Minutes of Meeting

The Board of Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors held a regular meeting on June 5 & 6, 2014 at the Board Office, 1510 E. Watertower St., Ste. 110, Meridian, ID 83642 to conduct Board business. The meeting convened at 8:00 a.m. on Thursday, June 5, 2014 with the following Board members present: George Wagner, John Elle, David Bennion, George Murgel and Glenn Bennett. Also present was Keith Simila, Executive Director, Jim Szatkowski, Deputy Director, Jennifer Rowe, Administrative Assistant and Chris Ross, DFM Analyst.

Mike Kane, Board Attorney and Lewis Venard of ISPE joined the meeting.

- i. **AGENDA REVIEW** - Are there any new agenda items? Staff would like to discuss CBT assignments for students that have recently graduated and may no longer be a resident. This item will be added to the agenda as New Business #25. APEGBC's Annual Conference is scheduled for October 23-25, 2014 in Vancouver. This item will be added to the agenda as New Business #26. Does the Board want to send a representative to the PNWER July 20-24, 2014 meeting? This item will be added to the agenda as New Business #27.

I. READING OF MINUTES

1. Meeting Minutes for the February 10-11, 2014 Board Meeting.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Elle to approve the minutes of the February 10-11, 2014 Board meeting as distributed. Motion passed unanimously.

2. Meeting Minutes for the March 3-4, 2014 Board Meeting.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Dr. Murgel to approve the minutes of the March 3-4, 2014 Board meeting as distributed. Motion passed unanimously.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

3. George Yerion, PLS submitted comments on the guidelines for "Selection on the Basis of Qualifications. The Board sent a response to Mr. Yerion after the March meeting. Mr. Yerion sent further comments for the Board's review. The Board noted the information.

2. Subcommittee Updates

- f. Legislative Idea for Surveying (Mr. Howe and Mr. Elle): Work with ISPLS on changes to the statute regarding the Board's ruling that "any" means "all" with regard to corner records that must be identified. The

subcommittee presented a proposal at the ISPLS Board of Governors March meeting. The subcommittee and ISPLS now have partial consensus.

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Elle to direct staff to submit a legislative idea in August and finalize the details at the next meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

6. The Board requested a response from ISPLS as to whether or not there is consensus or a motion to accept the proposed changes to the CP&F form and the amendments to the code. This item was discussed with Unfinished Business #2f.

8. Staff and Board members have worked on drafting changes to 50-1310.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Dr. Murgel to approve the legislative idea pending future discussions. Request that Legislative Services conduct a search for other references to this code and have those corrected as well. Motion passed unanimously.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

5. Mr. Ankersmit submitted a question for the Board's review.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Elle to respond to Mr. Ankersmit indicating that "each case is unique and IBC requires the building officials to decide whether a design professional is required. The Board cannot offer a general opinion on whether or not this is the practice of engineering." Motion passed unanimously.

7. Technical and Project Engineering, LLC would like the Board to consider a request to use their business name in Idaho. They do not offer engineering services.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Bennett to direct Attorney Kane to respond to Technical and Project Engineering, LLC denying the use of Engineering in their company name in Idaho. Motion passed unanimously.

11. A professor at the University of Idaho would like to use the details of a disciplinary case for study by his students in an Engineering Law and Contracts course. It would involve releasing a version of the investigation reports on ethics complaints with personal information redacted. Investigation reports are not currently available to the public, only the final orders.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Dr. Murgel to gather samples and a list of example cases that reflect general issues such as Standard of Care, Procurement of Work or other contract law issues, and Responsibility to the Public. Bring this information back to the Board for approval at a future meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

Rod Linja, PE and Jim Mullen, PE joined the meeting.

21. Rod Linja would like to discuss "solicitation of work" in our rules. The Board will consider a News Bulletin article relating to competing for business. The Board noted the information.

Mr. Linja and Mr. Mullen left the meeting.

16. Wyoming allows PhD's who are teaching at universities to be licensed after 4 years of experience and an interview with the board (for those who don't want to take the PE). Does the board want to consider a similar provision in our rules? The Board directed staff to add this item to the Retreat Agenda to see if a Board consensus can be reached on this proposal.

Chris Ross left the meeting.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Chris Renaldo, PLS joined the meeting via telephone.

4. Previously, Chris Renaldo requested the Board's opinion on whether or not the new rule regarding conflict of interest precluded engineers and surveyors, who occasionally do work for the County, from holding a volunteer position on the County Planning Commission? Attorney Kane provided his response to Mr. Renaldo. The Board discussed this matter with Mr. Renaldo and Attorney Kane will contact the county prosecutor to clarify that there is no conflict of interest.

Mr. Renaldo left the meeting.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

18. The Board discussed the possibility of applying an administrative penalty in lieu of discipline on CPD matters.

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Bennett to develop a law change with \$1000 penalty and put forward a legislative idea. Motion passed unanimously.

20. Mr. Simila prepared draft changes to 10.01.01.019 for international comity.

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Elle to accept policy revisions as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

22. If an individual voluntarily surrenders their license in lieu of completing the CPD requirements and then requests reinstatement, does the Board want to impose additional requirements beyond the CPD audit?

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Elle to consider reinstatement of retired or surrendered licenses in lieu of discipline as a reinstatement action in accordance with 54-1221. Motion passed unanimously.

24. SSI (Survey Sampling International, LLC) would like to use their business name in Idaho. They do not offer or perform land surveying services. This item will be deferred to the August meeting for Attorney's Kane's response.

Lewis Venard left the meeting.

23. Legal Description Error – issue raised by developer.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Dr. Murgel to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Bennett, yes; Mr. Wagner, yes; Dr. Murgel, yes; Mr. Bennion, yes, and Mr. Elle, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Bennett to authorize staff to conduct a preliminary investigation into this matter.

4. A PLS requested an extension to complete his CPD.

6. The Board received a few Voluntary Retirement Petitions (in lieu of CPD compliance). The Board noted the information.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

2. Subcommittee Updates

- g. Board composition (Mr. Wagner and Mr. Elle): The subcommittee will vet the proposed legislation in regards to changes in number of Board members with the stakeholders. The Chair directed Mr. Simila and Mr. Bennion to work with Governor's office prior to submitting a legislative idea and report back. If supported, work with ISPE/ISPLS/ACEC on MOU to address Governor's concern about geographic diversity and board member numbers.

II. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA

- 1. The following items were continued at previous meetings and staff is unaware of any activity relating to these matters:
 - a. FY11.11 Erickson, Chad, Standard of Care. Mr. & Mrs. Badertscher submitted a complaint regarding the survey work of Chad R. Erickson. The work included locating a previous corner which was apparently incorrectly and previously located by Carl Edwards and others. The location of this corner affects a Badertscher's property line as well as several others. Mr. Erickson submitted a detailed response to the complaint. Staff notified the Badertschers that the complaint lacks the requirements for a formal complaint and will be considered a request for inquiry. Pending outcome of litigation.

2. ISPLS nominated Glenn Bennett for the Board. The Governor approved the nomination.
3. A recent applicant that was continued for a meeting with the Board will be unable to attend the meeting.
4. Major Tim Scheffler heard that the Board may be removing the requirement for military engineers to take the PE exam for licensure. This is an FYI for the Board in that other jurisdictions may be doing this.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Dr. Murgel to note the items on the Consent Agenda with no further action. Motion passed unanimously.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Review the Strategic Plan Objectives. This item will be continued for discussion at the next meeting.
2. Subcommittee Updates
 - a. Item Writing (Mr. Howe, Mr. Elle and Mr. Young): The subcommittee needs to come up with an additional 19 items for item bank. Mr. Szatkowski contacted TEST, Inc. to find out what content is needed for test questions and sent to subcommittee members. The subcommittee has about 1/3 of those items completed. The Board noted the information. The Chair appointed Glenn Bennett to this subcommittee.
 - b. Structural Engineers Subcommittee (Mr. Bennion and Mr. Elle): The subcommittee will explore if there is a need, or is it helpful to have some components of structures requiring a structural specific license. All stakeholders names have been acquired. The subcommittee held a meeting on April 22, 2014. Subcommittee to reconvene in fall to continue discussion.
 - c. International Mobility Subcommittee (Mr. Wagner and Mr. Elle): The subcommittee will study (1) NCEES administering and selling exams internationally the result of which may be outsourcing of engineering jobs. (2) Foreign engineering students gain their education in the US and then cannot stay. (3) Foreign engineering students gain their education outside the US but come to the US to practice. (4) Foreign engineering students gain their education outside the US, pass the NCEES exams, but do not reside in the US but request licensure in the US. The subcommittee, staff and Board Counsel will further study the existing statutes and rules and see how they apply to consideration of applicants who have been educated and/or licensed in a foreign country and/or obtained their experience outside the United States. The subcommittee concluded that requiring 2

years of US experience would be an acceptable policy. Staff directed to draft proposals on US experience requirement. Chair dissolved subcommittee as the rule is in the process of completion.

- d. Surveying FAQ (Frequently Asked Questions) Page Subcommittee (Mr. Howe and Mr. Elle): The subcommittee reviews changes to the surveying laws and assists staff with updating the Surveying FAQ web page. Mr. Howe and Mr. Elle are working with Mr. Szatkowski to keep the FAQ's current. Chair to appoint Mr. Bennett to the subcommittee.
 - e. MOE (Master's or Equivalent) for Engineers Subcommittee (Mr. Wagner and Dr. Murgel): The subcommittee will form a task force of interested and affected professional and technical societies to review potential legislation focused on MOE for engineers. Mr. Wagner and Dr. Murgel to pursue the issue and see if a coalition of stakeholders (all disciplines and societies) can be developed. The subcommittee held a meeting at the Board office on February 19, 2014. The subcommittee discussed the history of the model law, rationale and professional organizations. A committee is now formed to move forward with this effort. There was no new information to report.
5. Dr. Milligan reviewed the BYU-Idaho Civil Engineering program as requested by the Board. The Board noted the information.
 7. The rule change to 10.01.01.13.01 was rejected by the Legislature. The Board will discuss the next step relating to this rejection. The Board noted this item with no further action.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

1. Reports by Board Members and Staff of activities since the March Board meeting. Mr. Bennion, Mr. Elle, Dr. Murgel, Mr. Szatkowski and Mr. Simila attended the NCEES Western Zone meeting in Lincoln, Nebraska. Mr. Bennion also attended a meeting of the structural subcommittee, and the ISPE Annual Conference in Boise. Mr. Elle attended a meeting of the structural subcommittee; participated in several phone calls on the CP&F laws and rules revisions; worked on item writing; attended the ISPLS Annual Conference and two ISPLS section meetings. Dr. Murgel attended the ISPE Annual Conference where he received an award for Outstanding Educator. Mr. Wagner attended the ISPE Annual Conference. Mr. Szatkowski attended the ISPE Annual Conference; attended a meeting of the structural subcommittee and attended a NSPE Western Pacific Region meeting. Mr. Simila attended the ISPE Annual Conference; made a presentation to students and met with faculty at the University of Idaho; attended the APEGA Conference in Edmonton, Canada; attended the ISPLS Annual Conference; made a presentation to students at Boise State University; visited Capital High School and Nampa high schools; attended ISPLS Southwest Section meetings; attended

ACEC-Idaho meetings; attended ISPE section meetings and attended the PNWER Idaho meeting.

2. Staff provided an update on the Board's financial status as of April 30, 2014. The Board noted the information.
3. Staff prepared an Expense Reimbursement Summary for the Executive Director for February through May 15, 2014 for the Board's review.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Dr. Murgel to approve the expense reimbursement summary for the Executive Director. Motion passed unanimously

9. Mr. Simila prepared a report on the salaries of Agency Heads for the Board's review. The Board will discuss this matter at the Board Retreat in August.
10. NNU has an accreditation visit scheduled. Would the Board like to send an observer?

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Bennion to authorize Dr. Murgel to attend NNU accreditation visitation. Motion passed unanimously.

12. A professional engineer requested an extension of the reinstatement process for the completion of CPD. He asked for and received a new renewal form and was told to send the reinstatement fee of \$300 and his CPD Log. He failed to send the log. On the follow-up letter, he phoned and asked for addition time to submit the log which was granted. He then submitted an email for the Board to consider.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Dr. Murgel to approve license holder's request for an extension of time to complete CPD requirements. Refund the renewal fee and cancel renewal request. License holder will renew with late fees and CPD compliance when able. Motion passed unanimously.

13. Dr. Murgel discussed the progress of facilitating Engineer/Surveyor Intern applications to be submitted electronically, and upload application information straight into our database. RFP was sent and work has been scheduled. The Board noted the information.
14. A currently licensed Idaho PE is interested in obtaining a surveying license. He requests a waiver of a portion of the coursework requirements.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Dr. Murgel to respond that the waiver of coursework is approved contingent upon submittal of application, completion of the other required courses in surveying and some explanation on business law courses/experience. Motion passed unanimously.

The Board recessed the meeting at 5:00 p.m. on June 5, 2014. The meeting reconvened at 8:00 a.m. on June 6, 2014.
