Minutes of Meeting

The Board of Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors held a regular meeting on August 30-31, 2010 at the Board Office, 1510 E. Watertower St., Ste. 110, Meridian, Idaho to conduct Board business. The meeting convened at 8:20 a.m. on Monday, August 30, 2010 with the following Board members present: James H. Milligan, David Bennion, John Howe and George Wagner. Mr. Milligan chaired the meeting in Mr. Young's absence. Also present was David L. Curtis, Executive Director, Jim Szatkowski, Deputy Director; Jennifer Rowe, Administrative Assistant and Mike Kane, Board Attorney.

i. AGENDA REVIEW - Are there any new agenda items?

The Board reminded staff to develop an amendment to 50-1332 for the Board's review.

Mr. Szatkowski received an additional letter relating to Docket #FY10.23. This letter will be discussed in conjunction with that agenda item.

V. CONSIDERATION OF APPLICATIONS

NON-STANDARD COMITY

Mr. Fein joined the meeting via a conference call to discuss his application for licensure as a professional land surveyor.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Howe to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Bennion, yes; Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes and Mr. Wagner, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Bennion to continue the application of Scott Fein for licensure as a professional land surveyor on the basis of his passage of examinations in Oregon pending additional documentation. Motion passed unanimously.

I. READING OF MINUTES

1. Review Minutes of the June 3-5, 2010 meeting.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Bennion to approve the minutes of the June 3-5, 2010 meeting as distributed. Motion passed unanimously.

2. Review Minutes of the August 5-6, 2010 Board Retreat in Riggins.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Wagner to approve the minutes of the August 5-6, 2010 meeting in Riggins as distributed. Motion passed unanimously.

II. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA

1. The following items have been continued at previous meetings and staff is unaware of any activity relating to these matters:
 - a. FY08.23a: Munio, Albert, unlicensed practice
 - FY08.23b: Bessaw, John W., P.E., violations of statutes and Rules of Professional Responsibility
 - FY08.23c: Washington Group International, violations of statutes and Rules of Professional Responsibility. An ORDER extending the time until 6 months after the end of litigation has been signed.
 - b. FY09.25 Tikker, Robert, rules of professional responsibility. This matter is pending completion of civil litigation. This is not a formal complaint so no ORDER has been issued to extend the time.
 - c. FY10.09 Lund, Michael, Rules of Professional Responsibility. A preliminary investigation has been authorized. On advice of Counsel, the investigation has been halted pending the outcome of an investigation by the Office of the Attorney General. An ORDER extending the time until 6 months after the end of litigation has been signed.
 - d. FY10.18 Forsgren Associates, Inc. Rules of Professional Responsibility. This matter was continued pending the outcome of civil litigation.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Bennion to remove FY09.25 from the Consent Agenda to be discussed under Disciplinary Actions. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Wagner to note the remaining items on the Consent Agenda with no further action. Motion passed unanimously.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

3. Staff conducted a Proposed Rule Making Hearing on August 12, 2010 at the Len B. Jordan Building in Boise. At the last Board meeting, the Board withheld evaluation of the possible amendment relating to discovery of error if the professional was working for an attorney and asked Mr. Kane to be prepared to discuss that matter. Mr. Kane discussed his findings relating to discovery of error. He recommended removing language from the Pending Rule 10.01.02.005.04 so as to avoid a conflict later.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Bennion to strike underlined portions of Pending Rule 10.01.02.005.04 from the Proposed Rule Making. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Howe to form a subcommittee consisting of Mr. Wagner and Mr. Bennion in conjunction with ACEC-Idaho to discuss this issue and find a solution. Staff directed to facilitate meeting. Counsel to prepare a brief position paper of his opinion. Motion passed unanimously.

5. Staff is required to submit final legislation to DFM on September 17, 2010. Are there any final changes needed to the “Big Picture” surveying legislation? Mr. Kane suggested that the definition of a “Reference Point” be changed to substitute the phrase “and where the” for the phrase “but whose” in every instance that it occurs.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Howe to approve amendment as suggested by Mr. Kane. Motion passed unanimously.

6. Jim Baker, (ISPE and URS-Washington Division), submitted a question regarding the QBS law and its applications regarding pricing requests from government entities. Mr. Kane researched this matter further and will present his findings to the Board.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Bennion to authorize the Chair to write to Mr. Baker and inform him that the Board concluded that this request is for services included in the definition of the practice of engineering. In addition, IDAPA 10.01.02.009.05 prohibits individuals who are solicited by a public entity to submit information that constitutes a bid for services requested. There is no evidence in this situation to indicate that the public entity ranked qualified persons or firms pursuant to Idaho Code §67-2320(2) or (3) or that it followed the statutory requirements of that code section. However, the Board has only authority or jurisdiction over licensed professional engineers. Based upon the circumstances as described, a response to the “Request for Scope of Work” to include a cost estimate would constitute a bid for services requested and a violation of IDAPA 10.01.02.009.05. You are referred to Idaho Code Section 67-2320 which states, in pertinent part, “(i) In fulfilling the requirements of subsections (2)(a) through (2)(g) of this section, a public agency or political subdivision may request information concerning a person’s or firm’s rates, overhead and multipliers, if any, however such information shall not be used by the public agency or political subdivision for the purpose of ranking in order of preference as required in subsection (2)(c) of this section.” Motion passed unanimously.

Chair directed subcommittee of Mr. Bennion and Mr. Wagner to address the concerns discussed above along with the previous assignment. ISPLS will be invited to participate along with ACEC-Idaho in these discussions. Mr. Howe will contact ISPLS regarding this issue.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

5. Pre-Engineered Construction Inc. requested that the Board allow them the use of their business name in Idaho. They do not have engineers on staff.

Move by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Howe to deny the request to use "Pre-Engineered Construction Inc." as a business name in Idaho. Motion passed unanimously.

7. Staff would like to discuss the implementation of online applications for the FE and FS candidates.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Wagner to authorize staff to create online applications for the Engineer Intern and the Surveyor Intern. Motion passed unanimously.

11. If an applicant has a pending disciplinary action in another jurisdiction, does the Board want to review the application prior to an outcome on the matter?

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Howe to direct staff to work with Mr. Kane to come up with proposed legislation to allow the Board to postpone consideration of an application if the applicant has pending disciplinary charges against them in another jurisdiction until such time as formal action has been taken by the other Board. Motion passed with Mr. Wagner voting against the motion.

Mr. Young joined the meeting.

12. NCEES now administers the FE and the PE examinations in a number of foreign countries. We have been contacted by several individuals who have successfully completed both the exams and they are interested in getting a license in Idaho. They are not unlike the "California Specials" who have passed the NCEES exams but have not been successful on the additional examinations that California requires for licensure, thus they do not possess a license anywhere. Traditionally the Board has considered issuing a license to a "California Special" by examination only if they have become a resident of Idaho. Staff would like the Board to consider whether they want that policy to extend to individuals who have taken and passed the FE and the PE exam in another country.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Wagner authorize staff and Counsel to look further into the practice of considering residency and the location where the examinations were originally taken when the applicant is not currently licensed in another jurisdiction. Consider the differences between US citizens versus non-US citizens and foreign educated versus domestically educated individuals. Motion passed unanimously.

VI. CONSIDERATION OF DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS

FY08.41 Root, John. Mr. Curtis has not reviewed surveys submitted by Mr. Root as required in the Stipulation and Consent Order. Mr. Young recused himself in this matter.

FY10.21 Formusa, Brian R., failure to sign, stamp report. Staff was authorized to conduct a Preliminary Investigation in this matter.

After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize staff to negotiate a Stipulation and Consent Order with Mr. Formusa. Motion passed with Mr. Bennion voting against the motion.

FY10.23 Terragraphics Environmental Engineering, Inc. A preliminary investigation was completed for this docket. Mr. Howe is recused in this matter.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Wagner to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Bennion, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes and Mr. Wagner, yes, and Mr. Young, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Milligan to dismiss the matter as unfounded. Motion withdrawn.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Milligan to dismiss this matter as it relates to Terragraphics as unfounded, authorize the Chair to write to DEQ noting that both our missions include protecting life, health, and property, thanking them for the pilot project which appears to meet the spirit and letter of the recent (2008) amendments to Idaho Code Section 55-1613 and requesting that the Board be kept apprised of their progress in converting the pilot project to standard operating procedure which will protect valuable public property, the monuments at the property corners. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe recused.

FY10.24 Trane US, unlicensed – No COA - in conjunction with FY10.25. Mr. Naylor wrote a letter to Trane regarding their unlicensed practice.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Howe to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Bennion, yes; Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes and Mr. Wagner, yes, and Mr. Young, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

FY10.28 Allen, Brian J., Surveying Practices Standard of Care. Mr. Bennett completed a preliminary investigation in this matter. A formal complaint will be prepared and a hearing will be scheduled.

Moved by Mr. Milligan, seconded by Mr. Howe to continue this matter. Motion passed unanimously.

FY10.29 Watts, Warren, Standard of Care & FY10.30 Mullinix, Daryl, Standard of Care. Staff was authorized to conduct a preliminary investigation in this matter.

4. A subcommittee of Mr. Howe and Mr Young reported to the Board on their review and evaluation of the new questions from the Item Writing Workshop.

Mr. Howe reviewed and commented on the test items on the first five subject matters and submitted this information to staff. Staff directed to obtain a reference for the key on each item and logic for the distracters. Staff to submit Mr. Howe's comments to Mr. Young for his review.

7. Scott Stanfield submitted a question about the use of the PE stamp. The Board responded to Mr. Stanfield previously. Does the Board want to send ITD a copy of the response?

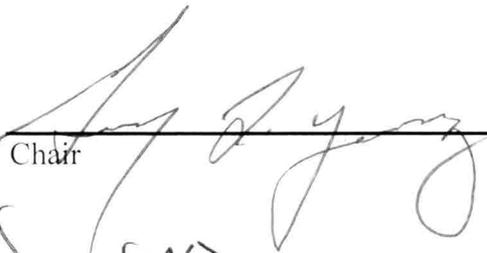
