

**BOARD OF PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS
AND PROFESSIONAL LAND SURVEYORS**

Minutes of Meeting

The Board of Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors held a regular meeting on February 26-28, 2009 at the Hilton Homewood Suites, 7957 Spectrum Way, Boise, Idaho, to conduct Board business. The meeting convened at 8:00 a.m. on Thursday, February 26, 2009 with the following Board members present: John W. Howe, William J. Ancell, Gary Young, James H. Milligan, and David Bennion. Also present was David L. Curtis, Executive Director, Jim Szatkowski, Deputy Director, Mike Kane, Board Attorney, and Jennifer Rowe, Administrative Assistant.

I. READING OF MINUTES

1. Approval of the minutes of the November 20-22, 2008 Board meeting as distributed.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to approve the minutes of the November 20-22, 2008 Board meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

2. Approval of the minutes of the February 12, 2009 teleconference as distributed.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to approve the minutes of the February 12, 2009 teleconference meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

2. Mr. Howe discussed Right-of-Way acquisition surveys and filing practices. At the last meeting, the Board suggested that ACEC-Idaho surveyor parties meet with ITD officials with a representative from the Board to discuss this matter. Mr. Howe reported that there is great variability of how different ITD districts deal with this issue. ITD stated that they will consider the input provided by the subcommittee. The Board noted the information.

1. The Board reviewed the Strategic Plan and the progress that has been made on the Goals and Objectives.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to add Goal 2, Objective B to the Strategic Plan which would include the development of a Professional Engineer and a Professional Land Surveyor Q & A document to be added to the website. This document is to be updated at least twice a year and will be completed by July 31, 2009. Motion passed unanimously.

3. A subcommittee of Mr. Young, Mr. Ancell, Mr. Curtis and Mr. Kane was formed to discuss sealing procedures for long term projects. The subcommittee drafted additional language for 54-1223 for the Board's review.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to approve the additional language for 54-1223 as amended and include the language in the next NEWS BULLETIN. Motion passed unanimously.

4. Mike Kane will not present information on conflict of interest, open meetings and lobbying, and asks that the Board postpone this discussion until a later meeting.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to postpone this item until a future meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

5. A subcommittee of Mr. Milligan, Mr. Young and Mr. Bennion was appointed to meet with members of the Board of Professional Geologists to discuss the DEQ rule which allows a Professional Geologist to seal lagoon testing documents. Jim Szatkowski met with the Board of Professional Geologists and they approved a subcommittee which will include members of their Board. A meeting of the subcommittee was held on December 2, 2008. The members of the subcommittee reported to the Board that they met with members from the Board of Professional Geologists and their discussions are ongoing. The Board directed staff to arrange for another meeting of the subcommittee to discuss this matter further.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to continue this matter. Motion passed unanimously.

7. Attorney James Gillespie submitted a response to the Board's FINAL ORDER in the matter of Carl Porter's application for the Principles and Practice of Surveying examination.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize the Chair to sign a letter to Mr. Gillespie notifying him that the amount of original fee will be applied to the cost of exam at the time taken and the applicant will be required to make up any difference in cost. Staff directed to have Mike Kane review the letter before mailing. Motion passed unanimously.

8. Mr. Howe requested that the Board discuss a question posed by a license holder relating to Surveying of Rights-of-Way. Staff directed to search for background of any previous Board decisions and legislative history relating to Highway Right-of-Way plats.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to continue this matter pending a discussion with ISPLS representatives. Motion passed unanimously.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

7. IDABO representative Eric Makrush met with the Board on February 26, 2009 at 9:00 a.m. to discuss upcoming legislation and codes that could impact design professionals. Mr. Makrush, Legislative Analyst for IDABO, made a presentation on proposed legislation relating to the adoption of building codes by the Idaho Building Code Board and local jurisdictions. Mr. Makrush asked the Board to consider supporting the legislation. Concerns were expressed regarding the use of the term “registered” in 39-4106 rather than “licensed” and clarification of the terminology relating to negotiated rule making.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to approve Board support for the legislation with clarification of the two issues mentioned above and authorize the Chair to sign a letter of support. Motion passed unanimously.

2. JLR, The Engineering Solutions Company requested authorization to use the assumed business name “SimuTech Group” in Idaho. They do not intend to offer engineering services in this state.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Bennion to authorize the Chair to write to JLR, The Engineering Group and notify them that they may use the assumed business name, but they may not offer engineering services on a consulting basis to the public as defined in Idaho Code Section 54-1202(11) without receiving a Certificate of Authorization and having an Idaho licensed Professional Engineer in responsible charge of the engineering activities of the business entity. The use of the word “engineer” in the letterhead implies that the entity is offering engineering services. Further, if they do offer “technical consulting using computer simulations,” the Board would consider that the offering of engineering services and would require a Certificate of Authorization and licensure of a Professional Engineer in Idaho. Motion passed unanimously.

4. Oldcastle Windows, Inc. requested authorization to use the name Oldcastle Glass Engineered Products, Inc. in Idaho. They do not intend to offer engineering services in this state.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize the Chair to send a letter to Oldcastle Windows, Inc. denying their request because they are implying that the entity is offering engineering through the use of the word “engineer” in their requested assumed business name. In addition, they indicate that they are doing engineering analysis on custom installations. They indicate that they have Professional Engineers on staff; therefore the Board suggests that they get a Professional Engineer licensed and get a Certificate of Authorization. Motion passed unanimously.

8. Bruce Anderson, PLS requested that the Board review his questions about surveyors and business entity responsibility.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize the Chair to write to Mr. Anderson and inform him that the Board does not have the authority to establish civil liability or liability of successor holders of Certificates of Authorization. If Mr. Anderson means “accountability” or “responsibility” rather than “liability”, then the individual license holder remains accountable and responsible for his work. Motion passed unanimously.

9. Jerry Carter expressed concerns that the new seal being used by the Association of Energy Engineers may cause some confusion for the general public. The Board noted the information.

12. Bob Ankersmit submitted an email he received relating to calculating the weight of a beam. He would like the Board’s guidance on this issue.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize a Preliminary Investigation in this matter and authorize staff to retain technical expert assistance as needed. Motion passed unanimously.

13. Staff discussed a follow up to a previous complaint.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to authorize the Chair to write to the Central District Health Department and indicate that the situation appears to be one where an engineer is making a site specific adaptation of a pre-engineered product, pre-approved by DEQ, using siting and design criteria provided by the District Health Department. While it may not fit exactly under the definition of a “standard design plan” and the requirements of Idaho Code Section 54-1223(5), the Board is of the opinion that the Professional Engineer has not taken responsibility for work in violation of the law. Motion passed unanimously.

16. The Board reviewed Senate Bill No. 1103 relating to contracts for Design-Build Highway Projects.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Ancell to support the insertion of the ACEC-Idaho language in (14) of 40-904. The Chair will sign a letter to Chuck Winder and Senator McGee. Staff directed to review letter with ACEC-Idaho and Mike Kane prior to mailing. Motion passed unanimously.

17. Dennis S. Nelson was the subject of disciplinary action in Wisconsin.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Young that the Board not take any action on this matter. Motion passed unanimously.

VI. DISCIPLINARY MATTERS

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Ancell, yes, and Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Young, yes; Mr. Bennion, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

FY05.23 Soderling, Alan R., P.E. violations of the rules of professional responsibility. Soderling and J-U-B appealed the District Court ruling to the Idaho Supreme Court. Mr. Erickson re-filed an amended complaint with the Board office and the Board extended the 6 month time frame in order to allow the Supreme Court decision to be heard. Mr. Kane updated the Board on the proceedings before the Supreme Court. The Board noted the information.

FY07.09 Dreyer, Robert P., violations of ROPR. Mr. Dreyer was given until December 15, 2008 to meet the remaining conditions of the Stipulation and Consent Agreement. Mr. Dreyer submitted CP&Fs and an amended survey for review.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Ancell, yes, and Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Young, yes; Mr. Bennion, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize the Chair to write a letter to Mr. Dreyer notifying him of the remaining deficiencies and directing him to correct these deficiencies and resubmit his work to the Board. The Board directs Mr. Dreyer to provide an explanation of why the title block of the survey changed. Motion passed unanimously.

FY07.16 Bybee, Scott, unlicensed practice of land surveying. Mr. Bybee was given until February 1, 2009 to complete the remaining conditions of the Stipulation and Consent Agreement. He submitted evidence of having completed the required ethics course.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to close this docket. Motion passed unanimously.

FY08.08 Hosac, Steven W., failure to complete CPD units. A Final Order was prepared and signed but the docket was not closed.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to close this docket. Motion passed unanimously.

FY08.21 ABC Drafting & Design Services, unlicensed practice. Counsel was directed to send a follow up letter and injunction if necessary. Mr. Kane provided a response for the Board.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to close this docket. Motion passed unanimously.

FY08.33 Droulard, Joel, violations of ROPR. A response was received from Mr. Deveny regarding the Board's decision in this matter. The Board noted the information.

FY09.09 Ruen, Darius, incompetence. A preliminary investigation was completed.

Mr. John Ringert, PE, who conducted the investigation under contract, joined the meeting to discuss the preliminary investigation with the Board.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to discuss disciplinary matters as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Ancell, yes, and Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Young, yes; Mr. Bennion, yes.

The Board exited executive session.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Bennion to authorize staff to negotiate a Stipulation and Consent Order with Mr. Ruen regarding the sealing and signing issue as required in Idaho Code Section 54-1215(3)(b). Motion passed with Mr. Howe and Mr. Milligan recused.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

21. Alan Soderling posed a question to the Board relating to whether or not traffic studies are the practice of engineering. The Board requested that Mr. Ringert join them for this discussion.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Bennion to authorize the Chair to write to Mr. Soderling and inform him that the Board is of the opinion that traffic studies "that include level of service calculations and analysis, opinions on the impact of these calculations and recommendations on traffic improvements" constitutes the practice of engineering as defined in Idaho Code Section 54-1202(8) and must be sealed, signed and dated as required in Idaho Code Section 54-1215(3)(b). Similarly, letters in which a licensee expresses a professional opinion would be considered a "report" in Idaho Code Section 54-1215(3)(b) and must be sealed, signed and dated. Motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Ringert left the meeting.

VI. DISCIPLINARY MATTERS

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Young to table this item to allow staff time to gather information on possible code violations. Motion passed unanimously.

At the September meeting the Board reviewed an application from an individual who sought assignment to the SE II exam so he could get a license indicating that he was a PE “especially qualified” in structural engineering. The individual was originally licensed in Idaho by comity, “especially qualified” in civil engineering, even though he had taken the SE I exam for his initial license in another jurisdiction, a practice not allowed in Idaho. In the past, as in this case, if an applicant had taken the SE I exam for initial licensure in another jurisdiction, they were issued a PE license “especially qualified” in civil, and if they wanted a license that indicated they were a PE “especially qualified” in structural, they would have to take and pass a “base discipline” exam (usually civil) and the SE I & II exam. If an individual applies by comity and has taken the SE I & II but not a “base” discipline, how should his license be issued?

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to adopt a policy stating that individuals applying for licensure in structural by examination must first take and pass a “base” discipline, followed by an additional 2 years of experience in structural engineering, followed by passage of 16 hours of SE exam. For comity applicants, if they have passed the SE I and SE II, they can be licensed as a Professional Engineer especially qualified in civil engineering, but in order to be licensed as a Professional Engineer especially qualified in structural engineering they must have passed a base discipline as well as SEI and SEII. However, if a comity applicant for Professional Engineer especially qualified in SE has been licensed for 8 years in another jurisdiction, the Board can waive the requirement of passage of the base discipline exam. Motion passed unanimously.

5. A proposed amendment to the NCEES Bylaws was received.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to note the information and close the item. Motion passed unanimously.

6. The Oklahoma Board will no longer use AACRAO evaluations due to problems they have experienced. The Board noted the information.
