Minutes of Meeting

The Board of Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors held a regular meeting on April 9 & 10, 2015 at the Board Office, 1510 E. Watertower St., Ste. 110, Meridian, ID 83642 to conduct Board business. The meeting convened at 8:00 a.m. on Thursday, April 9, 2015 with the following Board members present: George Wagner, John Elle, George Murgel, David Bennion and Glenn Bennett. Also present was Keith Simila, Executive Director, Jim Szatkowski, Deputy Director, and Jennifer Rowe, Administrative Assistant.

- i. **AGENDA REVIEW** - Are there any new agenda items? Mr. Wagner requested that a discussion on the procedure for disciplinary matters be added to the agenda as New Business #24. Completion of a Performance Evaluation for Mr. Simila was added to the agenda as New Business #25.

I. READING OF MINUTES

1. Meeting Minutes for the February 2 – 3, 2015 meeting.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Dr. Murgel to approve to approve the minutes from the February 2 & 3, 2015 meeting as distributed. Motion passed unanimously.

II. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA

1. The following licenses were voluntarily surrendered in lieu of meeting the CPD requirements: P-9595 Anne Marie Hardin.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Elle to note the consent agenda with no further action. Motion passed unanimously.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Review the Strategic Plan Objectives. The Board noted that there were no changes to the current strategic plan.
2. Subcommittee Updates
 - a. Item Writing (Mr. Elle and Mr. Bennett): The subcommittee is up to date on questions for the exam. The Board noted the information.
 - b. Surveying FAQ (Frequently Asked Questions) Page Subcommittee (Mr. Bennett and Mr. Elle): The subcommittee reviews changes to the surveying laws and assists staff with updating the Surveying FAQ web

page. Mr. Bennett and Mr. Elle are working with Mr. Szatkowski to keep the FAQ current. The Board noted the information.

- c. Legislative Idea for Surveying (Mr. Bennett and Mr. Elle): Work with ISPLS on changes to the statute regarding the Board's ruling that "any" means "all" with regard to corner records that must be identified. Law and rule changes are in progress and approved by the governor's office.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Bennett to dissolve this committee. Motion passed unanimously.

- d. Board composition (Mr. Wagner and Mr. Elle): The subcommittee will vet the proposed legislation with stakeholders in regard to increasing the number of Board members. Legislation was approved by the Governor's office.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Dr. Murgel to dissolve this committee. Motion passed unanimously.

- e. Boundary Experience Requirements (Mr. Bennett and Mr. Elle): The subcommittee will work on what the minimum boundary surveying experience requirements should be for applicants for licensure.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Bennett to approve issuance of a temporary rule to require 2 years minimum boundary experience and rework application to outline the required experience. Motion passed unanimously.

3. Staff provided the Board with a draft Survey Education Task Force MOA for their review at the last meeting. A final draft is available for signature.

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Elle to approve the final version of the MOA and authorize the Chair to sign. Board Chair to recommend Mr. Elle as Chair of Task Force. Motion passed unanimously.

4. A question was raised regarding seal size on Records of Survey. Mr. Simila contacted Ada County regarding an electronic filing proposal.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Dr. Murgel to direct Mr. Simila and Attorney Kane to work with the respective counties and IAC on addressing the submittal requirements by counties. Motion passed unanimously.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Hinckley, PLS joined the meeting.

10. Mr. Hinckley met with the Board to discuss reinstatement of his license. Mr. Hinckley left the meeting.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Bennett to reinstate Mr. Hinckley's license after completion of the 60 PDH's and payment of the appropriate fees but not require an additional 30 PDH's as part of his renewal in April of 2016 (Board to waive the additional 30 PDH's required in April of 2016). Motion passed unanimously.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

1. Reports by Board Members and Staff of activities since the February meeting. Mr. Simila made presentations to Boise State University students, Idaho State University students, University of Idaho students, ACEC-Idaho, ISPE, ISPLS Southwest chapter and at the ISPLS annual conference. Mr. Simila also visited the College of Southern Idaho and the Canadian consulate gathering in Boise. Mr. Bennett attended the ISPLS annual conference and testified at legislative hearings. Mr. Elle attended the ISPLS section meeting and annual conference; testified at legislative hearings; researched GLO town sites and talked with ISPE regarding Board member qualifications. Mr. Wagner testified at the JFAC hearing. Mr. Szatkowski participated in the NSPE selection committee.

Moved by Mr. Bennett, seconded by Dr. Murgel to deny the petition and explain to the individual the PE licensure process where exams are designated. Motion passed unanimously.

6. This item was removed from the agenda prior to the meeting.
7. NCEES released information on changes to the records system. The Board discussed feedback to be given to NCEES.
8. Does the Board want to authorize a member to attend the PNWER Annual Summit?

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Dr. Murgel to authorize Mr. Elle and Mr. Simila to attend the PNWER Annual Summit. Motion passed unanimously.

9. NCEES will be transitioning the PS exam to CBT. The Board noted the information and staff will review laws, rules, policies and forms in order to be prepared for the transition.
11. A recent Supreme Court decision may impact state licensing boards. The Board noted the information.
12. Legislation was approved that will increase the size of the Board to 7 members as of July 1st. The Board noted the information.
13. The NCEES engineering education standard was revised. The Board noted the information.
14. Mr. Staab requested reinstatement of his license from Retired status.

Moved by Mr. Bennett, seconded by Dr. Murgel to waive 4 credits of PDH's due to his hardship case per IDAPA 10.01.04.009.03 and to reinstate his license upon payment of all fees due. Motion passed unanimously.

16. Will the recent legislative changes affect the Idaho State Specific exam questions? Chairman directed staff to provide a copy of the item bank to the Item Writing subcommittee for their review.
18. The meeting date for the June meeting will need to be moved forward to June 10, 2015 in order to facilitate meeting space at the Coeur d'Alene Inn (the same location as ISPE). The ISPE Board will be meeting at 12 – 2pm on June 10th. They have a membership meeting scheduled for June 11th from 7 – 8 a.m. and they would like someone from our Board to present topics of interest on June 11th from 1:30 to 2:30p.m. The Board will reschedule the meeting to begin on June 10, 2015 at 8:00 a.m.
19. Election of Board Officers

20. A draft NEWS BULLETIN was presented for the Board's review.
22. Reschedule Riggins Retreat dates from August 6-8, 2015 to August 3-4, 2015. The meeting would begin at 8am on the 3rd so Board members and staff will need to get to Riggins on the 2nd. The Board agreed to reschedule the Riggins Retreat to August 3-4, 2015.
23. Applied Engineering Management (AEM) requested permission to operate in Idaho under the assumed business name of AEM ID Corporation. They do not offer engineering services to the public.

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Bennett to approve the use of the DBA as requested contingent on the company not offering engineering services in Idaho. Motion passed unanimously.

24. Mr. Wagner requested that a discussion on the procedure for disciplinary matters be added to the agenda. The Board discussed having staff and counsel present at a later meeting to review the complaint/hearing/prosecution process and roles to see if adjustment to our process should be proposed.

FY03.19/05.18 Leavitt, Darren, surveying practices. A Stipulation and Consent Order was signed. Mr. Leavitt was fined \$500.00 and agreed to have next 5 plats reviewed at his expense. An additional hearing found that Mr. Leavitt had violated the terms of Stipulation and Consent Order. It was then Ordered to have his next 5 Records of Survey and next 5 plats reviewed at his expense and he was fined an additional \$1000.00. This Order was signed in 2007. Mr. Leavitt has since sold his surveying business and requested in September 2012 that the Board waive the requirement to have his next 5 surveys and plats reviewed. The Board notified Mr. Leavitt that the Stipulation and Consent Order remains in place, except for the requirement that his ROS's and plats be reviewed by a Board approved PLS. He has a current and valid license as a professional land surveyor. At this time, Mr. Leavitt is requesting assistance from the Board to resolve the Order.

They have now filed an application for Joseph Derhake as the individual in responsible charge and for the Certificate of Authorization. However, the application for Mr. Derhake is incomplete and he has been unresponsive to requests for the final information for his application.

The work included locating a previous corner which was apparently incorrectly located by Carl Edwards and others previously. The location of this corner affects the Badertscher's property line as well as several others. Mr. Erickson submitted a detailed response to the complaint. Staff notified the Badertschers that the complaint lacks the requirements for a

formal complaint and will be considered a request for inquiry. Attorney Naylor will bring the Board up to date on this matter. This matter has been extended until June 15, 2015.

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Bennion to accept 54-1202 as proposed. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Dr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Bennion to approve the Rules of Procedure as a temporary rule. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Dr. Murgel to accept the concept of oral examinations for applicants with a PhD that meet the requirements described. Motion passed with Mr. Wagner and Mr. Elle voting against the motion.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Dr. Murgel to accept remainder of 54-1214 as amended. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Bennett to accept 54-1222 as modified. Motion passed unanimously.


