

**BOARD OF PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS
AND PROFESSIONAL LAND SURVEYORS**

Minutes of Meeting

The Board of Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors held a regular meeting on November 15 – 16, 2007 at the Owyhee Plaza, 1100 Main St., Boise, Idaho, to conduct Board business. The meeting convened at 8:00 a.m. on Thursday, November 15, 2007 with the following Board members present: James H. Milligan, John W. Howe, William J. Ancell, and Scott McClure. Also present was David L. Curtis, Executive Director, Jim Szatkowski, Deputy Director, and Jennifer Rowe, Administrative Assistant.

I. READING OF MINUTES

1. Approval of minutes of the September 12-15, 2007 meeting.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. McClure to approve the minutes of the September 12-15, 2007 meeting as distributed. Motion passed unanimously.

2. Approval of the minutes of the October 16, 2007 telephone conference meeting.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Howe to approve the minutes of the October 16, 2007 telephone conference meeting as distributed. Motion passed unanimously.

II. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA

1. NCEES named ANSI Accredited Standards Developer.
2. The National Institute for Engineering Ethics has begun online and correspondence courses.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Howe to note the items on the Consent Agenda with no further action. Motion passed unanimously.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Review of Strategic Plan Objectives. The Board discussed progress on the Strategic Plan goals and objectives.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Howe to extend the completion deadlines of Objective 4b and 6b to June 30, 2008. Motion passed unanimously.

3. The subcommittee appointed to work with the Board of Architectural Examiners to clarify the definitions of engineering and architecture reported on their progress. At the previous meeting staff was directed to facilitate a meeting of members of both boards to discuss this topic further.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Ancell to direct staff to coordinate a meeting of members of the subcommittee and members of the Board of Architectural Examiners before the February 2008 Board meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

5. A subcommittee consisting of Mr. McClure and Mr. Young reported on their progress exploring alternatives to the current language of the previous directive provided to Jerry Hume on exercise of professional judgment by Building Officials.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Ancell to continue this matter to the February 2008 meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

6. Mr. Szatkowski presented the Board with an interim report on the audit of CPD for professional land surveyors. Mr. Szatkowski discussed his findings with the Board relating to the land surveyors continuing education.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. McClure to authorize staff to offer Stipulation and Consent Agreements to those who did not respond or who were more than 5 PDH's short of the requirement. Motion passed unanimously.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

1. Reports by Board Members and Staff of activities since the last Board meeting. Mr. Howe reported that he interviewed a candidate for 3rd assignment to the Fundamentals of Engineering examination; participated in two telephone conference calls regarding the NCEES calculator policy; participated on the State Plane Coordinate System statute evaluation group; evaluated surveys from Verl Long as directed by the Board; discussed legal descriptions by non-surveyors with Jack Clark and discussed digital signatures with a license holder. Mr. Ancell reported that he attended the ISPE meeting in Boise and participated in the ABET accreditation visit at the University of Idaho. Mr. McClure attended the ACEC-Idaho meeting to discuss his replacement on the Board in May of 2008 and attended the Idaho Energy Conference in Boise. Mr. Szatkowski attended the Idaho Energy Conference in Boise and attended the AIC Public Works group meeting. Mr. Curtis attended the APEGBC meeting in Whistler, B.C.; made a presentation to the AIC Public Works group and made a presentation to the ISPE Southwest Chapter on continuing education. Mr. Milligan attended the NCEES EPE Committee meeting in Atlanta, GA, and attended the APEGBC meeting in Whistler, B.C where he participated in a roundtable discussion on international mobility. The Board directed staff to remind ISPE and ACEC-Idaho about Mr. McClure's retirement from the Board.

Moved by Mr. Ancell, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize staff to make further presentations to ISPE Chapters on continuing education. Motion passed unanimously.

2. NCEES is accepting nominations for the National Awards. The Board noted the information.
3. Mr. Szatkowski updated the in-house licensing flowcharts to reflect the current licensing requirements. The Board directed staff to provide the flowcharts to them while reviewing applications.
5. Staff drafted a NEWS BULLETIN for the Board's review and comments. Mr. Szatkowski drafted a possible add-on for the NEWS BULLETIN. The Board reviewed the NEWS BULLETIN.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Howe to approve the NEWS BULLETIN as amended by the Board. Motion passed unanimously.

6. Mr. Szatkowski created a revision to the Board website. The Board noted the information and commended Mr. Szatkowski on his work.
7. Staff provided an Expense Reimbursement Summary for the Executive Director from September 9, 2007 through November 1, 2007 for the Board's review.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Howe to approve the expense reimbursement summary as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

10. Jeff Block asked the Board to determine if the title block for All Venture drafting is appropriate.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize Counsel to write to All Venture Drafting and express concern that the title block suggests that they can perform engineering and surveying. Motion passed unanimously.

11. Gary Young provided a report on the Idaho State University ABET Visitation. The Board noted the information.
12. Staff provided an updated financial summary through October 31, 2007. The Board noted the information.
13. Staff provided a DRAFT Annual Report for the Board's review.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Ancell to approve the 2007 Annual Report to the Governor and authorize preparation of similar reports to ISPLS, ISPE, and NCEES Western Zone. Motion passed unanimously.

14. The Board directed staff to invite Mr. Wissa to meet with the Board in February 2008 in Pocatello to discuss the surveying program at Idaho State University.

Angela Richards, Board Counsel, joined the meeting.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

4. Staff conducted an inquiry into Civil Science's recruiting techniques.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. McClure to note the concerns expressed but the Board does not believe there is a basis for disciplinary action at this time. Motion passed unanimously.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

8. Mr. Potter requested the Board's opinion on whether a document authored by ITD as part of a submission to the Army Corp. of Engineers for a Section 404 permit decision needs to be stamped and signed by an engineer.

Moved by Mr. Ancell, seconded by Mr. McClure to authorize staff to conduct a preliminary investigation into the matter to determine the extent of engineering involved in the preparation of Exhibits E and F, who prepared them, and to whom it was submitted. Staff to send a letter to Mr. Potter notifying him that the Board is conducting an investigation into the matter. Motion passed unanimously.

9. Mr. Howe received correspondence from an organization offering continuing education courses that are "approved" by the Idaho Board.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. McClure to authorize the Chair to write to this organization and express concern that their flyer implies that the Idaho Board has approved or accepts their courses, which we have not. Idaho does not pre-approve any courses, but examines the content and appropriateness of the course at the time it is audited. Motion failed with Mr. Ancell and Mr. Milligan voting against the motion.

- FY05.07 Balance Engineering, LLC, unlicensed practice. Counsel contacted Mr. Farthing and a response was received.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for in Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes and Mr. Ancell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize the Chair to write to William Pearson, P.E. and inform him that he is doing business under the name of a company to which the Board has not issued a COA. Balance Mechanical Services, LLC has a COA, but Balance Mechanical Services, LLC, dba Balance Engineering does not. Motion passed unanimously.

FY05.23 Soderling, Alan R., P.E., violations of the rules of professional responsibility. An appeal was filed with the Supreme Court on this matter.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Ancell to continue this matter. Motion passed unanimously.

FY06.04 Mickelson, Richard, P.L.S. Surveying Practices. Mr. Mickelson complied with the conditions of the informal agreement with the Board regarding his retirement from the practice of land surveying.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Ancell to close this docket. Motion passed unanimously.

FY06.11 Reeder, Shawn, responsible charge. Mr. Reeder was directed to submit a full set of stamped architectural plans on the McCarter Moorhouse Calm Office Building. As of November 2, 2007 Mr. Reeder submitted the architect-stamped plans requested by the Board.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Ancell to close this docket. Motion passed unanimously.

FY06.16 Vermeer, Louis, engineering practices. A revised FINAL ORDER was signed. Mr. Vermeer submitted all documentation required in the FINAL ORDER. Bonner County Planner Clare Marley called on November 13, 2007 and reported that Mr. Vermeer had submitted a Storm Water Management Plan for a project not listed on his submittal.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for in Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes and Mr. Ancell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize the Chair to write to Ms. Marley and inform her that the project was not on the list and in the opinion of the Board the County has no obligation to accept the stamped plan. Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.09 Dreyer, Robert P., violations of the rules of professional responsibility. Mr. Porter reviewed the survey for "Flat Iron Ranch."

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for in Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes and Mr. Ancell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Ancell to authorize the Chair to write to Mr. Dreyer and require him to submit to the Board for review an amended ROS and amended corner records with changes to reflect Mr. Porter's comments. Mr. Dreyer is not to file anything until that review is completed. Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.15 Matthew Thompson, standard of care. The Board dismissed this matter as unfounded after reviewing a preliminary investigation completed by Mr. Higgins. Mr. Dimond has appealed this dismissal and provided additional documentation for the Board.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for in Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes and Mr. Ancell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize staff to conduct an investigation into the new allegations based on Mr. Dimond's additional documentation. Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.16 Bybee, Scott, unlicensed practice of land surveying. Mike Kane wrote to Mr. Bybee regarding the Consent Agreement as he is awaiting a response.

Moved by Mr. Ancell, seconded by Mr. Howe to continue this matter. Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.20 Slaughter, George, unlicensed practice. Ms. Richards wrote to Mr. Slaughter as directed by the Board at the September meeting and Mr. Slaughter has not responded.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for in Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes and Mr. Ancell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Ancell, seconded by Mr. McClure to authorize counsel to prepare and send a draft injunction to Mr. Slaughter asking that he comply as requested in the previous letter or the injunction will be filed. Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.21 Skinner, Greg, surveying practices. Mr. Skinner filed an amended Record of Survey and the necessary Corner Records as requested.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. McClure to close this docket. Motion passed unanimously.

FY08.01 McDonald, Charles S., unlicensed practice. Mr. McDonald applied for a professional engineer license in Idaho by comity but it has not yet been issued. He used the title "P.E." on correspondence.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for in Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes and Mr. Ancell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Ancell, seconded by Mr. McClure to authorize the Chair to write to Mr. McDonald expressing concern that the letter in question was prepared by his supervisor and sent without his signature and then a letter was prepared by his supervisor and sent with his signature followed by the initials "P.E." The Board is of the opinion that the latter document is an engineering document and could only be done under the supervision of a person licensed as a PE in Idaho. Since Mr. McDonald is not licensed, the issue of who is in responsible charge of the work becomes a concern for the Board. The Board requests Mr. McDonald, his supervisor and the engineer in responsible charge of the engineering activities of BASIC Engineering appear before the Board at its February meeting to address this concern. Motion passed unanimously.

FY08.02 Smith, Bruce W., unlicensed practice of engineering. Mr. Smith has been accused in a formal complaint of practicing engineering on a subdivision in Camas County. Mr. Smith has submitted a response.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for in Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes and Mr. Ancell, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Ancell to authorize staff to conduct a preliminary investigation into Mr. Foisey's allegations against Mr. Smith and to conduct an additional investigation into concerns that Mr. Foisey represented himself as a land surveyor. Motion passed unanimously.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

Representatives from the Colleges of Engineering at Boise State University, Idaho State University, the University of Idaho and BYU-Idaho met with the Board to discuss the engineering programs at each school. Chair of the MSE Department at Boise State University, Janet Callahan; Dean Dick Jacobsen, PE of Idaho State University; Dean Aicha Elshabini of the University of Idaho; Chair of the ME department of BYU-Idaho, Dr. Garth Miller, PE, and Dean Kendall Peck of BYU-Idaho joined the meeting. Representatives each made a separate report to the Board on the status of their respective programs. Some of the items discussed

included: enrollment, ABET accreditation status, licensing of faculty, curriculum, and the progress of staff licensure.
