Minutes of Meeting

The Board of Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors held a regular meeting on August 29, 30, & 31, 2006 at the Statehouse Inn, 981 Grove St., Boise, Idaho, to conduct Board business. The meeting convened at 8:30 a.m. on Tuesday, August 29, 2006 with the following Board members present: Scott McClure, James H. Milligan, John Howe, William J. Ancell, and Gary Young. Also present was David L. Curtis, Executive Director, and Jennifer Rowe, Administrative Assistant.

I. READING OF MINUTES

1. Approval of minutes of the June 8-10, 2006 Board meeting as distributed.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to approve the minutes of the June 8-10, 2006 meeting as distributed. Motion passed unanimously.

2. Approval of minutes of the August 25-26, 2006 Board Retreat as distributed.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to approve the minutes of the August 25-26, 2006 meeting as distributed. Motion passed unanimously.

II. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA

1. NCEES announced that a construction module will be added to the Civil PE exam.
2. Teri Tyler passed the PE exam and wrote to the Board to express her appreciation for their assistance.
3. Governor Risch reappointed Mr. Young to a second term on the Board.
4. Mr. Milligan was selected to receive the Distinguished Service Award at the NCEES Annual Meeting.
5. Numerous right-of-entry examples were received from PLS's in Idaho.
6. Staff shared comments by applicants and registrants on our service.
7. The NCEES Board of Directors approved funding a Member Board Administrator at future Board of Directors meetings.
8. Engineers Australia contacted the Mississippi Board about furthering mobility for engineers.

9. A complaint was filed in Teton County against Arnold Woolstenhulme.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to note all items on the Consent Agenda with the exception of Item 9. Item 9 was moved to New Business Item 25 for discussion. Motion passed unanimously.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

4. H+M Architects agreed to meet with Mr. Walker to discuss and review the plans for the Marathon Cheese project. Mr. McClure reviewed the specifications and expressed some concerns. This matter was assigned Complaint Docket No. FY06.22.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to continue this matter. Motion passed unanimously.

5. The Board of Architectural Examiners responded to the Board's request for the formation of a joint task force to discuss clarifying the definitions of engineering and architecture. Mr. McClure and Mr. Young will continue to make arrangements to meet with members of the Board of Architectural examiners. The Board noted the information.

6. Staff requested authorization to proceed with publication of Pending Rules if there are no significant comments on the Proposed Rules which were published in the September edition of the Administrative Bulletin.

Moved by Mr. Ancell, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize staff to proceed with publication of Pending Rules if there are no significant comments on the Proposed Rules. Motion passed unanimously.

7. ISPLS and the Board previously discussed changes to the Idaho Code relating to monuments disturbed by construction activities. Mr. Howe presented some further discussion on the matter.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Ancell to appoint Mr. Young and Mr. Howe to a subcommittee to review the matter. The Chair will send a letter to ISPE, ISPLS, ACEC-Idaho, ITD, AIC, and John Tensen to schedule a meeting to discuss the matter. Motion passed unanimously.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

1. Reports by Board Members and Staff of activities since the last Board meeting.

Mr. Howe attended the ISPLS meeting in Salmon, Idaho, interviewed a candidate for 3rd assignment, and will be attending the Roundtable discussion of the ISPE Northern Chapter on November 3, 2006.

Mr. Ancell attended the Negotiated Rule Making meeting on July 26, 2006 in Boise and interviewed approximately 8 candidates for 3rd assignment as well as conducting approximately 6 follow-up interviews.

Mr. Milligan attended the PNWER meeting in Edmonton, Alberta, Canada July 16-20, 2006, and attended the Civil PE exam committee meeting July 27-30, 2006 in Clemson, South Carolina.

Mr. McClure attended the PNWER meeting in Edmonton, Alberta, Canada July 16-20, 2006, and he wrote a Guest Editorial for the Times News relating to cross border mobility.

Mr. Curtis attended the PNWER meeting in Edmonton, Alberta, Canada July 16-20, 2006.

V. CONSIDERATION OF APPLICATIONS - INTERVIEWS

Rick Marbury joined the meeting to discuss his request for a 4th assignment to the Civil PE examination with the Board.

Moved by Mr. Ancell, seconded by Mr. Young to deny Mr. Marbury's request for a 4th assignment to the Civil PE examination at this time. The Board will be receptive to future applications by Mr. Marbury if he develops a better work plan to increase his competency and presents evidence that he has completed a minimum of one 3 semester credit course in geotechnical engineering at a junior level or higher. Motion passed with Mr. Milligan voting against the motion.

VI. CONSIDERATION OF DISCIPLINARY MATTERS

H. Scott Brown, Jim Reese, Jerry Hastings, Jack Clark, Clyde Porter, Jim Washburn and Tony Bonner joined the meeting.

FY06.15 Marks, Colleen – surveying practices. The Board dismissed this matter as unfounded in February 2004, February 2005 and May 2006. The Complainant, Mr. Brown, met with the Board to discuss the matter further. Although Mr. Brown feels that his property lines were moved improperly by Ms. Marks, the surveyors in attendance stated that they have not found a material discrepancy in the surveys in question.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Young to continue this matter in order to allow the Board time to review the documents further. Motion withdrawn.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Howe that the Board order an investigation on issues other than lateral right-of-way. Motion passed unanimously.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

2. Members of ACEC-Idaho met with the Board to discuss the preparation of record drawings. David Bennion, Larry Hoffman and Tim Haener joined the meeting.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to have the Chair sign a letter to ACEC-Idaho clarifying the NEWS BULLETIN article relating to using a disclaimer when sealing documents. The Board will consider amendments to statutes and/or rules to clarify the issue of when professional engineers must seal record drawings. Motion passed unanimously.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. NEWS BULLETIN 38 was mailed out to license holders in June. Comments were received from Charles Robinson relating to the definition of a “Standard Design Plan”.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to amend the definition of “Standard Design Plan” to include the words “or sited” following the word “constructed”. Motion passed unanimously.

2. The Board reviewed the proposed statute amendments and discussed the input received at the July 26th Negotiated Rule Making meeting and comments received from J-U-B Engineers.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Young to withdraw the proposed legislation on Title 55 Chapter 17. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to approve the statute changes to 54-1215(3)(b) as amended by the Board. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to adopt amendments to the definitions of Responsible Charge and Standard Design Plan as discussed by the Board. Motion passed unanimously.

The Board noted J-U-B’s comment on time extensions for hearings.

3. In June, NCEES reported an irregularity with 2 examinees on the Fundamentals of Surveying examination in Boise, Idaho. Attorney Mike Kane conducted an investigation into the matter and provided his recommendation. ELSSES provided a response to the collusion reports provided to the Board.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for the Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes and Mr. Ancell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to accept Mr. Kane's report and recommendation. The Board directed staff to issue Land-Surveyor-in-Training certificates to the candidates involved. A copy of Mr. Kane's report and the applicable Board minutes will be sent to NCEES for their records. Motion passed unanimously.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

3. Alexander Whitman, PE requested advice from the Board on how to stamp plans and specifications properly.

Moved by Mr. Ancell, seconded by Mr. Young to direct staff to a draft letter from the Chair responding to Mr. Whitman's questions. Staff will circulate a draft to the Board members for approval and/or comments before mailing. Motion passed unanimously.

4. The Board of Architectural Examiners may pursue legislation which would give them authority over those who practice architecture without a license. They have suggested that this Board consider joining them in this legislative effort.

Moved by Mr. Ancell, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize the Chair to sign a letter to the Board of Architectural Examiners stating that the Board will not seek regulatory authority over non-license holders. Motion passed unanimously.

5. Hoj Engineering and Sales Co., Inc. requested that the Board approve their use of the term "engineering" in their business name in Idaho.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize counsel to write to Hoj Engineering and Sales Co. and notify them that the Board denied their request to use the term "engineering" in the business name and requests that they provide additional information regarding the services they provide in the state of Idaho. Motion passed unanimously.

7. David Couch requested the Board's opinion relating to surveyors signing amended plats. Patrick Scheffler also voiced concerns on the subject.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize staff to draft a letter to Mr. Couch and Mr. Scheffler indicating that an amended plat is a separate document from the original plat. Another surveyor, in responsible charge of the amended plat, who takes no exception to the survey which created the original plat, and identifies the corners and monuments as having been set originally by the first surveyor, can sign as being in responsible charge of the amended plat. Chair will sign the letter upon review and approval by the Board. Motion passed unanimously.

10. Mr. Ancell discussed the need to better clarify the 3 assignment limit to exam applicants when they first apply.

Moved by Mr. Ancell, seconded by Mr. Young to direct staff to include a specific statement in all examination application packets indicating that Idaho Code addresses a third administration of the exam after an interview, but not subsequent assignments. Staff directed to include information about third assignments and interview requirements to those who fail an exam for the first time. Motion passed unanimously.

11. J. Chris Pfahl submitted comments relating to the destruction of monuments at the Bunker Hill Superfund Site OU #3 by DEQ.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize the Chair to sign a letter to Rob Hansen of DEQ notifying him of the requirements of the law regarding the destruction of monuments and inquiring as to whether these requirements are included in the contract with those contractors doing the remediation. Motion passed unanimously.

15. DEQ requested nominations for a Dispute Resolution Panel.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to authorize the Chair to sign a letter to Mr. Mason thanking him for the information, but the possibility of a future conflict of interest would preclude the Board or staff from serving on such a panel. Motion passed unanimously.

IV. CONSIDERATION OF DISCIPLINARY MATTERS

FY05.18 Leavitt, Darren R., surveying practices. Mr. Leavitt submitted an administrative penalty as ordered by the Board. Glen Bennett reviewed Mr. Leavitt's work as requested and he submitted documentation for the Board's review.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for the Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes and Mr. Ancell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize staff to request information from Ada County regarding Records of Survey completed by Darren Leavitt and authorize staff to hire Glen Bennett to review any ROS's by Mr. Leavitt not already reviewed. The Board directed staff to have Attorney Kane review the case for possible action. Motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Farthing and Mr. Pearson joined the meeting.

FY05.07 Balance Engineering, LLC, unlicensed practice. Balance Engineering had a Certificate of Authorization which expired July 31, 2003. The Board met with Mr. Farthing and Mr. Pearson to discuss the working arrangements of the new partnership Balance Mechanical Services, LLC.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to dismiss the action seeking an injunction against Mr. Farthing and his use of the name "Balance Engineering, LLC". Staff is authorized to issue a Certificate of Authorization for Balance Mechanical Services, LLC. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to close this docket with no further action. Motion passed unanimously.

FY06.19 J-U-B Engineers, Inc., Rules of Professional Responsibility. Mr. Higgins completed a Preliminary Investigation and discussed his findings with the Board.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for the Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes and Mr. Ancell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Ancell to authorize Mr. Higgins to work with counsel to negotiate a Stipulation and Consent Agreement in this matter. If an agreement cannot be reached, a hearing date will be set for this matter in conjunction with the November Board meeting. In the case of a hearing, Mr. Milligan will be appointed as Hearing Officer. Motion passed unanimously.

FY05.22 Cook, Kenneth H., P.L.S., timely filing. Mr. Cook may not be in compliance with the Stipulation and Consent Order he previously signed.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for the Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes and Mr. Ancell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to continue this matter. Motion passed unanimously.

FY05.23 Soderling, Alan R., P.E., violations of the rules of professional responsibility. A Motion for Reconsideration was filed in this matter. The complainant filed a request with the District Court for a reconsideration of the Board's determination.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to continue this matter. Motion passed unanimously.

FY06.05 Orton, Richard F., Russell, William H., and Petrich, Christian R., failure to seal documents. Kirby Vickers requested that the Board re-examine their previous determinations in these matters.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for the Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes and Mr. Ancell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Ancell, seconded by Mr. Young to direct counsel to send a letter to Mr. Arkoosh reaffirming the Board's previous decision and providing a more thorough explanation of the Board's decision in the Russell matter. FY06.15 Marks, Colleen – surveying practices. The Board dismissed this matter as unfounded in February 2004, February 2005 and May 2006. The Complainant, Mr. Brown, met with the Board to discuss the matter further. Mr. Young reviewed the surveys provided and discussed his findings with the Board.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Howe to reconsider the Board's previous action in this matter. Motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Young reviewed the documents provided by Mr. Brown and concluded, after comparison of the boundary dimensions of the Hastings surveys and the Marks survey, that there were no significant discrepancies between the Record of Survey exhibits prepared by Ms. Marks and the October 2000 survey performed by Mr. Hastings.


