Minutes of Meeting

The Board of Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors held a regular meeting on June 11-14, 2008 at the Hilton Homewood Suites, 7899 Spectrum Way, Boise, Idaho, to conduct Board business. The meeting convened at 8:49 a.m. on Wednesday, June 11, 2008 with the following Board members present: John W. Howe, William J. Ancell, Gary Young, James H. Milligan, and Scott McClure. Also present was David L. Curtis, Executive Director, Jim Szatkowski, Deputy Director, Mike Kane, Board Attorney, and Jennifer Rowe, Administrative Assistant.

**VI. DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS**

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Ancell to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for in Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to exit executive session. Motion passed unanimously.

FY08.27 Aach, Roy Lee, disciplinary action taken in Oklahoma.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to deny renewal of license at any time in the future based on a violation of 10.01.02.007.04. Motion passed unanimously.

FY08.29 Boling, Robert, disciplinary action taken in Oklahoma

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to revoke the license of Robert Boling for violation of 10.01.02.007.04. Motion passed unanimously.

The meeting was recessed at 9:12 a.m. and reconvened at 10:51 a.m.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for in Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to exit executive session. Motion passed unanimously.

FY08.14 Millar, John Wayne, failure to complete CPD units.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. McClure to suspend Mr. Millar's license for one year; issue a \$2,000 administrative penalty payable to the Board within 60 days; require Mr. Millar to complete 6 credits for land surveying coursework as described in

10.01.01.019.01(c), and complete a 2 credit approved ethics course. All coursework must be completed within one year. Failure to comply with any condition of this motion will result in license revocation. Motion passed unanimously.

FY08.09      Jordan, Frederick E., failure to complete CPD units.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to suspend Mr. Jordan's license for one year; issue a \$2,000 administrative penalty payable to the Board within 60 days; require Mr. Jordan to complete 6 credits for land surveying coursework as described in 10.01.01.019.01(c), and complete a 2 credit approved ethics course. All coursework must be completed within one year. Failure to comply with any condition of this motion will result in license revocation. Motion passed unanimously.

FY08.08      Hosac, Steven W., failure to complete CPD units.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Milligan to continue the scheduled Administrative Hearing to September 4, 2008 at 8:00 a.m. The 6 month time limit will be extended by the Board on behalf of Mr. Hosac's request. Motion passed unanimously.

### **III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

2. The subcommittee appointed to work with the Board of Architectural Examiners to clarify the definitions of engineering and architecture reported their progress to the Board. The subcommittee has been working to better define "R" building occupancy requirements and drafting strike-and-underscore amendments to Idaho Code to allow incidental practice for architects and engineers.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to direct staff to submit a "Legislative Idea" to the Division of Financial Management, but recognize that the likelihood of progressing to actual legislation in the 2009 session is slim. Motion passed unanimously.

5. A subcommittee of Mr. Howe, Mr. Young and Mr. Kane was formed to reevaluate the interpretation and interrelationships of Idaho Code Sections 54-1202(6), 54-1215, 55-1902(9) and 55-1904(2). The subcommittee presented a summary of their analysis to the Board. A draft reconsideration has been prepared for the Board's review.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to approve the restatement of opinion regarding requirement to seal, sign and date legal descriptions prepared without benefit of survey. Staff directed to include article in the NEWS BULLETIN. Motion passed unanimously.

9. Mr. Kane wrote a letter to Mr. Howe regarding monumenting and Records of Survey.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to direct staff to draft an article for the NEWS BULLETIN summarizing opinion. Article to be circulated to the Board members and Mr. Kane for review and editing prior to publication. Motion passed unanimously.

6. Jeff Hansen previously submitted questions relating to subdivision monuments and reviewers. The Board chose not to answer them as they were not specific. Mr. Hansen submitted additional information for the Board's review.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to have the Chair write to Mr. Hansen and indicate that Board considers his concerns significant and suggests that he request the Board conduct an inquiry into the matter along with providing the names of the licensees with whom he has an issue. Motion passed unanimously.

7. A subcommittee was formed to discuss sealing procedures at the Idaho Transportation Department on long term projects. The subcommittee drafted a starting point for discussion and possible legislation.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Ancell to authorize staff to develop additional changes relating to changes in the licensee in responsible charge to suggested legislation with input from Mr. Young and bring a draft to the September Board meeting for review. Motion passed unanimously.

8. Mr. McClure was charged with providing an article for the NEWS BULLETIN on using a screening committee to review complaints before they go to hearing. Mr. Curtis received information from the Accountancy Board on their disciplinary processes. The Board noted the information.

#### **IV. NEW BUSINESS**

5. How does the Board want to handle the case of a licensee who has allowed their license to lapse for 5 months or more (renewal fee has doubled) with respect to a special audit of their CPD records?

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize an audit of CPD compliance for any licensee who is subject to CPD requirements and who renews 3 or more months after expiration. Motion passed unanimously.

6. ACEC-Idaho invited the Board to make a presentation at their annual conference in Donnelly, Idaho August 7-9, 2008.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to authorize Mr. Milligan and Mr. Curtis to attend the ACEC-Idaho meeting at the Board's expense. Motion passed unanimously.

David Short and Tim Haener joined the meeting.

11. David Short wanted to know if there was a grace period with the implementation of House Bill 380?

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to notify Mr. Short that the intent of existing language is the same as the language incorporated in House Bill 380, and there is no grace period for compliance except the time that elapses between the signature by the Governor and the effective date of July 1, 2008. Motion passed unanimously.

David Bennion, Jerry Petersen and Tim Haener joined the meeting.

4. The subcommittee directed to work with ACEC-Idaho to assess the recent Geologist's legislation reported on their progress and Mr. Petersen summarized their meeting with the Board of Geology. The Board noted the information.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to ask Mr. Peterson and Mr. Haener to submit correspondence to the Board relating to additional issues of geologist stamping materials reports and lagoon leakage testing. Motion passed unanimously.

12. Tim Haener requested that the Board provide an opinion on whether the new rules proposed by DEQ involve engineering.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize the Chair to write to Mr. Haener and state that the Board is of the opinion that the specific areas listed; wells, springs, infiltration galleries, and well construction might be considered to fall into the "gray area" of overlap between engineers and geologists. For some geologists who have obtained master's degrees in groundwater, these topics are covered in their education. At the University of Idaho, the engineers often take these courses in the Geology Department rather than in the Civil Engineering department, but they are not usually undergraduate courses. Design of pumping and piping and other facilities for collection and transmission of groundwater sources are clearly engineering design, not geology. The Board has concerns about the section of the rule which allows Professional Geologist's to sign "Preliminary Engineering Reports" and request that the terminology be changed to something such as "Preliminary Report" or otherwise delete the term "engineering" when it is related to a report which is sealed by a Professional Geologist. Staff directed to send a copy to DEQ. Motion passed unanimously.

Tim Haener and Jerry Petersen left the meeting.

13. U.S. Submarine Engineering LLC requested approval from the Board to use their business name in Idaho.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize the Chair to write a letter to U.S. Submarine Engineering, LLC stating that their brochures indicate that they are practicing or offering to practice engineering for the public of Idaho and the law requires that the business obtain a Certificate of Authorization and that there be an Idaho licensed

professional engineer in responsible charge of the engineering activities of the business entity. Staff directed to send a copy of the letter to the Board Attorney and the Washington Board with a copy of the brochure. Motion passed unanimously.

14. 4 Front Engineered Solutions requested permission to use their business name in Idaho although they do not perform engineering.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to authorize the Chair to write to 4 Front Engineered Solutions and deny their request for permission to use the name with the word "engineered" in it. Motion passed unanimously.

## **V. CONSIDERATION OF APPLICATIONS**

### **NON-STANDARD – CERTIFICATE OF AUTHORIZATION**

Clarence Simpson Engineers, Inc. Mr. Simpson met with the Board to discuss the application for Certificate of Authorization and the company's background.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. McClure to approve the Certificate of Authorization for Clarence Simpson Engineers, Inc. Motion passed unanimously.

## **IV. NEW BUSINESS**

18. While the Board was meeting in April, an anonymous letter from a professional land surveyor was received at the office. The letter expressed concern over the activities of another professional land surveyor and asked the Board to look into the matter. The Board directed staff to review the surveys which accompanied the letter and report to the Board. Mr. Young recused himself due to a potential conflict of interest.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Ancell to authorize staff to conduct a preliminary investigation into the matter. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Young recused.

19. Mike Kane gave the Board a presentation on the legal and ethical obligations of a Board Member.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to authorize the Chair to write to ISPLS, ACEC-Idaho and ISPE to notify them of the new changes to the lobbying law regarding "relationships" as well as long-standing requirements for influencing laws and rules. Mr. Kane was directed to discuss conflict of interest, open meetings and lobbying at the September meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

21. We recently received some of the April 2008 exam results and there are 2 individuals that have failed the exam for a 2<sup>nd</sup> time. , Due to timing, what is the procedure for handling individuals and which law should apply to them in light of the passage of HB 380?

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to allow those who failed the second time but request assignment to the 3<sup>rd</sup> administration of the exam prior to July 1, 2008 be considered under 54-1214 in effect until June 30, 2008. Any requests for assignment to 3<sup>rd</sup> administration postmarked after June 30, 2008 will be considered under 54-1214 in effect July 1, 2008. In the event of a subsequent failure they will be considered under 54-1214 in effect July 1, 2008. Motion passed with Mr. McClure voting against the motion.

22. Engineered Bracing Company LLC requested permission to use the name in Idaho without the issuance of a Certificate of Authorization. A pamphlet explaining their system was available for review at the meeting.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize the Chair to write to Engineered Bracing Company, LLC and notify them that the Board denied their request to use the word "Engineered" in their business name. Motion passed unanimously.

25. Would the Board consider requesting a law change to allow applicants to pay their exam fees directly to ELSSES?

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to authorize staff to submit a legislative idea which would change our law to allow exam applicants to pay their exam fees directly to ELSSES. Staff directed to perform a study to determine anticipated loss of revenue as well as reduction in expenditure and any foreseeable impact on individual applicants. Staff also directed to develop draft strike-and-underscore amendment for Board consideration. Motion passed with Mr. McClure abstained.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. McClure to close this docket. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. McClure to approve the Stipulation and Consent Order and authorize the chair to sign the document. Motion passed unanimously.

FY08.06 Dawson, Robert John, failure to complete CPD units. Mr. Dawson let his license lapse, then brought it current, but staff failed to require that he make up deficient CPD's. Mr. Dawson submitted his CPD information and he has met the requirement.

FY08.11 Kinney, John, failure to complete CPD units. Mr. Kinney submitted a signed Consent Agreement in January and it was accepted by the Board at the February meeting. In his cover letter, he requested a reduction in the penalty amount. This docket has not been closed.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to deny Mr. Kinney's request for a reduction in the penalty amount. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Milligan to reconsider the previous motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to deny Mr. Kinney's request for a reduction in penalty amount. A review of his log and documentation indicates that better records could and should be kept for future audit compliance and only PLS related CPD is allowed. This docket is closed but notify Mr. Kinney that he may be audited in the future. Motion passed unanimously.

FY08.21 ABC Drafting & Design Services, unlicensed practice. The Board directed Counsel to send a letter to ABC Drafting requesting an explanation of the business relationship with their partner.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize Mr. Kane to send a draft complaint and injunction to ABC Drafting and Design Services and notify them of the Board's intent to proceed with legal action if they don't change the web site and if they continue to offer engineering services without a Certificate of Authorization through an "engineering partner". Motion passed unanimously.

FY08.22 Killingsworth, Leslie, actions taken by OR and WA Boards. Staff filed a complaint in this matter and a hearing was scheduled for June 11, 2008.

Mr. Killingsworth's attorney filed a Notice of Appearance. A Stipulation Agreement has been signed.

Moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Young to accept the signed Stipulation and Consent Agreement and authorize the Chair's signature on the document. Staff to send a letter to Mr. Killingsworth directing him to return his wall certificate. Motion passed unanimously.


