

**BOARD OF PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS
AND PROFESSIONAL LAND SURVEYORS**

Minutes of Meeting

The Board of Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors held a regular meeting on February 22 - 24, 2007 at the Owyhee Plaza, 1109 Main St., Boise, Idaho, to conduct Board business. The meeting convened at 8:00 a.m. on Thursday, February 22, 2007 with the following Board members present: Scott McClure, James H. Milligan, Gary Young, John Howe, and William J. Ancell. Also present were David L. Curtis, Executive Director, and Jennifer Rowe, Administrative Assistant.

I. READING OF MINUTES

1. Approval of the minutes of the November 15-18, 2006 Board meeting as distributed.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to approve the minutes of the November 15-18, 2006 meeting with corrections to New Business Item 18 as discussed. Motion passed unanimously.

2. Approval of the minutes of the December 15, 2006 telephone conference as distributed.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to approve the minutes of the December 15, 2006 telephone conference meeting as distributed. Motion passed unanimously.

II. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA

1. ISU submitted information to the Board relating to student enrollment as requested.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to note the item on the Consent Agenda with no further action. Motion passed unanimously.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

2. At the November meeting, Mr. Young and Mr. Howe were appointed to a subcommittee to work with ISPLS regarding possible amendments to Idaho code 55-1908(2). Mr. Young and Mr. Howe will work together to coordinate their thoughts about the matter before meeting with ISPLS.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Howe to continue this matter. Motion passed unanimously.

3. Mr. McClure and Mr. Young continue to study clarifying the definitions of Engineering and Architecture. Mr. McClure and Mr. Young will meet to discuss the solutions found by other states such as Montana, Oregon and Nevada. At that

point, they will then contact the Board of Architectural Examiners and schedule a meeting time for the full subcommittee.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to continue this matter. Motion passed unanimously.

4. Mr. Howe and Mr. Young continue to review the necessity of modifying Idaho Code 50-1303 monumentation standards. A subcommittee has been created by ISPLS to work on this matter with the Board.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Howe to schedule a meeting with the ISPLS subcommittee prior to the April Board meeting and update the Board on their progress at the next meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

5. Mr. Curtis provided the Board with an update on current legislative matters. He informed the Board that House Bill 28 had passed in the House and was scheduled to be heard in the Senate. The Board noted the information.
6. Rob Hansen of DEQ responded to the Board's letter regarding references to Idaho Code 55-1613 in future DEQ contracts.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Howe to send a letter from the Chair to Mr. Hansen expressing the Board's appreciation for his responsiveness. Motion passed unanimously.

7. ISPE set a preliminary schedule for the Board to make a presentation at the ISPE Annual Conference. The Board reviewed topics for discussion.

Moved by Mr. Ancell, seconded by Mr. Milligan to include the following topics in the Board's discussion at the ISPE meeting: continuing education (Mr. Young); additional educational requirements for licensure, such as the ASCE's Bachelor + 30 (Mr. McClure); license mobility (Mr. Milligan); the Board policy on multiple examination failures (Mr. Ancell). Motion passed unanimously.

8. Joseph Haynes of the Local Highway Technical Assistance Council submitted an update to the Board concerning the certification of technicians to collect field data for speed studies.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to send a letter from the Chair to Mr. Haynes thanking him for his report and to inquire if there is a "refresher" course or program envisioned for the technicians. Motion passed unanimously.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

1. Reports by Board Members and Staff of activities since the last Board meeting. Mr. Howe reported that he attended the ISPLS Annual Meeting and Board of Governor's meeting at which time he presented them with the BPEPLS Annual Report. He also participated in the Monuments Disturbed by Construction

meeting in Boise. Mr. Young attended the ISPLS Annual meeting; participated in the Monuments Disturbed by Construction meeting and traveled to Boise to conduct interviews with candidates for a third assignment to exam. Mr. Curtis attended the Monuments Disturbed by Construction meeting; was interviewed by NSPE magazine; attended the NCEES Governance Task Force; made a presentation to the University of Idaho PE exam review class and attended the NCEES Board President's Assembly meeting. Mr. Milligan participated in the Civil PE Exam Committee meeting in Clemson, SC; participated in an NCEES Item Difficulty Task Force meeting in Phoenix, AZ; participated in the ISPE Northern Chapter Standard of Care committee meetings; participated in the NCEES EPE Committee meeting, and participated in the NCEES Board President's Assembly in Atlanta, GA. Mr. Ancell interviewed six candidates for third assignment to exams and will participate in the introduction of new PE's at the ISPE Southwest Chapter meeting. Mr. McClure attended the ISPE meeting in Twin Falls and attended a meeting of Building Code Officials in Wood River Valley.

2. Staff drafted a NEWS BULLETIN and Board Members submitted articles for the NEWS BULLETIN for review. Staff discussed publishing the NEWS BULLETIN online with a postcard notifying registrants of its location.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Ancell to publish the NEWS BULLETIN on the Board website and send a postcard notification to registrants. The postcard should contain a Table on Contents for the NEWS BULLETIN. The online NEWS BULLETIN should have a hit counter so that we can track the number of users that view the NEWS BULLETIN. Additional items to include in the NEWS BULLETIN are; Mr. McClure's article on fire protection, In MEMORIUM section, and the Board letter to Bob Ankersmit. Motion passed unanimously.

VI. CONSIDERATION OF DISCIPLINARY MATTERS

Clyde Porter joined the meeting.

FY06.04 Mickelson, Richard, P.L.S. Surveying Practices. Clyde Porter prepared a Preliminary Investigation for the Board's review.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for the Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes and Mr. Ancell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize staff to file a formal complaint in this matter and offer Mr. Mickelson a Stipulation and Consent Agreement. Lacking a satisfactory negotiation of a Stipulation & Consent Agreement, staff will take measures to proceed to a hearing. Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.08 Long, Verl., surveying practices. Mr. Porter completed a preliminary investigation for the Board's review. Some additional information was received from Mr. Long.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for the Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes and Mr. Ancell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Howe to send a letter from the Chair expressing concern over Mr. Long's lack of research, scrivener's error of the instrument number and the cashing of a check without filing the record of survey. The Board requests that Mr. Long monument the well exception and record an amended Record of Survey to that effect. The Board also request that Mr. Long submit copies of his next three surveys for review by the Board. Mr. Howe, Mr. Young and Mr. Porter will review surveys submitted by Mr. Long. Motion passed unanimously.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Staff provided the Board with a draft rewrite of Title 54 Chapter 12 for review. The Board discussed amendments for the proposed legislation.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Young to publish the suggested amendments as discussed in the NEWS BULLETIN for comments. Motion passed unanimously.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

4. Jared Potts submitted questions to the Board relating to acceptable "Position Titles" for EITs.

Moved by Mr Ancell, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize the Chair to send a letter to Mr. Potts expressing concern over the use of the title "Environmental Engineer" since PE's are licensed by the use of an exam in environmental engineering. Cite Idaho Code 54-1201 regarding use of the term "engineer". The Board is more comfortable with the title EIT or Staff Engineer. Motion passed unanimously.

6. Mr. Aschenbrenner received a B.S. degree in mathematics in 2002 and then obtained a B.S. degree in engineering in 2004. The law states that experience must be gained AFTER graduation. Would engineering related work experience count that was obtained between 2002 and 2004?

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to send a letter from the Chair to Mr. Aschenbrenner suggesting that he send in his application and the Board will review it on its merits. Depending on the type of work experience prior to his B.S. degree in Engineering, it may count towards his total time. The Board suggests that he be sure to

describe his work experience in detail. Motion passed with Mr. McClure voting against the motion.

3. Staff requested the authority to reject applications that clearly do not meet the minimum requirements of Idaho Code without a Board review. If an individual has a disciplinary action but has complied with all the requirements of the jurisdiction where the incident took place, can staff consider them a standard application?

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize staff to reject applications which clearly do not meet the minimum statutory requirements. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize staff to consider applicants who have one and only one disciplinary action as standard applications provided they have complied with all the requirements of the disciplining jurisdiction to be considered in good standing and meet all other aspects required to be considered a standard application in Idaho. Motion passed unanimously.

7. Tim Haener, P.E. notified the Board that DEQ promulgated a rule which would allow professional geologists to determine leakage from sewage lagoons. Mr. Haener asked whether or not the Board of PE & PLS and the Board of Professional Geologists will meet to discuss this issue.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to assign Mr. Young, Mr. Milligan and Mr. Ancell to a subcommittee to study the issue, obtain the regulations, and prepare a position statement on the matter for consideration at the next meeting. Staff will gather rule information for the subcommittee and notify DEQ and the Board of Professional Geologists of the need to schedule a meeting to discuss the issue. Motion passed unanimously.

9. The application packets were updated to reflect revised wording relating to the question on disciplinary action. The Engineer-in-Training and Certificate of Authorization application do not include this question. Should it be added to these applications? Should the renewals include a question about disciplinary action?

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to add a question about disciplinary action to the Certificate of Authorization applications but not to the Engineer-in-Training applications. In addition, update the renewal forms to include a question regarding disciplinary action in other jurisdictions. Motion passed unanimously.

10. Staff requested authorization to attend the PNWER meeting July 22-25, 2007 in Anchorage, AK and the upcoming NCEES Western Zone and APEGGA meetings.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize the attendance of staff and one Board member to the PNWER meeting July 22-25, 2007 and the APEGGA meeting

in Calgary this April. Authorize staff and all Board members to attend the NCEES Western Zone meeting in Gleneden Beach, OR in April and the NCEES Annual meeting in Philadelphia in August 2007. Mr. McClure will attend the PNWER Summit and Mr. Young will attend the APEGGA conference. Motion passed unanimously.

11. The Association of International Credential Evaluators (AICE) submitted information relating to their foreign credential evaluation services.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Ancell to send a letter from the Chair to AICE declining approval of their services as they do not indicate a specialization in the field of evaluating engineering credentials. Motion passed unanimously.

12. The NCEES Special Committee on Constitution and Bylaws submitted a proposed amendment to the NCEES Constitution. The Board noted the information.

13. The Secretary of State's Office requested authorization from the Board to approve the Association of Western State Engineers as an acceptable name for a nonprofit association in Idaho.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to approve the use of the term "engineers" in the business name of the Association of Western Engineers. Motion passed unanimously.

16. Senate Bill 1163 was introduced which would add requirements to the record of survey law.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize Mr. Curtis to present informative testimony on this issue at the Senate Hearing reflecting the client's option to waive the requirement. Motion passed unanimously.

Val Wynn joined the meeting.

5. Val Wynn requested that the Board further clarify Idaho Code Section 50-1313. Mr. McClure recused himself and asked Mr. Milligan to chair this portion of the meeting.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize the acting Chair to send a letter to Mr. Wynn stating that the Board does not have statutory authority to enforce the platting law; therefore, the resolution of this matter must be addressed through the individuals and local jurisdictions involved. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. McClure recused.

14. Robert Riccke, President of Engineered Products, requested the Board's permission to use his business name in Idaho.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to send a letter from the Chair stating that according to the "Engineered Products" website, they provide engineering for

seismic and structural systems. Providing those services would require them to obtain a Certificate of Authorization and the Board encourages them to do so. The Board denies the request to waive objection to their use of the business name "Engineered Products" without filing a Certification of Authorization. Motion passed unanimously.

8. Mr. Comstock had comments and questions relating to the creation and use of digital signatures.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize the Chair to send a letter to Mr. Comstock stating that the following signature styles are acceptable:

- Using the "Original Signed By" process as described in 54-1215.
- Scanning a document with the seal and "wet signature" into an unalterable PDF format and distributing.
- Signing with a "digital signature" as defined in 54-1202.

Scanning a "wet signature" and applying that over an electronic seal in an unsecured manner is not acceptable. In order to be acceptable, any process must make the signature unique to the document being signed, and insure that any alteration of the document results in invalidation of the signature. Motion passed unanimously.

19. Mike Phillips, City of Rathdrum public works inspector, requested the Board's input on responsibility for replacement of monuments disturbed by construction.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize the Chair to send a letter to Mr. Phillips stating that Idaho Code 55-1613 states that the owner of a project (such as a subdivision) or an agency sponsoring a project (such as a sewer extension) is responsible for preserving or replacing monuments. The design engineer has the responsibility to show the corners on the design plans. The contract documents should specify who is responsible for the cost of preserving or replacing monuments lost or disturbed by construction. Motion passed unanimously.

VI. CONSIDERATION OF DISCIPLINARY MATTERS

FY05.18 Leavitt, Darren R., surveying practices. Mr. Bennett reviewed some additional work done by Mr. Leavitt.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for the Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes and Mr. Ancell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize staff to file a formal complaint in this matter and schedule a hearing. Motion passed unanimously.

FY05.23 Soderling, Alan R., P.E., violations of the rules of professional responsibility. There is a hearing scheduled on June 7, 2007 pertaining to this matter.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to continue this docket. Motion passed unanimously.

FY06.11 Reeder, Shawn, responsible charge.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for the Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes and Mr. Ancell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize the Chair to sign a subpoena directing Mr. Reeder to submit the information required in the previous subpoena including documentation of supervision of work, and in addition, submit calculations associated with the plans that he submitted, and copies of contracts between his firm and the various architects on the projects in question. Also, Mr. Reeder will need to explain the presence of the architectural firm title block but lack of architect's seal and signature. Motion passed unanimously.

FY06.16 Vermeer, Louis, engineering practices. Mr. Vermeer was offered a STIPULATION AND CONSENT AGREEMENT.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for the Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes and Mr. Ancell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to reauthorize staff to file a formal complaint in this matter and schedule the Administrative Hearing in Sandpoint. Motion passed unanimously.

FY06.18 Landmark Surveying, Inc., Brad Wallace, PE. Responsible charge. Wendell Higgins performed an investigation into this matter.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for the Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes and Mr. Ancell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Milligan to close this docket with no further action as there does not seem to be an indication that there was a violation of statute in regard to responsible charge. Motion passed unanimously.

FY06.22 H+M Engineers, standard of care. H+M will meet with Mr. Walker to review the plans. Staff contacted Mr. Walker regarding progress on this matter.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to continue this matter pending plan review by Mr. Walker and Mr. McClure. Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.02 Woolstenhulme, Arnold – rules of professional responsibility. Mr. Woolstenhulme indicated that all remaining issues should be resolved by January 15, 2007.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for the Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes and Mr. Ansell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize the Chair to send a letter to Mr. Woolstenhulme summarizing his previous correspondence and statements and point out that he has not complied with the Board's requests. The Board requests that Mr. Woolstenhulme submit a list of deficiencies and a planned schedule of compliance. Chair to send letter to Mr. Lee and ask if he is satisfied with Mr. Woolstenhulme's actions. Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.04 Truchot, Darren – rules of professional responsibility. Dr. Sharma completed a preliminary investigation into this matter.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for the Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes and Mr. Ansell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize staff to negotiate a Stipulation and Consent Agreement in this matter. Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.05 Cook, Kenneth H., PLS – survey practices. Brad Moulton, who had expressed concerns over the survey practices of Mr. Cook, reported that Mr. Cook has been helpful in working toward a resolution of the problem and that no further action is requested of the Board at this time.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Howe to continue this matter. Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.09 Dreyer, Robert P., violations of the rules of professional responsibility. A STIPULATION AND CONSENT AGREEMENT was offered to Mr. Dreyer.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for the Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes and Mr. Ancell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize Mike Kane to write to Mr. Dreyer (certified, return receipt requested) and give a deadline by which to respond to the Stipulation and Consent Agreement. Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.12 Scott, Rodney, rules of professional responsibility

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to authorize staff to enter into a contract with a structural engineer to perform the preliminary investigation into this matter. Dr. Edwin Schmeckpepper, PE at the University of Idaho may be a good candidate for conducting the investigation. Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.13 Mountain River, Inc., failure to seal and sign plans

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Ancell to authorize the Chair to send a letter to Mr. Koefed thanking him for the changes to their procedures. The Board authorizes the Chair to write to Bonneville County and the City of Idaho Falls regarding the need for site plans containing engineering elements to be prepared under the supervision of a PE and sealed, signed and dated by him/her. A copy of this letter will be sent to Mr. Koefed and IDABO. Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.14 Titus Manufacturing, non-registrants

Moved by Mr. Milligan., seconded by Mr. Ancell to authorize counsel to write to Mr. Titus and inform him that his response indicates that he is practicing engineering and he must cease and desist or face possible prosecution. Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.15 Matthew Thompson, standard of care

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize staff to conduct a preliminary investigation into the request for inquiry and inform parties that the Board does not consider this a formal complaint under the Administrative Procedures Act. Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.16 Bybee, Scott, unlicensed practice. Mr. McClure recused himself in this matter and asked Mr. Milligan to chair this portion of the meeting.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to authorize staff to conduct a preliminary investigation into this matter. Motion passed with Mr. McClure recused.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

21. Inland Northwest Engineering Inc.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize the Chair to send a letter to Mr. Danielson informing him that we have no jurisdiction over those reviewing his plans. The Board also notes that his business entity has not yet been issued a Certificate of Authorization so providing engineering and/or land surveying services through the business entity is practicing contrary to the law. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to approve the application of Charles Alan Barge for licensure as a professional engineer especially qualified in electrical engineering on the basis of comity with his licensure in Georgia. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to approve the application of R. L. Bibb Swain for licensure as a professional engineer especially qualified in civil engineering on the basis of comity with his licensure in Tennessee. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to approve the application of Dirk Andrew Buttke for licensure as a professional engineer especially qualified in civil engineering on the basis of comity with his licensure in Wisconsin. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Young to continue the application of Stuart Alexander Chisholm for licensure as a professional land surveyor on the basis of comity

with his licensure in Washington for further documentation as requested by the Board. Motion failed with Mr. Ancell voting in favor of the motion.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Howe to deny the application of Stuart Alexander Chisholm for licensure as a professional land surveyor on the basis of comity with his licensure in Washington. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Howe to continue the application of Lance Paul Greer for licensure as a professional land surveyor on the basis of comity with his licensure in Utah for further documentation as requested by the Board. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to approve the application of Franciscus Hardianto for licensure as a professional engineer especially qualified in civil engineering on the basis of comity with his licensure in California. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Ancell to continue the application of Thomas Reid Hart for licensure as a professional engineer especially qualified in civil engineering on the basis of comity with his licensure in Utah for further documentation as requested by the Board. Motion passed unanimously.


