AND PROFESSIONAL LAND SURVEYORS

Minutes of Meeting

The Board of Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors held a regular meeting on February 26-28, 2008 at the Holiday Inn, 1399 Bench Road, Pocatello, Idaho, to conduct Board business. The meeting convened at 8:00 a.m. on Tuesday, February 26, 2008 with the following Board members present: James H. Milligan, John W. Howe, William J. Ancell, Gary Young and Scott McClure. Also present was David L. Curtis, Executive Director, Jim Szatkowski, Deputy Director, and Jennifer Rowe, Administrative Assistant.

Board Attorney Angela Richards joined the meeting.

V. CONSIDERATION OF APPLICATIONS

Mr. Aaron Blaisdell joined the meeting to discuss his application for Professional Land Surveyor by comity with the Board.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss credentials not subject to disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Ancell, yes, and Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Young, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. McClure to approve the application of Aaron Blaisdell for licensure as a professional land surveyor on the basis of comity with his licensure in Washington. Motion failed with Mr. Ancell, Mr. Howe and Mr. McClure voting against the motion.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Howe to continue the application of Aaron Blaisdell for licensure as a professional land surveyor on the basis of comity with his licensure in Washington for additional documentation. Motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Blaisdell left the meeting.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

2. Val Wynn wrote to the Board requesting more clarification on Vacation of Plats so that he can use the information in his appeal to the County Commissioners in Fremont County. Mr. McClure was recused from this discussion due to a potential conflict of interest. As discussed with Mr. Wynn at a previous meeting, the Board does not have jurisdiction in this matter.

Moved by Mr. Young seconded by Mr. Ancell to authorize the Chair to write to Mr. Wynn and inform him that he would have to file a petition to vacate as required by law and as previously advised by the County Commissioners. There are numerous sections of Idaho Code that relate to vacations with which he should become familiar. The Board does not have jurisdiction to assist persons with vacation appeals. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. McClure recused.

5. Counsel wrote to All Venture Drafting regarding the use of the terms engineering and surveying in their title block and a response was received.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize the Chair to sign letter to Mr. Hahn of All Venture Drafting suggesting that he clearly delineate that he is only providing drafting services, not engineering or land surveying. A suggestion for wording would be “All your drafting needs for...” Motion passed unanimously.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

2. Joel Slate, PE submitted a question to the Board relating to Idaho Code 54-1227 and engineers that perform surveys.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize the Chair to sign a letter to Mr. Slate citing the code and background of 54-1227. Motion passed unanimously.

5. Twin Falls Planning and Zoning requested clarification on “affidavit authorizing change of plat”. A sample amended plat was provided for the Board’s review. The Board reviewed Idaho Code Section 55-816 as it applies to this situation.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize the Chair to send a letter to Twin Falls Planning and Zoning stating that the Board believes, relative to surveying, Idaho Code Section 55-816 is intended to record “corrections”, not major revisions to recorded plats as this example seems to try to accomplish. The Board is not familiar with any other sections of Idaho Code that address corrections of recorded documents by affidavit, nor are we familiar with any case law regarding Idaho Code Section 55-816. The filing of an amended plat should eliminate the possibility that improvements will be placed within the expanded easements created in the affidavit. Motion passed unanimously.

8. Jack Clark, PLS expressed some concern over recent Board actions. The Board noted the information and Mr. Clark’s concerns.

Jack Clark and Tim Fox joined the meeting.

24. Mr. Clark discussed the use of the PLS stamp and seal as well as the preparation of legal descriptions with the Board. Mr. Clark asked the Board to reconsider its position that a PLS who prepares a legal description, but has not performed a survey and placed monuments, should, but is not required to seal the legal description.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize a subcommittee of Mr. Young and Mr. Howe to reevaluate the interpretation and interrelationships of Idaho Code Sections 54-1202(6), 54-1227, 55-1902(9) and 55-1904(2). The subcommittee will involve Attorney Mike Kane for advice. Motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Clark and Mr. Fox left the meeting. The Board met with the Board of Directors of ISPLS to discuss issues of importance to the profession.

9. Larry Hodge requested that the Board explain why condominium plats need to be done by a Professional Land Surveyor.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize the Chair to sign a letter to Mr. Hodge quoting Idaho Code section 55-1527 in regard to the applicability of the laws relating to plats applying to the Condominium Property Act. Motion passed unanimously.

11. Northwest Civil Design and Drafting does not provide engineering services in Idaho. However, they requested that the Board allow them to do business under that name in Idaho.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to authorize the Chair to sign a letter to Mr. Kain of Northwest Civil Design and Drafting stating that it is acceptable to do drafting for a professional engineer, but if he is practicing engineering, he is exempt from the licensing requirement only if he is an employee or subordinate of an Idaho license holder. Cite Idaho Code 54-1201 on the use of title or description. The Board licenses individuals as professional engineers especially qualified in civil engineering, and those persons are authorized to do engineering design. In our opinion, your use of the title “Northwest Civil Design and Drafting” implies to the public that you are licensed to practice engineering. Use of the name “Northwest Design and Drafting” would not cause concern. The Board requests that you discontinue using of the current name or the Board will consider seeking an injunction or prosecution. Motion passed unanimously.

17. David Short submitted questions to the Board relating to R/W plans signature and seal. The Board discussed Mr. Short’s questions and came to the conclusion that there was too little information provided to answer the questions thoroughly.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize the Chair to sign a letter to Mr. Short inviting him to the April meeting to explain the process and the use of R/W Plans, their development in relation to engineering design and the practice of professional land surveying. Motion passed unanimously.

18. The Board received a notice from Mr. Bryon Lewis regarding the abilities of MPW Engineering.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize the Chair to sign a letter to Mr. Lewis stating that the State of Idaho has developed criteria for acceptable fire

protection plans. This company would be expected to comply with the requirements of that criteria. If you have specific information about incompetent practice in the State of Idaho we would appreciate the details. Motion passed unanimously.

19. Mr. Young received an inquiry relating to electronic plat submittals.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Ancell to authorize the Chair to sign a letter to Mr. John Root stating that digital signature or “informational copy” procedures in statute can be followed. Alternatively, one may ask for written request from public official, then place statement of intent as to restricted use i.e. “For GIS Purposes Only” and not intended to be a final work product. Motion passed unanimously.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

3. The subcommittee appointed to work with the Board of Architectural Examiners to clarify the definitions of engineering and architecture reported their progress to the Board. The subcommittee held a meeting and progress has been made in language changes for the rules.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Ancell to endorse the concept of continuing in this direction and charge Mr. McClure and Mr. Young with better defining “R” building occupancy requirements and draft specific strike-and-underscore amendments to Idaho Code to allow incidental practice of engineering by architects and incidental practice of architecture by engineers. The board directed the subcommittee to report their progress at the next meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

VI. CONSIDERATION OF DISCIPLINARY MATTERS

FY05.23 Soderling, Alan R., P.E. violations of the rules of professional responsibility. Soderling and J-U-B appealed the District Court ruling to the Idaho Supreme Court. Mr. Erickson refiled this complaint with the Board office based on the decision of the District Court.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for in Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results - Mr. McClure, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Ancell, yes and Mr. Young, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize the Chair to sign an ORDER extending time for this docket as prepared by Richards Law Office. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Howe to dismiss this docket as unfounded. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. McClure to approve the minutes of the November 15-16, 2007 meeting as distributed. Motion passed unanimously.

3. Approval of minutes of the January 29, 2008 telephone conference as distributed.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. McClure to approve the minutes of the January 29, 2008 telephone conference call as distributed. Motion passed with Mr. Milligan abstained.

II. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA

1. ELSSES provided a summary of the October 2007 exam activities to the Board.
2. Mr. Szatkowski was nominated by the Board for appointment as an Associate Member of NCEES.
3. The Nevada State Board adopted a policy on reciprocity with Canadian license holders.
4. Jerry Carter provided an update regarding the CPEES processing.
5. NCEES released its Annual Report.

Moved by Mr. Ancell, seconded by Mr. McClure to note the items on the Consent Agenda with no further action. Motion passed unanimously.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Review Strategic Plan Objectives. The experience review will be discussed at the April meeting. Staff is directed to notify engineers and land surveyors of meetings in their area and invite them to attend.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to approve the revisions to the Strategic Plan. Motion passed unanimously.

4. A subcommittee consisting of Mr. McClure and Mr. Young reported on their progress exploring alternatives to the current language of the previous directive provided to Jerry Hume on the exercise of professional judgment by Building Officials. The subcommittee explained that this issue can be worked out through the subcommittee working with the Board of Architectural Examiners.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Young to disband this subcommittee in favor of continuing the subcommittee which is working with the architects. Motion passed unanimously.

- 6 Jerry Flatz of the Local Highway Technical Assistance Council has been preparing a yearly update to the Board concerning the certification of technicians to collect field data for speed studies.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. McClure to ask that Mr. Flatz provide the report in time for April meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

1. Reports by Board Members and Staff of activities since the last Board meeting.

Mr. Milligan attended the CBT Task Force meeting in Phoenix, AZ; participated in a follow-up telephone conference call relating to the CBT Task Force; attended a 3 day Civil PE Exam Committee meeting in Clemson, SC; attended a 2 day EPE Committee Meeting and may be appointed Vice Chair of that Committee for the next 2 years.

Mr. Howe received numerous calls and emails regarding Board matters; participated in the NCEES Calculator Selection Committee; attended the ISPLS local chapter meetings in December, January and February and attended a 3 day EPS Committee meeting in Clemson, SC.

Mr. Ancell attended the ISPE Southwest Chapter's Engineer's Week Banquet and presented certificates to newly licensed engineers.

Mr. McClure met with the subcommittee of architects and engineers on practice overlaps.

Mr. Young met with the subcommittee of architects and engineers on practice overlaps and followed up with analysis of what other states are doing in that regard.

Mr. Curtis made a presentation to Boise State University civil engineering students; made a presentation to the ISPE Northern Chapter on Continuing Professional Development; chaired the NCEES CBT Task Force meeting in Phoenix, AZ; attended the PNWER Legislative reception; attended the Board of Geologists meeting; attended the University of Idaho PE review course opening session; met with the subcommittee of architects and engineers on practice overlaps; attended the Idaho Association of Counties legislative reception and attended the Board of Architectural Examiners meeting to discuss overlap issues.

3. Staff requested that the April Board meeting dates (April 17-19, 2008) be changed as these dates conflict with the APEGGA Annual Conference. In a similar matter, Mr. Ancell requested that the June Board meeting dates (June 19-21, 2008) be changed due to a conflict. The Board rescheduled the April Board meeting to April 10-12, 2008 and the June meeting to June 12-14, 2008.
4. Rex Hansen, President of ACEC-Idaho, submitted some concerns to the Board relating to Performance Based Design Build.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize the Chair to sign a letter to Mr. Hansen inviting him to attend the April meeting to discuss this matter. Motion passed unanimously.

7. Dave Whitman announced his candidacy for President-Elect of NCEES. Would the Idaho Board be willing to support his candidacy?

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. McClure to authorize the Chair to sign a letter to the Wyoming Board indicating that the Idaho Board believes that Mr. Whitman has done a commendable job as Western Zone Vice President, but without knowing his goals as NCEES President-Elect, and without knowing if there are any other candidates, the Idaho Board reserves support at this time. Motion passed unanimously.

10. The North Idaho Building Department Organization would like a Board member to attend their monthly meeting.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Ancell to authorize Mr. Szatkowski and Mr. Young to attend the March 19th meeting to make a presentation. Mr. Szatkowski will remain in contact with the group on an ongoing basis and perhaps attend meetings at a later date. Motion passed unanimously.

12. Mr. Curtis requested authorization to attend the Professional Engineers of Ontario Engineering and Public Policy Conference on May 9, 2008 as a speaker.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to authorize Mr. Curtis to attend the May 9, 2008 meeting with expenses to be paid by the Professional Engineers of Ontario. Motion passed unanimously.

13. A proposed amendment to the NCEES Constitution and Bylaws and a proposed merger of the NCEES Constitution and Bylaws was submitted for the Board's review. The Board noted the information and directed staff to include this information on the Board Retreat agenda.

14. Is the 4-year Land Surveying degree program offered at Great Basin College in Nevada an approved 4-year surveying program? The Board reviewed the program, course descriptions, and staff credentials.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize staff to respond to Mr. Martin's questions relating to experience. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize the Chair to write to Mr. Martin and notify him that the Great Basin Program is an approved surveying program and will satisfy the Idaho Code Section 54-1212 (after July 1, 2010) requirement for a four year degree. Motion passed unanimously.
