IV. NEW BUSINESS

26. Staff requested information from Berston George as directed by the Board at the November meeting. Mr. George did not comply with the request for information. Mr. George telephoned the Board office on February 24th to request that the Board allow him an extension on the deadline to submit further documentation. He also requested that the Board provide him with a better idea of what the expected contents are of the narrative.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. The subcommittee formed to develop suggestions on proto-type buildings investigated the procedures used by other states. Mr. Curtis gathered information from the MBA forum and the Board reviewed the varying state policies.

Moved by Mr. Ancell, seconded by Mr. Milligan to direct staff to draft possible language for statute changes and include an article about the issue in the NEWS BULLETIN for comments to be received by May 19th from license holders. Motion passed unanimously.

4. Attorney Richards spoke with Mr. Farnsworth of Walker Homes regarding the use of the word “Engineered” or “Engineering” in an assumed business name for the company. Mr. Farnsworth agreed to file an assumed business name without the word “Engineered” or “Engineering” in it.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Milligan to close this matter with no further action. Motion passed unanimously.

5. Joseph Haynes provided the Board with an update on the speed studies. Dale Baune forwarded information about the Speed Limit Class for the Board to review. Jerry Flatz joined the meeting to discuss the speed course curriculum and the intent of the raw data collected by the technicians. The Board expressed concern that the course flyers are misleading about what is being taught in the course and should be modified to clear up any confusion.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Ancell to send a letter from the Chair to Mr. Flatz with a copy to Mr. Baune thanking him for his time and indicating that the Board looks forward to receiving a revised edition of the flyer. Motion passed unanimously.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

6. Markell Bateman requested a response from the Board regarding questions on stamping drawings.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Milligan to send a letter from the Chair to Mr. Bateman stating that a license holder can only stamp work for which they have been in responsible charge. If a sheet contains work of others but also contains work for which the engineer is responsible, the work for which the engineer is responsible as well as the scope of services must be clearly identified on the document. Motion passed unanimously.

8. Stephanie Walsh requested an opinion from the Board about when a person is considered an “employee or subordinate” under Idaho Code Section 54-1223(2). An additional inquiry of the same nature was received from Nichol Pettis. The Board discussed the necessity of clarifying the definition of subordinate and employee in the code.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Howe to send a letter from the chair to Ms. Walsh explaining that independent contractors must be licensed. To be considered an employee, both individuals must be in the same organization. As a subcontractor, the individual would be offering engineering services and therefore need a license. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Milligan to send a letter from the Chair to Nichol Pettis stating that a professional engineer does not necessarily have to be your direct supervisor for qualifying experience. An example of this could be an individual practicing under the industrial exemption. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Howe to direct counsel to research what is considered a subordinate in the law and draft possible legislation to better define this term. Motion passed unanimously.

12. Rob Hinckley asked the Board to express an opinion regarding easements and the need to file records of survey for them. The Board discussed whether or not the formation of an easement qualified as land surveying.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. McClure to send a letter from the Chair to Mr. Hinckley quoting the definitions of land surveying and easement from the code and answer his questions as follows: Question A. Is this practicing Land Surveying? Answer A: Anyone can write a legal description of any property, including an easement, without being licensed. Easements do not convey property, they only grant privileges. Question B. Is a record map required? Answer B. No, but if you wish to provide one you may. Motion passed unanimously.

14. Louis Simonet requested the Board’s opinion regarding the production and stamping of residential drawings.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. McClure to authorize the Chair to answer Mr. Simonet’s questions as follows:

1. Is it correct that anyone can draw up residential plans? Answer: Quote the exemptions from Architectural Registration law.
2. If I draw up the plans do I have to stamp them even though I have not performed any engineering on the ‘A’ drawings? Answer: If the sheets do not contain items which are the practice of engineering, beyond the prescriptive sections of the building code, there is no need to stamp them.

3. My company is registered to do business as an engineering firm. Can it produce plans with the engineering name on it and put out 'A' drawings without a stamp? Answer: There is nothing in statute which would preclude the inclusion of your company name on documents which are not engineering in nature.

4. If I have to stamp it can I put a "Bubbled items only" statement under the stamp? Answer: Yes, if the work you did is clearly identified as separate from the work done by others.

5. If my drafter draws up the drawings, do I need to stamp it? Answer: Only if the work involves the practice of engineering beyond the prescriptive sections of the building code.

6. If my drafter draws up the drawings, does my company name (with engineering) need to have a stamp put on it? Answer: Only if the work involves the practice of engineering beyond the prescriptive sections of the building code.

Motion passed unanimously.

19. Jerry Peterson forwarded information to the Board published by the Montana Board on the "Professional Use of Seals". DEQ received the same information and requested an opinion from the Board on the sealing of record drawings.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize the Chair to send a letter to DEQ stating that the Board has reviewed IC 39-118(3) and concluded that the services required to prepare complete and accurate record drawings or the statement in lieu of complete and accurate record drawings involves the practice of engineering and must be sealed, signed and dated by the professional engineer in responsible charge of their preparation. Motion passed unanimously.

24. Dean Coon requested the Board's opinion on subdivision monumentation.

Moved by Mr. Ancell, seconded by Mr. Milligan to send a letter from the Chair to Dean Coon stating that "remove and replace" is not the same as "removing". It is more important to comply with platting law requirements than to leave a non-complying monument on an exterior boundary. It is not a violation of Idaho Code 54-1234 to remove an existing non-complying monument and replace it with a monument meeting current code requirements for the exterior boundary of a plat. Motion passed unanimously.

7. The Board met with the ISPLS Board of Directors to discuss topics of common interest. ISPLS submitted proposed legislation for the Board's review. The Board discussed the proposed legislation with ISPLS and possible sponsorship. The Board suggested that ISPLS gather documentation of actual cases that will justify the right of entry law changes. The Board and ISPLS discussed the possibility of amending the current sections of the law instead of creating new sections.

Nathan Bentley, the State of Idaho GIS coordinator discussed the possibility of the creation of a state land surveyor position and the Board agreed to support the concept of the development of such a position.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize the formation of a committee including Mr. Young, Mr. Howe, and Mr. Curtis directed to work with ISPLS on drafting a position on possible right of entry legislation prior to the June meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

2. The Board met with Angela Richards to discuss her qualifications and the proposal submitted by Mr. Richards.

Moved by Mr. Ancell, seconded by Mr. McClure to accept the proposal submitted by Mr. Richards regarding fees and work arrangements. Motion passed unanimously.

16. NCEES requested that the Board review the Associate and Emeritus Members list provided and submit any modifications to them.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Milligan to remove Clyde Porter from the Emeritus member listing. Motion passed unanimously.

VI. CONSIDERATION OF DISCIPLINARY MATTERS

FY05.07 Balance Engineering, LLC, unlicensed practice. Balance Engineering had a Certificate of Authorization that expired July 31, 2003. Mr. Curtis investigated the matter further at the Board's request. Attorney Richards contacted Mr. Farthing and requested that Balance Engineering cease practicing engineering in Idaho. Attorney Richards also requested information from Mr. Grimes on the two instances when Mr. Farthing allegedly used his seal and signature.

Moved by Mr. Ancell, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize Attorneys Richards to file an injunction against Chris Farthing and the business of Balance Engineering for unlicensed practice. Motion passed unanimously.

FY05.18 Leavitt, Darren R., surveying practices. Mr. Leavitt previously signed a Stipulation and Consent Order in this matter. Staff has concerns that the order has been violated.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize staff to schedule a hearing in regards to the alleged violations of the Stipulation and Consent Agreement. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize Gary Young as hearing officer in this matter. Motion passed unanimously.

FY05.22 Cook, Kenneth H., P.L.S., timely filing. Mr. Curtis completed a preliminary investigation into this matter as directed by the Board.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize staff to negotiate a consent agreement. If a consent agreement cannot be negotiated, staff is authorized to schedule a hearing. Motion passed unanimously.

FY05.23 Soderling, Alan R., P.E., violations of the rules of professional responsibility. A response was received from Mr. Soderling. Mr. Richards circulated additional information via email. John Elle agreed to perform the preliminary investigation in this matter but has not yet completed that task. Additional comments have been received from complainant.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Ancell to authorize the approval of the Order Extending Time for Hearing as presented by counsel. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. McClure to continue this docket. Motion passed unanimously.

FY04.10 Hassell, Joseph E., P.E./P.L.S., multiple allegations. Mr. Curtis completed a preliminary investigation into this matter and hired an electrical engineer to review the electrical plans as requested by the Board at the November meeting. Jack Taylor, P.E. reviewed the electrical engineering plans for the New Frontiers project and the Medical Office Building and provided his evaluation. Staff submitted a STIPULATION AND CONSENT ORDER to Mr. Hassell for his consideration but Mr. Hassell indicated through counsel that it was not acceptable. In the meantime, an additional incident was brought to the attention of the Board which was similar in nature to those investigated. Staff was directed to investigate the additional incident prior to scheduling an Administrative Hearing on the original complaints.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize counsel to draft an ORDER EXTENDING TIME FOR HEARING in this matter. Motion passed unanimously.

FY06.03 American General Contractor, Inc., unlicensed practice. Attorney Richards sent a letter to the company demanding a response to the Board's inquiry. American General responded on February 16, 2006.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize counsel to write a letter to American General Contractor stating that the name change referenced in his letter should be made effective immediately and that any old business cards will need to be destroyed. American General Contractors is directed to notify the Board when these actions have been completed. Motion passed unanimously.

FY06.04 Mickelson, Richard, P.L.S. Surveying Practices. Mr. Curtis completed a preliminary investigation into this matter.

Moved by Mr. Ancell, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize the Chair to send a letter of caution to Mr. Mickelson. Mr. Howe will work on the details of the letter and will include reference to FY04.09. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Howe to reconsider previous motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Ancell to request that Mr. Mickelson submit copies of his last 5 surveys to the Board for their review as well as documentation substantiating his compliance with the continuing education requirement. Motion passed unanimously.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

2. Gary Young is in the process of forming a task force with the Board of Architectural Examiners to clarify the definitions of engineering and architecture. Mr. Young discussed working with members of the Board of Architectural Examiners to form a document similar to the Montana flyer entitled "Professional Use of Seals."

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. McClure to direct Mr. Young to continue his efforts to organize a task force in conjunction with the Board of Architectural Examiners to formulate a flyer similar to Montana. Motion passed unanimously.

3. Staff summarized statistics regarding the number of applicants for comity who have an NCEES Record. NCEES staff met with the Board in November of 2005 and asked the Board to consider requiring applicants for comity to have an NCEES Record.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. McClure to send a letter from the Chair to NCEES stating that the Board does not feel it is necessary to require a record from our applicants at this time. Motion passed unanimously.

V. CONSIDERATION OF APPLICATIONS

INTERVIEWS

Ron Harwell met with the Board to discuss his request to sit for the Principles and Practice of Engineering examination for the fourth time.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Ancell to continue the application of Ron Harwell. Staff is directed to schedule an interview between Mr. Harwell and the Board at the June meeting so that he may present documentation on the progress of his study plan and comments on his progress from a mentor. Motion passed, with Mr. Milligan voting against the motion.

Mr. Jones met with the Board to discuss his request to sit for the Fundamentals of Land Surveying for the fourth time.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Howe to continue the application of Joseph Jones. Mr. Jones will schedule an interview with the Board at or before the February 2007 meeting in order to present the Board with documentation indicating that he is prepared for the exam. Mr. Jones will be expected to provide documentation on any additional college courses in mathematics he has completed and any study materials used in preparation for the exam. Motion passed with Mr. Milligan voting against the motion.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

6. The subcommittee responsible for creating educational requirements for land surveyors discussed their progress. The subcommittee met on March 1st and drafted a list of 27 possible credit requirements to be used as the prescriptive courses for land surveyors.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

27. Staff requested that the May board meeting be rescheduled from May 12-13, 2006 to May 11-12, 2006 due to a schedule conflict.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. McClure to reschedule the May Board meeting from May 12 & 13, 2006 to May 11 & 12, 2006. Motion passed, Mr. Howe abstained.

VI. CONSIDERATION OF DISCIPLINARY MATTERS

FY03.21 Mr. Curtis petitioned the Board for a declaratory ruling stating that the design of fire alarm systems and fire sprinkler systems for commercial applications constitutes the practice of professional engineering. Mr. McClure scheduled a meeting of the Fire Protection Advisory Committee on March 15, 2006. He will provide a report on their progress at the May meeting.

FY06.06 Idaho Rural Water Assoc., non-certificated business entity.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize counsel to send a cautionary letter to the Idaho Rural Water Association explaining that the Board does not agree with their assessment of services rendered and they will need to file an application for a Certificate of Authorization to continue operating as they do. Motion passed unanimously.

FY06.07 Coeur d'Alene Builders Supply, unlicensed practice. Attorney Richards sent a letter to CDA Building Supply regarding an advertisement for employment to conclude whether or not a professional engineer is involved. Mr. Curtis completed a preliminary investigation into this matter as directed by the Board.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Ancell to direct staff to follow up and clarify what happens with the end product in regards to truss loads, whether MiTek engineers review the output before it is sent to the building officials, and whether MiTek engineers stamp only the truss design or the structural design as well. Motion passed unanimously.

FY06.08 Adams Surveying, LLC, non-certificated business entity. On February 2, 2006, Adams Surveying, LLC was issued Certificate of Authorization #1864.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Milligan to close docket with no further action. Motion passed unanimously.

FY06.09 McKinney, Earl F., action taken by Kentucky Board

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Howe to schedule a hearing in this matter. Mr. Young appointed Mr. McClure as hearing officer. Motion passed unanimously.

FY06.10 Spaulding, Scott, responsible charge

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize staff to conduct a preliminary investigation into the matter. Motion passed unanimously.

FY06.11 Reeder, Shawn, responsible charge

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize staff to conduct a preliminary investigation into the matter. Motion passed unanimously.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

7. House Bill 300, passed by the legislature during the last session, necessitates the review and possible restructuring of the Board Strategic Plan. The Board will develop Vision and Mission Statements and discuss resources available to

generate data for use in performance measurements. The Board will discuss this matter at the May meeting.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

1. The Board Members and Staff reported their activities since the last Board meeting. Mr. Milligan reported that he attended the EPP committee meeting in Las Vegas, NV. Mr. Howe attended the ISPLS Board of Governor's meeting in Boise and the NCEES Task Force meeting in Phoenix, AZ. Mr. Ancell reported that he had interviewed 5 candidates requesting a third time assignment to the exams. Mr. Young conducted three interviews with candidates requesting a third time assignment to the exams and made a presentation to engineering students at Idaho State University on the Rules of Professional Responsibility. Mr. McClure reported that he is active on the Magic Valley Chamber of Commerce committee evaluating coal fired plants in the Magic Valley. Mr. Curtis conducted a presentation at the University of Idaho for the electrical engineering students and he also attended the PNWER reception with legislators in Boise.

3. The Board discussed concerns about staff participating in continuing education seminars of for-profit entities.

4. NCEES released the National Pass Rates for the October 2005 FE exam. The Board noted the information.

5. Michael Hathaway's application for PLS by comity was denied at the February 2005 meeting for an educational deficiency. He was told that he would need to complete an additional 20 semester credits before reapplying. Mr. Hathaway is completing these credits and is requesting that the Board review the course descriptions he has provided for surveying content. He will need 15 credits of surveying and is unsure how much surveying his completed coursework will qualify for.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. McClure to send a letter to Mr. Hathaway from the Chair informing him that the Board evaluated his transcripts and concluded that he would be allowed 5 credits for Engr121 from Big Bend Community College, no more than 3 credits for CAD classes past and present, and 3 credits for Engr1500 from Middle Georgia College. The Board denied the use of 3 credits for Engr2501 because the content is a repeat of material contained in Engr121. Engr2502 will qualify for surveying credits providing the content is beyond that of Engr121. Motion passed unanimously.

9. Mr. Howe reported that some members of ISPLS have expressed a desire to have the NEWS BULLETIN published more often and the internet roster updated more frequently.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. McClure to establish a Board policy stating that the Board will publish a minimum of two quality NEWS BULLETINS per year. Board policy is to update the roster on the internet on a monthly basis. Motion passed unanimously.

10. Heather Tomaseski requested reassignment to the Principles and Practice of Engineering examination in the civil discipline for the third time. Her husband is currently serving in Iraq and she resides in Maryland. She requested the opportunity to interview with a Board member via telephone instead of in person.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Howe to deny Ms. Tomaseski's request for a telephone interview. Staff is directed to make arrangements for a video conference interview between Ms. Tomaseski and Mr. Ancell. Motion passed unanimously.

11. Staff completed the Annual Report to the Governor for the Board's review. Staff would like the Board to approve the Annual Report to the Governor and authorize modifications thereto for distribution to the societies as well as the NCEES Western Zone.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Milligan to approve the Annual Report as presented by staff and authorize distribution to the societies and the Governor. Motion passed unanimously.

13. NCEES provided the Board with communications between NCEES and ABET. The Board noted the information.

15. NCEES launched the Finish It! Campaign to promote licensure.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize staff to order enough copies of all materials available from NCEES for distribution to the University of Idaho, Idaho State University, Boise State University and BYU-Idaho. Motion passed unanimously.

17. APEGGA provided an invitation to their International Mobility Forum in Edmonton, Alberta, April 19 – 22, 2006.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Ancell to authorize Mr. Curtis and Mr. Young to attend this meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

18. NCEES provided the Board with proposed amendments to the NCEES Constitution and Bylaws. The Board noted the information and will discuss the matter at the Board retreat in August.

20. Mark Mason would like the Board to add information about the upcoming 2nd Annual Idaho Reuse Conference to the NEWS BULLETIN.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Milligan to inform Mr. Mason that the NEWS BULLETINS do not include announcements for other organizations. The Board suggests that he contact ISPE, ASCE and other such organizations with his request. Motion passed unanimously.


