

**BOARD OF PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS
AND PROFESSIONAL LAND SURVEYORS**

Minutes of Meeting

The Board of Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors held a regular meeting on April 19 & 20, 2007 at the Ameritel Inn Spectrum, 2501 South 25th, Ammon, Idaho, to conduct Board business. The meeting convened at 8:00 a.m. on Thursday, April 19, 2007 with the following Board members present: Scott McClure, James H. Milligan, Gary Young and William J. Ancell. Also present were David L. Curtis, Executive Director, and Jennifer Rowe, Administrative Assistant. Mr. Howe was unable to attend the meeting.

I. READING OF MINUTES

1. Approval of the minutes of the January 22, 2007 conference call meeting as distributed.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to approve the minutes of the January 22, 2007 conference call as distributed. Motion passed unanimously.

2. Approval of the minutes of the February 22 – 24, 2007 Board meeting as distributed.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to approve the minutes of the February 22 – 24, 2007 meeting as distributed. Motion passed unanimously.

II. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA

The Board noted that there were no items on the consent agenda.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. The subcommittee appointed to work with ISPLS on possible amendments to Idaho Code 55-1613 reported on their progress. Draft amendments were finalized and have been added to the NEWS BULLETIN for comments from stakeholders. The Board noted the information.
2. The subcommittee appointed to work with the Board of Architectural Examiners to clarify the definitions of engineering and architecture reported on their progress. The subcommittee asked the other Board members for input and will report on their progress at the June meeting.
3. Mr. Young reported on progress relating to modifying Idaho Code 50-1303, monumentation standards. Mr. Young indicated that the subcommittee meeting

held on April 2, 2007 was well received and the surveyors in attendance were supportive of the modifications.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to send a letter from the Chair to the subcommittee members expressing the Board's appreciation for their work. Motion passed unanimously.

4. Joseph Haynes of the Local Highway Technical Assistance Council responded to the Board regarding refresher courses for technicians.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to note Mr. Haynes response with no further action. Motion passed unanimously.

5. Mr. Young, Mr. Milligan and Mr. Ancell were assigned to a subcommittee to prepare a position statement relating to DEQ's rule that professional geologists can determine leakage from sewage lagoons. The Chair appointed Mr. Young to chair the subcommittee and directed the subcommittee to report on their progress at the June meeting.
6. AICE (Association of International Credential Evaluators, Inc.) responded to the Board's letter regarding their services to member organizations.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to send a letter to AICE from the Chair stating that credential evaluators may approach the Board independently and present their credentials for determination by the Board as to adequacy. Blanket approval will not be given. Motion passed unanimously.

7. Review of Strategic Plan Objectives. Mr. Ancell contacted Boise State about conducting a registrant satisfaction survey. The Board discussed the cost estimate provided by BSU and directed Mr. Ancell to speak with the university about conducting the survey without a mailing, only a website survey. The Board discussed the goals and objectives outlined in the Strategic Plan and progress towards meeting those goals.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to approve the modifications to the Strategic Plan as discussed. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to schedule the June Board meeting in Twin Falls, Idaho and direct staff to invite ISPE and ISPLS to attend. Motion passed unanimously.

8. Mr. Curtis provided the Board with an update on the legislative session and outcomes. Mr. Curtis discussed the problems that occurred relating to House Bill 28 and indicated that possible amendments to include the right of access legislation will be included in the NEWS BULLETIN for comment. The Board noted the information.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

1. Reports by Board Members and Staff of activities since the last Board meeting.

All Board Members except Mr. Howe attended the ISPE annual meeting and participated in a presentation of current issues. Mr. Milligan, Mr. Young, Mr. Ancell, Mr. Howe and Mr. Curtis attended the NCEES Western Zone meeting in Gleneden Beach, Oregon. Mr. Ancell worked on developing a satisfaction survey for our registrants. Mr. Curtis made a presentation to the University of Idaho electrical engineering sophomores on licensing and the Rules of Professional Responsibility.

2. Gary Briant, Surveyor, submitted questions to the Board concerning Title 55-1504 and 55-1509 as they relate to condominium plats.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize the Chair to send a letter to Mr. Briant stating that relative location and approximate dimensions of the interior perimeter walls of each unit are sufficient and elevation can be relative and need not be tied to standard datum. This information will be included in the next NEWS BULLETIN. Motion passed unanimously.

3. Ronald Self, Cartographer of Bonner County, requested the Board's opinion on filing scrivener's error versus filing a correct plat.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize the Chair to send a letter to Mr. Self stating that the Board agrees with the opinion expressed by the Deputy Prosecuting Attorney in the memo to Planning dated March 1, 2007. This information will be included in the next NEWS BULLETIN. Motion passed unanimously.

4. Election of Board Officers.

Moved by Mr. Ancell, seconded by Mr. Young to nominate Mr. Milligan as Chair, Mr. Howe as Vice Chair, and Mr. Ancell as Secretary of the Board. Motion passed unanimously.

5. Staff suggested that the Laws and Rules booklet should be published electronically via the website due to the cost of hard copy distribution.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to direct staff to notify license and certificate holders by postcard that the Laws and Rules Booklet is available on the internet. Hard copies will be provided upon request. Motion passed unanimously.

6. Staff provided the Board with an update on the agency budget position for FY2007. The Board requested that staff begin providing a more detailed budget summary at future meetings.

10. David Couch expressed concern about a "Certificate Note" that appeared on plans submitted by Tim Fox.

A copy of the letter will be sent to Mr. Couch. Direct counsel to investigate the legal definitions of certification, guarantee, and warranty relative to 50-1309 and 54-1215. Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.02 Woolstenhulme, Arnold – rules of professional responsibility. The Board directed Mr. Woolstenhulme to submit a list of deficiencies and a planned schedule of compliance.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for the Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes and Mr. Ancell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize the Chair to send a letter to Mr. Woolstenhulme requesting confirmation of completion of corrective work with a copy of the letter to be sent to Mr. Lee. An additional letter to be sent to Mr. Lee asking if he is satisfied with Mr. Woolstenhulme's schedule and filings with a copy of the letter sent to Mr. Woolstenhulme. Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.08 Long, Verl., surveying practices. Additional information was received from Valerie Kugler's attorney. James Grow, Attorney for Verl Long, also submitted a response to the Board.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for the Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes and Mr. Ancell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to send a letter from the Chair to Mr. Long asking why he surveyed according to deed instrument No. 199614 instead of instrument No. 203044 which was of record when he did the work for Ms. Carbury-Noakes? Who told him "this survey reflects the agreement of the owners"? Point out to Mr. Long that he was hired by Ms. Carbury-Noakes to survey the well house. Indicate to Mr. Long's attorney that not all monuments must have corner records, but in accordance with 55-1906(2), all those which already have corner records must be identified by instrument number. A response will be required by May 18, 2007 from Mr. Long. Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.14 Titus Manufacturing, non-registrants. Counsel was directed to contact Titus Manufacturing about practicing professional engineering without a license. A letter was sent by counsel on March 23, 2007.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for the Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes and Mr. Ancell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize counsel to resend the letter certified with return receipt requested. Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.12 Scott, Rodney, rules of professional responsibility. Ed Schmeckpepper has agreed to conduct a Preliminary Investigation in this matter. The Board discussed the time line relating to this matter.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for the Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes and Mr. Ancell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize counsel to prepare an ORDER for signature of the Chair extending the 6 month time period for justifiable cause. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize counsel to prepare an ORDER for signature of the Chair extending the 6 month time period for justifiable cause. Motion passed unanimously.

7. The Governor signed the FY2008 appropriation bill which includes additional funds for the salaries of the Executive Director and the Deputy Director. The Board reviewed the budgetary increase of \$25,600.00 and discussed salary increases for both positions.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to increase the salary of the Executive Director to \$83,390.00 and increase the salary of the Deputy Director to \$63,390.00. The

Board directs staff to implement salary increases for non-classified and classified positions as soon as the budget will allow. Motion passed unanimously.

8. April Spacek has requested reassignment to the Spring 2008 exam. Ms. Spacek has been reassigned several times in the past. Staff requested that the Board terminate her file if she does not sit for the exam in Spring 2008.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to notify Ms. Spacek that she has been assigned to the Spring 2008 exam. Any future assignment will require a new application. Motion passed unanimously.

FY05.18 Leavitt, Darren R., surveying practices. Mr. Bennett reviewed some additional work done by Mr. Leavitt. Staff is working with Attorney Kane to file a formal complaint. A Hearing has been tentatively scheduled for June 13, 2007. The Board noted the information.

FY06.16 Vermeer, Louis, engineering practices. Mr. Vermeer refused to sign the STIPULATION AND CONSENT ORDER negotiated by staff and a hearing has been scheduled in this matter for May 21-23, 2007. The Chair appointed Mr. Milligan as Hearing Officer.

FY06.22 H+M Engineers, standard of care. H+M will be meeting with Mr. Walker to review the plans. Mr. McClure and Mr. Walker will review the plans.

FY07.04 Truchot, Darren – rules of professional responsibility. Dr. Sharma completed a preliminary investigation into this matter. A STIPULATION AND CONSENT ORDER was offered to Mr. Truchot.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for the Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes and Mr. Ancell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to accept the STIPULATION AND CONSENT ORDER and authorize the Chair's signature. A copy of the ORDER will be sent to Mr. Crawforth. Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.05 Cook, Kenneth H., PLS – survey practices. Brad Moulton had expressed concerns over the survey practices of Mr. Cook but reported that Mr. Cook has been helpful in working toward a resolution of the problem and that no further action is required of the Board at this time.

FY07.09 Dreyer, Robert P., violations of the rules of professional responsibility. At the November meeting, staff was directed to negotiate a STIPULATION AND CONSENT AGREEMENT. Mr. Dreyer has submitted a signed copy of the ORDER with the fine.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for the Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes and Mr. Ancell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to accept the STIPULATION AND CONSENT ORDER and authorize the Chair's signature. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize the Executive Director to send the amended ROS and corner records to Mr. Howe and Mr. Young for review. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to continue this matter. Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.13 Mountain River, Inc., failure to seal and sign plans. The Board took action on this matter at the last meeting but did not close the docket.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for the Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes and Mr. Ancell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize the Chair to send letter to Mr. Fuller thanking him for his thoughtful response and his support of the requirement that work involving the practice of engineering be done by a person licensed as a Professional Engineer and stamped and signed and dated by the Professional Engineer. Close this docket with no further action. Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.16 Bybee, Scott, unlicensed practice. Clyde Porter has agreed to conduct a Preliminary Investigation in this matter.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to continue this matter. Motion passed unanimously.

9. ECE Inc. requested that the Board consider them an approved foreign credential evaluation service.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize the Chair to send a letter to ECE Inc. and inform them that the Board would require an evaluation which uses only documentation from the university, verifies the authenticity of the documentation, and compares credentials to the requirements of an EAC/ABET program at the time of graduation. None of the samples provided by them exhibited that type of evaluation thus the Board denies their request. Motion passed unanimously.

11. Dean Pierose sent out an RFI for the document imaging project.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize Mr. Pierose to prepare an RFP and make a recommendation to the Board upon receipt. The Board invites Mr. Pierose to attend the June Board meeting to explain his recommendation. Motion passed unanimously.

12. Staff presented the Board with an updated financial summary of FY2007 through March 31, 2007 as well as an update of the Board Member payroll expenses. The Board noted the information.

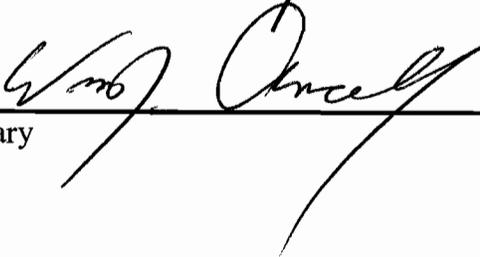
