

BOARD OF PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS
AND PROFESSIONAL LAND SURVEYORS

Minutes of Meeting

The Board of Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors held a regular meeting on September 12 - 15, 2007 at the Holiday Inn, 3300 S. Vista, Boise, Idaho, to conduct Board business. The meeting convened at 8:00a.m. on Wednesday, September 12, 2007 with the following Board members present: James H. Milligan, John W. Howe, William J. Ancell, Gary Young, and Scott McClure. Also present was David L. Curtis, Executive Director, Jim Szatkowski, Deputy Director, and Jennifer Rowe, Administrative Assistant.

VI. CONSIDERATION OF DISCIPLINARY MATTERS

Attorney Angela Richards, Attorney John Finney, and Louis Vermeer joined the meeting.

FY06.16 Vermeer, Louis, engineering practices. A hearing was held August 13-15, 2007. The Board discussed Closing Arguments presented by both parties and discussed the charges brought before them.

Count 1. Bush Residence. This Charge had to do with incompetence in 4 parts:

1. Not using the design storm required by Bonner County ordinance 12-202.
2. By presenting a Stormwater Management Plan which did not contain construction quality drawings of all physical features of a proposed stormwater management system as required by Bonner County Ordinance 12-2431(b).
3. By not including the roof area of the building in the impervious area calculation as required by Bonner County Ordinance 12-202.
4. by presenting stormwater calculations which do not result in the storage volumes presented on the plan.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to sustain all 4 parts of Count 1. Discussion followed. Moved by Mr. McClure and seconded by Mr. Ancell to amend to not sustain parts 2 and 3 in Count 1. Motion to amend passed with Mr. Young voting No. Amended motion is to sustain parts 1 and 4 of the complaint.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to restore a sustaining of part 3. Motion passed unanimously. The motion as amended sustains parts 1, 2, and 3 of Count 1. The amended motion passed unanimously.

Count 2. Haughey Haven. This charge had to do with the Respondent not being complete, objective, and truthful in preparing the submittal as required by IDAPA 10.01.02.007.01 because he certified a condition of project approval that there

was an average of three inches of runoff retained in the ditches, but when asked to document how he came to that conclusion he could only certify that an average of two inches of runoff is retained in the ditches, and then only after additional rock check dams had been placed in the ditchline swales.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to sustain Count 2. Discussion followed. Motion passed unanimously.

Count 3. Trout Creek. This charge had to do with incompetence in 3 parts:

1. Not using the design storm required by the Bonner County Ordinance 12-202.
2. By presenting a Stormwater Management Plan which did not contain construction quality drawings of all physical features of a proposed stormwater management system as required by Bonner County Ordinance 12-24312(b).
3. By presenting stormwater calculations which do not result in the storage volumes presented on the plan.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Ancell to sustain parts 1 and 2. Discussion followed. Motion passed unanimously.

Count 4. Nickelena Estates Subdivision. This count had to do with incompetence in 3 parts:

1. By not using the design storm required by the Bonner County ordinance 12-202.
2. By not providing construction quality drawings of all physical features of a proposed stormwater management system as required by Bonner County Ordinance 12-2431(b).
3. By presenting stormwater calculations which do not result in the flows or storage volumes presented in the plan.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to sustain parts 2 and 3. Motion passed with Mr. Milligan, Mr. Young and Mr. Ancell voting Yes and Mr. McClure and Mr. Howe voting No.

Moved by Mr. Ancell and seconded by Mr. Young to reconsider the previous motion and ask for an explanation from Ms. Richards of her concern for consistency with previous motions, particularly on Count 3. Motion passed unanimously.

Ms. Richards suggested the Board should try to be consistent in its findings when the facts in different counts are similar. Discussion of the details in Count 3 versus the details in Count 4 as relates to alleged topographical errors, cross sections.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Young to sustain part 1 and delete part 3. Motion failed with Mr. McClure voting Yes and all others voting No.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to reconsider the decision on Count 3. Motion passed with Mr. McClure voting No.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to sustain parts 2 and 3 of Count 3. Motion passed with Mr. Milligan, Mr. Ancell and Mr. Young voting Yes and Mr. McClure and Mr. Howe voting No.

Count 5. Stillwater Point PUD, also known as Felten Lake View Estates. This count had two parts:

1. Incompetence by not providing construction quality drawings of all physical features of a proposed stormwater management system as required by Bonner County Ordinance 12-243(b).
2. By not being complete objective and truthful in preparing the as-built submittal as required by IDAPA 10.01.02.007.01 because on the as-built submittal he showed swales as being constructed which were not constructed and he failed to show swales which had been constructed.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. McClure to sustain both parts of the count. Motion passed unanimously.

Count 6. Morningstar Mountain Estates. This count had to do with incompetence in 4 parts:

1. By not providing construction quality drawings of all physical features of a proposed stormwater management system as required by Bonner County Ordinance 12-243(b).
2. By not using the design storm required by Bonner County Ordinance 12-202.
3. By presenting stormwater calculations which do not result in the flows or storage volumes presented in the plan.
4. By designing retention ponds in areas subject to non-storm event drainage, resulting in the ponds being full and not available to retain storm water as the design intends.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Young to sustain parts 1, 3 and 4. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Young to reconsider the previous action on Count 5. Motion passed unanimously.

Howe expressed a concern that the exhibits in part 2 of Count 5 are not marked as "as-builts" and so that portion of the charge should not be sustained.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Young to amend the motion on Charge 5 to sustain part 1 only. Motion passed unanimously.

Count 7. Action by Washington Board. This count had to do with Respondents voluntary surrender of his license to practice engineering in Washington after acknowledging that it was reasonable for the Washington Board to conclude that he violated Washington law, which violations would have been violations of

Idaho Code Section 54-1215 and the Rules of Professional Responsibility (IDAPA 10.01.02.005.02, IDAPA 10.01.02.006.01 and IDAPA 10.01.02.006.03) had they occurred in Idaho. Ms. Richards stated that the Idaho Administrative Rule allows the Board to take action only if a license is revoked, suspended or denied in another jurisdiction and none of those actions occurred in the Washington matter.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Ancell to not sustain Count 7. Motion passed with Mr. Young voting No.

Board discussed timing of preparation of draft FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW, AND ORDER, and asked that Ms. Richards have a draft by 1:00 p.m. on September 13, 2007.

Hearing Officer Milligan stated that a revocation of Mr. Vermeer's license was his recommendation. The Board discussed the prior STIPULATION AND CONSENT ORDER entered into between the Idaho Board and Mr. Vermeer in January of 2005. Mr. McClure suggested as an alternative, a stayed suspension of two years with the requirement that any engineering work he does be peer reviewed by an engineer approved by the Board. Mr. Milligan reiterated his recommendation that the license be revoked.

Moved by Mr. Young to accept Mr. Milligan's recommendation. Motion failed for lack of a second.

Mr. Ancell discussed the Board's obligation to protect the public and how to get to that point with Mr. Vermeer. He said that he did not think that Mr. McClure's alternative suggestion was severe enough. Mr. Ancell expressed a concern that Mr. Vermeer did not have the attitude of a professional and was not a good example of a practicing professional. Mr. Howe said that Mr. McClure's suggestion of an alternative was not harsh enough and he would like to come up with discipline short of a revocation, but he could not come up with a specific suggestion. Mr. McClure said the Board needed to send a strong message that Mr. Vermeer has not practiced competently and will likely curtail his practice if all his engineering work has to be reviewed by a peer. If he did not curtail his practice, then the public would be protected because all his work was being reviewed. Mr. Young expressed a concern that Mr. Vermeer not be allowed to serve as City Engineer reviewing plans by others which do not require the sealing of documents by Mr. Vermeer. Mr. Milligan said he shared that concern and had considered a discipline less than a revocation if all of Vermeer's work could be peer reviewed, but his work as City Engineer would not be peer reviewed, and Mr. Vermeer indicated a willingness to discontinue work on stormwater plans and work only as a City Engineer which was not acceptable to Mr. Milligan.

Moved by Mr. McClure to require Mr. Vermeer to complete as-yet to be determined courses in stormwater design, after which there would be a 2 year suspension which would be stayed, but all work stamped by Mr. Vermeer for any portion of the remaining 2

year period be peer reviewed by an engineer approved by the Board. Motion failed for lack of a second.

Moved by Mr. Ancell, seconded by Mr. Young to accept Mr. Milligan's recommendation to revoke the license subject to review of final FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW, AND ORDER. Motion passed with Mr. Howe and Mr. McClure voting No.

The Board will take up the matter again on Friday, September 14, 2007 at 8:00 a.m.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Howe to approve the minutes of the June 14-16, 2007 meeting as distributed. Motion passed unanimously.

II. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA

1. Governor Otter responded to Mr. Gates request for a meeting regarding the processing of his renewal and penalty.
2. The Attorney General's Office responded to the Board's request for a clarification of SB1157.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. McClure to note Items 1 and 2 on the Consent Agenda with no further action. Motion passed unanimously.

3. Idaho State University has an ABET visitation scheduled for October 21-23, 2007.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. McClure to remove Item 3 from the Consent Agenda for discussion as a New Business Item. Motion passed unanimously.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Update on proposed Right of Entry legislation.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Howe to note the various ISPLS Chapters support of the legislation. Motion passed unanimously.

2. Travis Foster emailed the Board regarding a surveyor's responsibility and duties. Mr. Curtis requested additional information from Mr. Foster and he has yet to respond.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize the Chair to write a letter to Mr. Foster indicating that Danskin Wastewater Pond Exhibit is not a survey as defined by Idaho Code by virtue of fact that no monumentation of angle points existed, therefore no ROS was required. Send a copy of the letter to Jack Clark. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. McClure abstained.

3. Comments were received on the proposed changes to the registration law, specifically continuing education for professional engineers.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to note receipt of the comments. Motion passed unanimously.

- 3a. The subcommittee appointed to work with the Board of Architectural Examiners to clarify the definitions of engineering and architecture reported on their progress. Staff was directed to facilitate meeting of members of both boards to get together and discuss this topic further.
4. Mr. Young, Mr. Milligan and Mr. Ancell were assigned to a subcommittee to prepare a position statement relating to DEQ's rule that professional geologists can determine leakage from sewage lagoons. The subcommittee will report on their progress. DEQ requested the Board's opinion on the new rules.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to authorize the Chair to write to Lane Nielson and inform him that we believe that this is the practice of engineering and their rule should be amended to reflect that. Civil engineers have in their required curriculum courses on surface water hydrology and geologists, as best we know, do not. Additionally, there are questions on the licensing examinations for civil engineers on the subject matter. All professional engineer license holders are prohibited from acting outside their area of competency, so not all civil engineers would necessarily be qualified, but a typical education and licensing process would provide the background necessary. Motion passed unanimously.

VI. CONSIDERATION OF DISCIPLINARY MATTERS

Mr. Reeder joined the meeting.

FY06.11 Reeder, Shawn, responsible charge. Mr. Reeder met with the Board on September 13, 2007 to discuss this matter.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. McClure to dismiss the complaint contingent on Mr. Reeder submitting a full set of stamped architectural plans on the McCarter Moorhouse Calm Office Building. The Chair will write to the Idaho Bureau of Occupational Licensing and notify them of the dismissal. Motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Reeder left the meeting.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

4. Tim Haener of J-U-B Engineers and Aaron Wert of Reidesel Engineering emailed the Board regarding the publishing of the roster and targeted recruiting.

Tim Haener joined the meeting.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to direct staff to conduct an inquiry into the matter. Motion passed unanimously.

7. Tim Haener drafted some suggested articles for the NEWS BULLETIN.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. McClure to authorize the Chair to write to Mr. Haener and thank him for the draft articles and inform him that the Board will consider including them in an edited format the next time a NEWS BULLETIN is published. Motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Haener left the meeting.

11. The Ada County Commissioner's Office requested a clarification on the authority of counties in the Plat Certification Process.

Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize staff to meet with Mr. Henderson to review the "1/4 years worth of paperwork" and determine if there is a pattern of deficiencies on the part of one or more license holders. Motion passed unanimously.

8. Rodney Burch had concerns about the LS education requirements taking effect in 2010.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize the Chair to write to Mr. Burch and inform him that the prescriptive courses recently adopted in the Administrative Rules provide an alternative route to assignment to the licensure examination for those who have not graduated from an approved surveying curriculum such as the program offered at Idaho State University. The Board shares his concern about the future supply of PLS's in Idaho and realizes that it is a nationwide problem. ISPLS was the principal driver of the legislation which resulted in the 2010 requirement for a four-year degree and perhaps your concerns regarding licensing should be discussed with them. The prescriptive courses adopted are the core curriculum of an approved program, and are necessary to demonstrate knowledge and skill similar to that attained upon completion of an approved surveying program. Motion passed unanimously.

10. The lawbook was published on the website in July with no hard copy provided. The web statistics for July are provided. The lawbook was the 2nd most downloaded file. The Board noted the information.




