Minutes of Meeting

The Board of Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors held a regular meeting on August 7 & 8, 2014 at the Salmon Rapids Lodge, 1010 S. Main St., Riggins, Idaho 83549 to conduct Board business. The meeting convened at 8:00 a.m. on Thursday, August 7, 2014 with the following Board members present: George Wagner, David Bennion, George Murgel and Glenn Bennett. Also present was Keith Simila, Executive Director, and Jim Szatkowski, Deputy Director.

- i. **AGENDA REVIEW** - Are there any new agenda items? Mr. Wagner suggested a discussion on meeting locations and travel costs. This item was added as New Business #23. Disciplinary docket FY13.10 was added to the agenda for discussion.

I. READING OF MINUTES

1. Meeting Minutes for the June 5 & 6, 2014 Board Meeting.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Dr. Murgel to approve the minutes of the June 5 & 6, 2014 meeting as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

II. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA

1. The following items have been continued at previous meetings and staff is unaware of any activity relating to these matters:
 - a. FY11.11 Erickson, Chad, Standard of Care. Mr. & Mrs. Badertscher submitted a complaint regarding the survey work of Chad R. Erickson. The work included locating a previous corner which was apparently incorrectly and previously located by Carl Edwards and others. The location of this corner affects a Badertscher's property line as well as several others. Mr. Erickson submitted a detailed response to the complaint. Staff notified the Badertschers that the complaint lacks the requirements for a formal complaint and will be considered a request for inquiry. Pending outcome of litigation.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Dr. Murgel to note the Consent Agenda with no further action. Motion passed unanimously.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Review the Strategic Plan Objectives. The Board discussed changes to the Strategic Plan including Goal 1, Educate Stakeholders. Mr. Simila will prepare a

communications plan on key messages from the Board. The Board noted the information.

2. Subcommittee Updates

- a. Item Writing (Mr. Howe, Mr. Elle, Mr. Bennett and Mr. Young): The subcommittee needs to come up with an additional 19 items for item bank. Mr. Szatkowski contacted TEST, Inc. to find out what content is needed for test questions and sent to subcommittee members. The subcommittee has about 1/3 of those items completed. Work completed to satisfy Test, Inc. The Board noted the information.
- b. Structural Engineers Subcommittee (Mr. Bennion and Mr. Elle): The subcommittee will explore if there is a need, or is it helpful to have some components of structures requiring a structural specific license. All stakeholders names have been acquired. Mr. Bennion and Mr. Elle will coordinate a meeting with those stakeholders. Subcommittee to reconvene in fall or after the 1st of the year to continue discussion.
- c. Surveying FAQ (Frequently Asked Questions) Page Subcommittee (Mr. Howe, Mr. Bennett and Mr. Elle): The subcommittee reviews changes to the surveying laws and assists staff with updating the Surveying FAQ web page. Mr. Howe and Mr. Elle are working with Mr. Szatkowski to keep the FAQ current.
- d. MOE (Master's or Equivalent) for Engineers Subcommittee (Mr. Wagner and Dr. Murgel): The subcommittee will form a task force of interested and affected professional and technical societies to review potential legislation focused on MOE for engineers. Mr. Wagner and Dr. Murgel to pursue the issue and see if a coalition of stakeholders (all disciplines and societies) can be developed. The subcommittee discussed the history of the model law, rationale and professional organizations. A committee is now formed to move forward with this effort.
- e. Legislative Idea for Surveying (Mr. Howe and Mr. Elle): Work with ISPLS on changes to the statute regarding the Board's ruling that "any" means "all" with regard to corner records that must be identified. Subcommittee working with ISPLS to bring law change back to board in September, if needed. The Board directed staff to submit a Legislative Idea in August.
- f. Board composition (Mr. Wagner and Mr. Elle): The subcommittee will vet the proposed legislation in regards to changes in number of Board members with the stakeholders. The Chair directed Mr. Simila and Mr. Bennion to work with Governor's office prior to submitting a legislative idea and report back. If supported, work with ISPE/ISPLS/ACEC with

MOU to address Governor's concern about geographic diversity and board member numbers. Mr. Bennion and Mr. Simila met with Lt. Governor Little and Mr. Simila met with Tammy Perkins to discuss this matter. The recommendation was to defer this legislation.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Bennett to table this matter until ACEC-Idaho is engaged. Motion passed unanimously.

3. Wyoming allows PhD's who are teaching at universities to be licensed after 4 years of experience and an interview with the board (for those who don't want to take the PE). Does the board want to consider a similar provision in our laws/rules?

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Dr. Murgel to prepare draft laws and rules language change to allow the board to investigate the feasibility of issuing a license to PhD in engineering with appropriate experience without passage of the FE or PE exam. The Board will review draft language at the September Board meeting. If appropriate, language will be circulated with the Deans and other stakeholders and the Board will explore having another entity carry the legislation forward. Motion passed unanimously.

4. The Board discussed legislative ideas including the creation of an administrative penalty of \$1,000 in lieu of discipline on CPD matters. ACEC provided comments on the legislative ideas proposed.

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Bennett to add age demographics (easier entry into the profession and age of existing licensed land surveyors) as a talking point in the communication plan. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Bennett, seconded by Dr. Murgel to allow staff to negotiate the fine in lieu of discipline amount with ACEC-Idaho. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Bennion to add the words "copy process" instead of "process" to 55-1905. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Bennett, seconded by Dr. Murgel to convene a meeting with ACEC-Idaho, ISPLS, ISPE and others interested to resolve final language for survey definition change. The Board will review at the September meeting.

5. SSI (Survey Sampling International, LLC) requested permission to use their business name in Idaho. They do not offer or perform land surveying services. Attorney Kane was directed to review this matter and submitted a response for the Board's review.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Bennett to accept Attorney Kane's recommendation and approve use of the business name. Motion passed unanimously.

7. Staff updated the Board on the progress of facilitating Engineer/Surveyor Intern applications to be submitted electronically. The Board noted the information.

8. A professor at the U of I requested the use of details of a disciplinary case for study by his students in an Engineering Law and Contracts course. The Board directed staff to create a list of example cases that reflect general issues such as Standard of Care, Procurement of Work or other contract law issues, and Responsibility to the Public.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Dr. Murgel to approve the release of redacted investigation reports more than a year old for use as case examples of ethics violations in university ethics courses. Motion passed unanimously.

9. The Board received a question regarding whether there are circumstances that would allow a professional engineer to rescind a seal without concern of reprimand? Attorney Kane provided his opinion for the Board's review.

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Bennett to discuss with Attorney Kane the process licensees should use for plan revisions when designs are changed by subsequent licensees in lieu of rescinding the seal. Motion passed unanimously.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

1. Reports by Board Members and Staff of activities since the June Board meeting. Dr. Murgel participated in a NCEES FE exam committee meeting and met with Senator MacKenzie's son to measure the size of his mosaic project. Mr. Bennett met with Senator Todd Lakey on survey definition change; met with Lt. Governor Little on survey definition law change and attended an ISPLS meeting. Mr. Simila attended the PNWER meeting; conducted workshops for ISPLS sections in Northern Idaho, Magic Valley, Eastern and the Board of Governors; met with Lt. Governor Little about survey definition law change and a law change for board expansion along with Mr. Bennion and Mr. Wagner. Mr. Bennion attended the PNWER meeting.
2. Staff provided an update on the Board's financial status as of July 31, 2014. The Board noted the information.
3. Staff prepared an Expense Reimbursement Summary for the Executive Director for May 16, 2014 through July 31, 2014 for the Board's review.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Bennett to approve expense reimbursement for Executive Director. Motion passed unanimously.

4. Meeting rotation – does the board want to consider other locations for meetings and the retreat (university locations concurrent with faculty interaction, other communities besides Riggins for the retreat)?

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Dr. Murgel to continue the Riggins venue in August and focus agenda mostly on strategic issues. Motion passed unanimously.

16. Staff to discuss exam trends.
 - a. CBT – Status of 1st 6 months, fewer FE test takers, taking it in other states
 - b. PE trends, fewer CE's, low PE/FE ratio – 32%
 - c. Discussion on converting to auto assign and remove failure requirements
 - d. Decouple PE Exam from experience?

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Bennett to direct staff to explore the changes in law/rules required to go to auto assign and bring back for the Board's review at a future meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Dr. Murgel to delay decision to decouple experience from PE exam. Motion passed unanimously.

6. BYU-Idaho is scheduled for an accreditation visit October 5-7, 2014. Does the Board want to send an observer?

Moved by Mr. Bennett, seconded by Dr. Murgel to send Mr. Elle to BYU Idaho for visitation. Motion passed unanimously.

7. The Board was made aware of disciplinary taken against an Idaho license holder in Oregon.

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Bennett to send information to Kirt Naylor to negotiate a Stipulation and Consent agreement. Motion passed unanimously.

9. The Idaho Society of Healthcare Engineers requested permission to use their business name in Idaho.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Dr. Murgel to direct staff to further investigate the composition of their organization and discuss findings at the September meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

10. Review NCEES MLE criteria and comity criteria as it pertains to comity with a jurisdiction who licensed a PE on the old STR-I only. The Board noted the information.

11. Mr. Simila completed the Annual Performance Report for the Governor's Office.

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Bennett to approve the report as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

15. The NCEES Western Zone meeting will be held in Idaho in 2018. What location would be best?

Moved by Mr. Bennett, seconded by Dr. Murgel to select Boise as the meeting location. Motion passed unanimously.

17. News Bulletin – new approaches

- a. Tie news bulletin delivery preference to renewal notices
- b. Users request format they want to receive (email link, postcard, twitter, print)
- c. Continue hard copy printing (\$6000 for 2000 copies) to COA's & Universities?
- d. Board Chair article

The Board reviewed the new approaches and discussed tying the news bulletin delivery preference with online renewals.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Dr. Murgel to recess the meeting at 5:20pm. Motion passed unanimously.

The meeting reconvened at 8:00 a.m. on August 8, 2014. Mr. Elle joined the meeting.

Perhaps a subcommittee to work with ISPLS on working with ISU to expand its offerings to NIC, Lewiston & Meridian while working to boost enrollment?
- c. Should we do some market research to find out why students & young professionals (recent graduates) chose land surveying for a career and what they know about licensure requirements?
- d. Canadian example of web page info on entry into the land surveying profession
- e. Should we work to improve information (web site, brochure, video clip) to potential candidates in high schools, veterans, and others?

Moved by Mr. Bennett, seconded by Dr. Murgel to work with ISPLS to form a task force and address education, marketing and promotion of the land survey profession. Motion passed unanimously.

5. The Board discussed general trends on the recent FS exams and in PS licensure. This discussion included a review of the ISU Geomatics program and LCSC surveying program. This item was discussed with New Business Item #18.

12. Mr. Simila discussed the budget for FY2016. Topics included modernizing information services and the Executive Director salary.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Dr. Murgel to approve the proposed budget with the DFM approved baseline plus an additional \$10,000 for a salary increase for the Executive Director. Personnel and operating increase for additional Board members will not be included in Fy2016. Motion passed unanimously.

13. Two questions relating to easements were received for the Board's input. Does the Board want a news bulletin article on these subjects?

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Bennett to prepare a news bulletin article on this topic. Motion passed unanimously.

14. A question was received on ROS requirements. Does the Board want a news bulletin article on this subject?

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Elle to write a news bulletin article clarifying the ROS requirement. Motion passed unanimously.

19. The DNR Survey Advisory Board in Washington proposed a rule relating to survey law.

Moved by Mr. Bennett, seconded by Mr. Bennion to refer to ISPLS as a possible law/rule change to implement a similar requirement in Idaho. Motion passed unanimously.

20. A question from a potential applicant relating to counting work experience completed during MS and PhD program was reviewed.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Dr. Murgel to affirm with applicant that the Board will only credit him 2 years of experience for his PhD. Motion passed unanimously.

21. The Army Engineer Association would like to start a chapter in Idaho and requested the use of the term "engineer" in their name.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Bennett to allow the chapter to use "engineer" in their business name. Motion passed unanimously.

22. Mr. Simila discussed topics relative to ITD.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Dr. Murgel to authorize Mr. Simila to discuss, in a limited manner, the federal process for highway related issues. Motion passed unanimously.

23. Travel, meetings, costs, attendees. This topic will be discussed at the September meeting.

24. Edwards corner information phone call on section corner near Mt. Idaho.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Dr. Murgel to notify the surveyors in question of their obligation to communicate discrepancy based on the new evidence presented to the Board staff about the opposite section corner. Motion passed unanimously.

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
