Minutes of Meeting

The Board of Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors held a regular meeting on June 13 - 16, 2007 at the Owyhee Plaza, 1109 Main St., Boise, Idaho, to conduct Board business. The meeting convened at 1:00p.m. on Wednesday, June 13, 2007 with the following Board members present: James H. Milligan, John W. Howe, William J. Ancell, Gary Young, and Scott McClure. Also present was David L. Curtis, Executive Director and Jennifer Rowe, Administrative Assistant.

**V. CONSIDERATION OF APPLICATIONS**

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss credentials not subject to disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Young, Mr. Ancell, yes, and Mr. Howe, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

2. Approval of the minutes of the May 14, 2007 telephone conference call as distributed.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Howe to approve the minutes of the May 14, 2007 telephone conference call as distributed. Motion passed unanimously.

#### **II. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA**

1. ISPE submitted a recommendation to the Governor for Jim Milligan to remain on the Board for another 5 year term.
2. NCEES commissioned a management study relating to the activities of the Council.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Howe to note the items on the Consent Agenda with no further action. Motion passed unanimously.

#### **III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

1. The subcommittee appointed to work with the Board of Architectural Examiners to clarify the definitions of engineering and architecture reported on their progress.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Young to continue this matter to the next meeting for an update on the subcommittee's progress. Motion passed unanimously.

2. Mr. Young, Mr. Milligan and Mr. Ancell were assigned to a subcommittee to prepare a position statement relating to DEQ's rule that professional geologists can determine leakage from sewage lagoons. The subcommittee reported on their progress.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to continue this matter to the next meeting for an update on the subcommittee's progress. Motion passed unanimously.

3. Review of Strategic Plan Objectives. After reviewing the Strategic Plan Objectives the Board revised the deadline for completion of the experience evaluation to January 2008.
6. AICE (Association of International Credential Evaluators, Inc.) responded to the Board's letter regarding their services to member organizations.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to note the information. Motion passed unanimously.

#### **IV. NEW BUSINESS**

1. Reports by Board Members and Staff of activities since the last Board meeting. Mr. Milligan attended the Civil PE exam committee meeting in Clemson, SC, April 26-29<sup>th</sup> and presented a seminar to the Northern Chapter of ISPE on Professional Responsibility in Post Falls. Mr. Young made a presentation to SEAI in Boise on responsible charge and attended the APEGGA Annual Meeting in Calgary. Mr. Curtis attended the APEGGA Annual Meeting in Calgary. Mr. Howe advised a surveyor regarding the need to file a Record of Survey; met with ISPLS in May and has been working on modifications to the State Plane Coordinate System statutes.
3. The Board set meeting dates for calendar year 2008.

Motion passed unanimously.

5. The Illinois PE Board ruled that the Surveying Engineering curriculum at Ferris State University is not an acceptable engineering degree program.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Howe to note the information for future reference. Motion passed unanimously.

2. ACEC-Idaho invited a Board member to attend their Annual meeting at the Tamarack Resort on July 20<sup>th</sup>.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize Mr. Milligan to attend the ACEC-Idaho Annual meeting at the Board's expense. Motion passed unanimously.

3. A.J. Maupin of DEQ submitted a question about the DEQ Technical Guidance Manual infringing upon PE & PLS jurisdiction relating to evapotranspiration system design and construction guidance for onsite wastewater processing/disposal.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Young to have the Chair write a letter to Mr. Maupin and let him know that it appears to the Board that engineering expertise and professional judgment would be required for a number of the aspects of these systems including the alarm system; embankment (if necessary); quality control of sand specifications, liner material and installation. Failure of a system such as this could have an adverse effect on public health and safety through contamination of groundwater, etc. Some aspects would require interdisciplinary input such as from agronomists, etc., but the overall design should be under the responsible charge of a professional engineer who is familiar with the technical matters involved. Motion passed unanimously.

8. The Board received the NCEES Annual Meeting 2007 motions. The Board noted the information.
11. Staff updated the Board on Fiscal Year 2007 financial outlook. The Board noted the information.
12. Web statistics have been provided by the Department of Administration to indicate how many hits the NEWS BULLETIN received since May. There was a reported 1328 hits in May. The NEWS BULLETIN was posted in April and we no longer have the hits for that time period. The Board noted the information.
13. Mr. Curtis selected Jim Szatkowski for the Deputy Director position. Mr. Szatkowski accepted the offer and will begin employment on July 29, 2007. The Board noted the information.

FY06.16 Vermeer, Louis, engineering practices. The Board accepted the Motion to Vacate and Continue this docket. A hearing has been scheduled for August 13-15, 2007. The Board noted the information.

FY07.05 Cook, Kenneth H., PLS – survey practices.

Brad Moulton, who had expressed concerns over the survey practices of Mr. Cook, has reported that Mr. Cook has been helpful in working toward a resolution of the problem and that no further action is requested of the Board at this time. Mr. Moulton called and left a message for Mr. Curtis indicating that the matter was taken care of and that he would like to drop the complaint.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Young to close this docket. Motion passed unanimously.

FY06.22 H+M Engineers, standard of care. Mr. McClure spoke with Mr. Walker and Mr. Walker indicated that he will review the plans shortly.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Young to continue this matter. Motion passed unanimously.

FY06.04 Mickelson, Richard, P.L.S. Surveying Practices. Mr. Mickelson has requested that he be allowed to retire from practice as of July 31, 2007. Mr. McClure received a letter from Mr. Critser expressing concern regarding non-surveyors performing investigations on the work of Professional Surveyors.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes, Mr. Ancell, yes, and Mr. Howe, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize the Chair to write a letter to Mr. Mickelson informing him that the Board accepts his request with the provision that his two remaining surveys be reviewed and approved by Clyde Porter, P.L.S., under contract to the Board, prior to them being submitted to a client or government agency. Upon completion of the surveys the Board will enter his license into retired status. Mr. Mickelson must write back accepting these conditions in order for them to go into effect. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Howe to send a letter from the Chair to Mr. Critser indicating that the Board is authorized to conduct investigations, and those investigations may be conducted by any person whom the Board deems qualified. Investigations are conducted to ascertain facts and do not involve the practice of the profession under investigation. As such, they do not have to be done by a person licensed in the particular profession. When deemed necessary by the investigator, and authorized by the Board, professional technical advice or assistance is obtained. Motion passed unanimously.

#### **IV. NEW BUSINESS**

14. Travis Foster emailed the Board regarding a surveyor's responsibility and duties.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Howe to have staff get additional information from Foster on contract for services, services actually performed, etc. Motion passed unanimously.

#### **III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

5. An RFP was sent out for the document imaging project and bids were received. Dean Pierose met with the Board to discuss his recommendations.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize the purchase of a vendor hosted solution to EDMS and authorize contract with Dean Pierose to provide consultation on process of coordinating software provider and conversion provider, project planning, negotiation of the details of the conversion contract. Motion passed unanimously.

#### **V. CONSIDERATION OF APPLICATIONS**

##### **INTERVIEW**

Jordan Hristov met with the Board to discuss his application to sit for the Principles and Practice of Land Surveying examination and to request that the Board reconsider the previous denial of his application.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Young to reconsider the previous denial of Mr. Hristov's application to sit for the Principles and Practice of Land Surveying examination. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Howe to continue Mr. Hristov's application for assignment to the Spring 2008 examination contingent on the following: successful completion of a 3 credit course in a boundary surveying topic, documentation from the University of Wyoming relating to surveying coursework, and an update of his PLS experience. Motion passed with Mr. Young and Mr. Milligan voting against the motion.

## VI. CONSIDERATION OF DISCIPLINARY MATTERS

FY07.15 Matthew Thompson, standard of care. Wendell Higgins completed a Preliminary Investigation in this matter.

Mr. Higgins joined the meeting.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes, Mr. Ancell, yes, and Mr. Howe, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Young to dismiss this matter as unfounded. A letter will be sent from the Chair to Mr. Dimond and Mr. Thompson stating that after conducting a preliminary investigation into the matter, the Board concluded that the complaint is unfounded. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to have the Board office send a copy of Mr. Thompson's initial response to Mr. Dimond with a copy of the cover letter to Mr. Thompson. Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.16 Bybee, Scott, unlicensed practice. Clyde Porter completed a Preliminary Investigation in this matter. Randy French submitted a question about how to proceed with corrections.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes, Mr. Ancell, yes, and Mr. Howe, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to direct staff to file such charges against Mr. Bybee and Mr. Carlson as might be appropriate given the information from the preliminary investigation. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. McClure recused.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Ancell to direct the Chair to write to Mr. French and tell him that if he was in responsible charge of the land surveying aspects of the plat as defined in Idaho Code, he can and probably should work toward a resolution that is in compliance with Idaho Code and that is acceptable to the local jurisdiction. However, if he was not in responsible charge of the land surveying aspects of the plat as defined in Idaho Code, he cannot, according to IC 54-1215, seal and sign the plat. Motion passed unanimously with McClure recused.

### **III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

- 4 David Couch expressed concern about a "Certificate Note" that appeared on plans submitted by Tim Fox. At the last meeting, the Board asked Mr. Fox to explain his reason for placing the disclaimer on the plat in light of 50-1309 and 54-1215. Counsel provided some background on the definitions involved.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize the Chair to write a letter to Mr. Couch, with copy to Mr. Fox, stating that the Board does not object to the Certificate exactly as worded; however, regardless of the attempt to define what is meant by "certify" and "certification", the Board will hold any Professional Land Surveyor to the standard of care of the profession as required by the Idaho Code and the Rules of Professional Responsibility, regardless of such disclaimers. Motion passed unanimously.

7. Engineered Products, A Pape Company was not approved as a company that could provide services in Idaho using the word "Engineered" in their business name. Further documentation was received from Engineered Products with a request that the Board reconsider their previous decision.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize the Chair to write a letter to Engineered Products and ask them to provide modified web pages to indicate the use of consultants rather than employees for engineering services. The Board will reconsider their previous decision after review of such documentation. Motion passed unanimously.

8. Comments were received relating to the proposed legislation that was sent out in the NEWS BULLETIN.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize the Chair to write a letter to Mr. Erickson, Mr. Pearson and Mr. Golding thanking them for the feedback, informing them that the Board considered their suggestions, made some minor modifications to the draft language and will proceed with the legislation as enclosed. ISPLS, a statewide organization with wide support and input from the surveying profession has gone on record in support of the draft legislation. Motion passed unanimously.

### **IV. NEW BUSINESS**

2. Bob Ankersmit had a question for the Board about the International Residential Code Section 40 regarding foundation and retaining walls.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize the Chair to write a letter stating that the Building Official for the AHJ has authority to make that judgment. Some residential foundations would be well within the prescriptive portions of the codes cited, while others might require engineering judgment and knowledge. Therefore, the Board believes that it is within the authority of the AHJ Building Official to make that determination based on the complexity of the project, and urges you to make that decision with public safety as the paramount concern. Motion passed unanimously.

4. Les Stith of Engineering Consultants requested that the Board answer some questions on the use of the title "engineer".

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize the Chair to send a letter to Mr. Stith stating that the Board uses Idaho Code 54-1201 as guide. A graduate engineer who has not passed FE exam could use the title "Graduate Engineer" or "BSEE", but he should not use a title which includes wording of a discipline for which a professional engineer licensing examination is available, i.e. "Electrical Engineer" or "Mechanical Engineer". A graduate engineer who has passed the FE may use the title "Electrical Engineer, E.I.T." as suggested. Motion passed unanimously.

9. Mr. Curtis provided information to Bob Wells relating to changing the funding for self-governing agencies. The Board noted the information.
10. Attorney Woody Richards discussed Idaho Code requirements regarding conflict of interest with the Board. The Board noted the information. Staff to include an article about lobbying of executive branch officials in the next NEWS BULLETIN.

## **VI. CONSIDERATION OF DISCIPLINARY MATTERS**

FY05.18 Leavitt, Darren R., surveying practices. An Administrative Hearing was scheduled for this matter beginning at 8:00 a.m. on Wednesday, June 13, 2007.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to extend the 6 month time limit for hearing required under Idaho Code 54-1220(2) based on just cause stated on the record of hearing. Motion passed unanimously.

FY05.23 Soderling, Alan R., P.E., violations of the rules of professional responsibility. There was a hearing scheduled on June 7, 2007 pertaining to this matter. Counsel has provided a copy of the Petitioner's Reply Brief for our records. Counsel has provided a report from the June 7<sup>th</sup> hearing. Attorney Woody Richards updated the Board on the District Court proceedings. The Board noted the information.

FY06.11 Reeder, Shawn, responsible charge. Counsel reissued a subpoena to Mr. Reeder.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes, Mr. Ancell, yes, and Mr. Howe, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Ancell to continue this matter and request that Mr. Reeder attend the September Board meeting to discuss his practice of engineering. Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.02 Woolstenhulme, Arnold – rules of professional responsibility. The Board wrote to both Mr. Woolstenhulme and Mr. Lee, the Complainant, in this matter. Responses were received from both parties.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes, Mr. Ancell, yes, and Mr. Howe, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize the Chair to write to Mr. Woolstenhulme, with a copy to Mr. Lee, stating that the Board expects Woolstenhulme to notify Forsgren (with copy to Board and Mr. Lee) of the corrective survey which affected the location of the C-W 1/16 corner perpetuated by Forsgren in the February survey. Mr. Woolstenhulme also must research county records to see if there have been any other surveys which might be affected and notify the affected surveyors and the Board and Mr. Lee, in writing, of the results of that research. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Young to add the following statement to the first letter: the Board has spent an inordinate amount of time and resources helping to resolve this issue and in the future the Board expects Mr. Woolstenhulme to be more timely, forthright, and cooperative if similar issues develop in the future as required in the Rules of Professional Responsibility. Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.08 Long, Verl, surveying practices. The Board requested additional information from Mr. Long. A response was provided as well as additional information from Valerie Kugler.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes, Mr. Ancell, yes, and Mr. Howe, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize the Chair to write to Mr. Long stating that the Board reviewed the judgment and the ROS and suggests the correction of 545.80 on the drawing versus 545.90 contained in legal description. The judgment contains the dimension of 545.90. It appears that some of the drawing is prepared in pencil rather than black opaque drafting film ink as required by Idaho Code section 55-1905(1). Please submit a copy of the four corner records referenced and the BLM survey. Remove "Assumed" on left side of the North Arrow since a basis of bearing is indicated. Reference any surveys within or crossing or adjoining as required by Idaho Code 55-1906(3) including the GLO survey. Describe the monument common to

sections 14, 15, 22 & 23. The basis of bearing statement should be corrected to say "South line of the Southwest quarter of the Southeast quarter of section 15 . . . ". The distance from the centerline of Ford's Creek Road to the set iron rod should be shown. Please resubmit for review when corrections are completed. Title block should be title "Amended Record of Survey". Change date of Surveyors Certificate to indicate the most recent work. Show all record distances and bearings from BLM survey and any other record distances and bearings. Submit closure calculations. Check acreage of parcel taking into account the road right-of-way which is included in the description. Should fence encroachment of .08 be .80? Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.12 Scott, Rodney, rules of professional responsibility. Ed Schmeckpepper completed a Preliminary Investigation in this matter.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. Young, yes; Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes, Mr. Ancell, yes, and Mr. Howe, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize staff to negotiate a Stipulation and Consent Order with Mr. Scott. Failing the ability to agree on the terms of a Stipulation and Consent Order, staff is authorized to start proceeding to a hearing. Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.14 Titus Manufacturing, non-registrants. Counsel contacted Titus Manufacturing about practicing professional engineering without a license.
