary as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

4. Staff prepared the Annual Report for the Board's review.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Dr. Murgel to approve the Annual Report as modified by the Board. Motion passed unanimously.

5. Revisions to 54-1234 may be needed.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Dr. Murgel to direct staff to create legislative language to correct error in 54-1234. Motion passed unanimously.

8. Does the board want to pursue a law change to 50-1304(2) to require a north arrow and scale on plats?

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Dr. Murgel to add requirements for north arrow and graphic scale to plats as required in the record of survey statute. Motion passed unanimously.

7. The NCEES MBA Forum will be held February 4 & 5<sup>th</sup> in Scottsdale, AZ. Does the Board want to authorize Mr. Simila to attend?

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Elle to authorize Mr. Simila to attend the NCEES MBA Forum meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Elle to reschedule the February Board meeting to February 10 – 11, 2014. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Dr. Murgel to recess meeting at 5:30 pm on November 14, 2013. Motion passed unanimously.

The meeting reconvened at 8:00 am on November 15, 2013.

#### **IV. NEW BUSINESS**

6. Members of the Board of Architectural Examiners, Garth Jensen, Peter Rockwell, Pete Andersen, Jay Cone, Shelly Lewis and Steve Turney joined the meeting. Also joining the meeting were staff members Tana Corey and Maria Brown of the Idaho Bureau of Occupational Licensing. The Boards discussed legislative issues, overlapping areas of practice, project delivery types and other areas of common interest. In the future, a joint meeting will be scheduled yearly.

The members of the Board of Architectural Examiners and accompanying staff left the meeting.

9. ISPLS may pursue a law change for an expanded definition of land surveying to be similar NCEES model law.

Jack Clark, PLS and Bob Jones, PLS joined the meeting.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Elle to respond to ISPLS and engage with ISPLS and other stakeholders to refine the NCEES model law definition of surveying with the goal of presenting a legislative idea to the Governor's office in 2014. Motion passed unanimously.

Jack Clark, PLS & Bob Jones, PLS left the meeting.

Attorney Mike Kane joined the meeting.

10. An individual expressed concerns about the practices of Coeur d Com.

November 14 & 15, 2013

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Elle to authorize Attorney Kane to send a letter to Coeur D Com directing them to discontinue use of term "engineering" in their offerings, copy to complainant. Motion passed unanimously.

12. Mr. Drake reported a monuments issue in Wallace. The Board noted the information.

15. A licensee recently renewed and reported disciplinary action in another jurisdiction since the last renewal. Staff had concerns about his explanation.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Elle to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Wagner, yes; Dr. Murgel, yes and Mr. Elle, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Dr. Murgel to send a letter to licensee indicating the Idaho Board has reviewed his explanation and did not find it complete and consistent with the documents received from the Oklahoma Board. We take practice outside area of competence seriously. If a project is done in Idaho, we expect it to be confined to a Professional Engineer's area of competence. Motion passed unanimously.

18. Staff drafted a NEWS BULLETIN for the Board's review.

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Elle to accept the content as revised.

FY14.03 Miller, William. Mr. Miller is a current Idaho licensee and previously held a California License. In California he let his license lapse, but did engineering on a wastewater treatment facility for the City of Brawley, CA. That engineering resulted in litigation and a negotiated settlement with the City of Brawley by the firm Mr. Miller worked for in the amount of \$1.3M paid by their insurance carrier. This settlement was found by the CA Board and Mr. Miller had not notified them. He was subsequently disciplined by them as an unlicensed individual. He has not complied with their order. He also has not noted either issue on the past two Idaho renewals. This case is all a matter of record and the Staff recommends it be turned over to the prosecuting attorney to negotiate a settlement with Mr. Miller and, failing that, to proceed to schedule a hearing.
