AND PROFESSIONAL LAND SURVEYORS**

Minutes of Meeting

The Board of Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors held a regular meeting on June 11, 12 & 13, 2009 at the Coeur d'Alene Inn, 506 W. Appleway, Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, to conduct Board business. The meeting convened at 8:00 a.m. on Thursday, June 11, 2009 with the following Board members present: William J. Ancell, Gary Young, James H. Milligan, John Howe and David Bennion. Also present was David L. Curtis, Executive Director, Jim Szatkowski, Deputy Director and Jennifer Rowe, Administrative Assistant.

I. READING OF MINUTES

1. Approval of minutes of the April 10-12, 2009 Board meeting as distributed.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Howe to approve the minutes of the April 10-12, 2009 meeting as distributed. Motion passed unanimously.

2. Approval of minutes of the May 5, 2009 teleconference meeting as distributed.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Howe to approve the minutes of the May 5, 2009 meeting as distributed. Motion passed unanimously.

II. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA

1. The following items have been continued at previous meetings and staff is unaware of any activity relating to these matters:

2. The West Virginia Board nominated Leonard "Joe" Timms as the NE Zone candidate for NCEES President Elect.
3. CPEES will not evaluate distance education programs.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Howe to note the items on the Consent Agenda with no further action. Motion passed unanimously.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Review Strategic Plan Objectives. The Board discussed the FAQ on the website and changed the "PE Q & A" to "General Q & A". Mr. Bennion suggested that staff add dates on the Strategic Plan to indicate when an item was changed.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to direct staff to update the Strategic Plan to reflect that change in Goal 2, Objective B. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to direct staff to adopt the procedure of adding dates on any amendments to the Strategic Plan beginning July 2010. Motion passed unanimously.

3. The subcommittee consisting of Dave Bennion, Gary Young, and Jim Szatkowski are working with the Board of Architectural Examiners to clarify the definitions of engineering and architecture. The subcommittee members were directed to continue contact with the subcommittee and stakeholders. Mr. Szatkowski was in contact with the Utah Board regarding recent changes that were made in their jurisdiction. The Board noted the progress of the subcommittee.
4. The Board directed staff to draft an issue paper addressing qualifications of PE members of Board including discipline, geography, practice area, etc. Staff was also directed to draft a paper relating to the separation of the current Board into independent PE and LS Boards. Staff drafted a paper combining both topics. The Board discussed amendments such as striking geographic consideration, adding additional items to the pros/cons table and adding a 5th column to the pros/cons table to indicate a descriptor number for each row and then create a descriptive narrative for each item.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Howe to remove the references to geographic considerations. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Bennion to approve amended document and direct staff to change title to "Desirable Non-Statutory Criteria for Board Member Nomination. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Bennion to approve and publish the paper as amended. Staff directed to send copy to ISPE, ACEC, ISPLS, provide a link on the

website and include paper in next NEWS BULLETIN. Motion passed with Mr. Howe voting against the motion.

5. John Howe reported to the Board on the NSPS Registration Board Forum meeting he attended in Salt Lake City. At the meeting, they discussed CBT possibilities, investigative procedures, statutory authority of PLS's, and jurisdictions requiring 1 year of field experience before taking FS exam. The Board noted the information.
6. A subcommittee of Mr. Milligan, Mr. Young and Mr. Bennion was appointed to meet with members of the Board of Professional Geologists to discuss the DEQ rule which allows a Professional Geologist to seal lagoon testing documents. ACEC-Idaho was contacted and informed that the Board of Professional Geologists is reluctant to suggest that the rules be amended to disallow PG's seal lagoon testing documents. A letter was received from the Geologist's Board in which the Geologists stated that the PG's are just as qualified as the PE's to perform this work.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to close this matter. Motion passed unanimously.

7. Tim Haener submitted suggested changes to the draft amendments for the 2010 legislative session regarding transfer of responsible charge.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to revisit this item with Mr. Kane. Motion passed unanimously.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

1. Reports by Board Members and Staff of activities since the April Board meeting. All Board Members, Mr. Curtis and Mr. Szatkowski attended the NCEES Western Zone Meeting where Mr. Milligan co-chaired the International Mobility Forum, Mr. Szatkowski accepted a reappointment to the Law Enforcement Committee and Mr. Howe was reappointed to the Surveying Committee. Mr. Howe reported that he worked with Mr. Young reviewing surveying code for purpose of proposing possible legislative changes for discussion at the Board Retreat. In addition, Mr. Howe met with Gary Briant to discuss Right-Of-Way issues. Mr. Milligan attended a PE Electrical Exam Cut Score Panel Meeting in Clemson, SC May 9-10, 2009; participated in a teleconference with the PE Electrical Exam Committee on May 12, 2009 and met with Dr. Hathaway relating to disciplinary action in Hayden Lake. Mr. Curtis made a presentation at an ISPE meeting that was broadcast statewide in cooperation with ITD, and hosted a self-governing agencies lunch at the Board office.
2. John Howe received a question from Mr. Thompson about the CPD equivalent for the CFed program. Would this program count for CPD and how much? The

Oregon Institute of Technology is currently reviewing this program for college credits.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Howe to postpone this item until the Board receives feedback from the Oregon Institute of Technology as to how they will handle this program. Motion passed unanimously.

Mike Kane joined the meeting.

14. Negotiated Rules. Mr. Kane made a presentation on rule changes. He met previously with a representative of ACEC-Idaho and J-U-B on these changes and a Hearing on the Proposed Rules has been scheduled.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Young to not include the statute of limitations statement in the Administrative Rules but work with stakeholders to develop possible statutory language to address the statute of limitations in relation to the Board's ability to prosecute disciplinary matters. Motion passed unanimously.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

2. Mike Kane updated the Board on the legislative session. Mr. Kane discussed recent changes to the open meetings law and how those changes may affect the Board. Mr. Kane also reviewed the lobbying laws and what constitutes a conflict of interest.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

11. An amended contract between the Board and ELSEES was drafted to include changes to the exam procedures. Mr. Kane reviewed the contract and recommended accepting it.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to approve the contract as proposed. Motion passed unanimously.

10. An individual submitted questions relating to designing a fire sprinkler/suppression system and whether that is the practice of engineering.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to direct staff to draft a letter to this individual for the Chair's signature answering her specific questions and stating that this is the practice of engineering. Motion passed unanimously.

VI. CONSIDERATION OF DISCIPLINARY MATTERS

- FY05.23 Soderling, Alan R., P.E. violations of the rules of professional responsibility. The Board issued an ORDER on May 5, 2009. Parties had 14 days in which to file a motion for reconsideration and neither did so.

Parties had 28 days, or until June 2, 2009, in which to appeal the ORDER and no appeal was filed.

The Board voted by roll call vote to enter into executive session to consider record that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Ancell, yes; Mr. Young, yes; Mr. Bennion, yes and Mr. Howe recused.

The Board exited the executive session.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to close this docket. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe recused.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

7. Tim Haener submitted suggested changes to the draft amendments for the 2010 legislative session regarding transfer of responsible charge. The Board discussed the suggested changes with Mr. Kane.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Milligan to reject the suggestions and proceed with amendment as originally published in NEWS BULLETIN. The Board directed staff to draft a letter for the Chair's signature to Mr. Haener notifying him of their decision. Motion passed unanimously.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

3. John Howe requested that the Board review the following question: When performing a right-of-way acquisition survey for the Idaho Transportation Department which requires the subdivision of a section, is it necessary to monument a lost Public Land Survey Corner, the position of which is calculated and used in the survey?

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize the Chair to sign a letter to the inquirer to inform him that the Corner Record law requires monumentation of a lost corner and filing of a corner record. The letter will cite appropriate sections of Idaho Code 55-1604, 55-1608, 55-1904(4). Provide draft of letter to Mr. Bennion, Mr. Howe and Mr. Young for review prior to signature. The Board will also approach ITD personnel to discuss this situation. Motion passed unanimously.

5. Mr. Howe requested that the Board discuss a question posed by Aaron Rush involving ROS and monumentation requirements. Mr. Howe also discussed Title 40, proposed amendments, and what surveyors should be doing prior to new legislation.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Young to authorize the Chair to sign a letter to Mr. Rush, after review by Mr. Young and Mr. Howe, and let him know that a committee of ISPLS members with cooperation by Board members is looking into this matter.

Legislation is likely necessary to clarify the situation and specific draft amendments will be circulated in the near future. The Board authorizes the Chair to write to Kim Leavitt and ask him to reactivate the subcommittee. Motion passed unanimously.

6. The Board set meeting dates for calendar year 2010.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Bennion to accept proposed dates for meetings for the 2010 calendar year including February 4-6, March 11-13, June 3-5, August 6-7, September 9-11 and November 18-20. Motion passed unanimously.

During the course of investigating another matter, it came to light that Mr. Engleson did engineering work for the Sourdough Point Owners Association and he is not licensed in Idaho. In addition, Ms. Gilman may have not properly sealed a document in that matter. A Preliminary Investigation was conducted by staff.

State Fire Marshall Mark Larson informed staff that he anticipates that the Governor will soon issue an Executive Order forming the Task Force. Mr. Larson contacted staff on June 8, 2009 and asked for the name of a potential representative on the Task Force and Mr. Curtis suggested Mr. Szatkowski.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize Mr. Szatkowski to be designated as the Board representative to the Task Force. Motion passed unanimously.

8. Staff presented the Board with an Expense Reimbursement Summary for the Executive Director from March 28, 2009 to May 22, 2009 for review. A copy of all receipts and paperwork was included at the Board's request. Staff requested that the Board decide what documentation they require for this review.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Howe to approve the reimbursement and require only a summary in the future rather than copy of each receipt. Motion passed unanimously.

9. ACEC-Idaho scheduled their Annual Conference July 30th – August 1st in Sun Valley. Board directed staff to send a schedule of meetings to ACEC-Idaho and reschedule as necessary to avoid conflict.
12. Howard C. Harclerode is running for NCEES Treasurer.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Young to note the information. Motion passed unanimously.

13. Staff provided an update on the Board's financial status as of May 31, 2009. The Board noted the information.

Additional information recently became available and staff was reluctant to proceed with negotiation of a Stipulation and Consent Order. Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Milligan to authorize the Chair to write to Mr. Stauffer and Ms. Steciak to point out intent of CPD rules to be for work outside normal work assignment, Board views "normal" work assignment of faculty as teaching and research and maintaining up-to-date course materials, and point out that faculty and all others can earn PDH's by publishing, teaching workshops, obtaining patents, etc. Send a copy of this letter to the Deans of all Colleges of Engineering in Idaho and the College of Technology at Idaho State University for the Geomatics program. Motion passed unanimously.
