Minutes of Meeting

The Board of Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors held a regular meeting on November 7, 8 & 9, 2011 at the Board Office located at 1510 E. Watertower St., Ste. 110, Meridian, Idaho 83642 to conduct Board business. The meeting convened at 8:00 a.m. on Monday, November 7, 2011 with the following Board members present: James H. Milligan, David Bennion, George Wagner, John Elle and John Howe. Also present was David L. Curtis, Executive Director, Jim Szatkowski, Deputy Director, and Jennifer Rowe, Administrative Assistant.

**i. AGENDA REVIEW**

Are there any new agenda items? There were no new items to add to the agenda.

**IV. NEW BUSINESS**

Amy Moll of Boise State University, Dean George Imel and Subbraham Naidu of Idaho State University, Dean Larry Stauffer of the University of Idaho, Associate Dean Alan Dutson of BYU-Idaho, and Dan Lawrence of Northwest Nazarene University joined the meeting.

13. The Board met with Deans and Representatives from the Idaho Colleges of Engineering. Each made a separate report to the Board on the status of their respective programs. Some of the items discussed included: enrollment, ABET accreditation status, curricula, and the progress of faculty licensure.

The Deans and University representatives left the meeting.

**I. READING OF MINUTES**

1. Review minutes of the August 31 & September 1, 2011 meeting.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Elle to approve the minutes from the August 31 & September 1, 2011 meeting as distributed. Motion passed unanimously.

**II. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA**

1. The following items have been continued at previous meetings and the staff is unaware of any activity relating to these matters:
  - a. FY10.09 Lund, Michael, Rules of Professional Responsibility. A preliminary investigation was authorized. On advice of Counsel, the investigation was halted pending the outcome of an investigation by the Office of the Attorney General. An ORDER

extending the time until 6 months after the end of litigation was signed.

- b. FY10.18 Forsgren Associates, Inc. Rules of Professional Responsibility. This matter was continued pending the outcome of civil litigation.
- c. FY11.09 Holladay Engineering, Conflict of interest, Standard of Care relating to Emmett Waste Water Treatment plant. This matter was continued pending outcome of litigation.
- d. FY11.11 Erickson, Chad, Standard of Care. Mr. & Mrs. Badertscher submitted a complaint regarding the survey work of Chad R. Erickson. The work included locating a previous corner which was apparently incorrectly and previously located by Carl Edwards and others. The location of this corner affects the Badertscher's property line as well as several others. Mr. Erickson submitted a detailed response to the complaint. Staff notified the Badertschers that the complaint lacks the requirements for a formal complaint and will be considered a request for inquiry. Staff found that the matter is already under litigation and trial was postponed until January.

- 2. We recently received comments about the Board's service from a license holder.
- 3. A response was received from Senators Risch and Crapo relating to the GPS technology matter.
- 4. Glen Aalbers, PLS submitted his comments on the Board's process of requiring CPD for renewal.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Elle to note the items on the Consent Agenda with no further action. Motion passed unanimously.

### **III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

- 1. Review Strategic Plan Objectives. The Board reviewed the Strategic Plan and noted that there were no changes requested.
- 2. Subcommittee Updates
  - a. Item Writing (John Howe and John Elle): The Board directed Staff to conduct an Item Writing Workshop in conjunction with the ISPLS Annual Meeting Wednesday, March 28 through Friday, March 30, 2012. The Board is currently scheduled to meet Monday, March 26 through Wednesday March 28 in conjunction with that meeting in Twin Falls. Staff would like the Board to consider rescheduling its meeting in order to

allow the Item Writing Workshop to occur Monday, March 26 and Tuesday, March 27 and still allow staff to participate in the Board meeting. The last time we conducted an Item Writing Workshop in conjunction with the ISPLS Annual Meeting the Board meeting was scheduled for Thursday through Saturday of the meeting. This item was tabled until a schedule can be obtained for the ISPLS Annual Meeting,

- b. Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plans (David Bennion, Jim Milligan and Jim Szatkowski): The subcommittee was directed to work with the ITD Rapid Action Team to find a resolution to this matter. The Chairman sent a memo to Fran Hood at ITD relating to this issue.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Wagner to close this matter and discontinue the subcommittee. Motion passed unanimously.

- b. Idaho Code 33-356 allows that School Districts may seek to qualify for a reduction in building replacement value calculations for qualified, newly constructed public school buildings... and requires that these buildings be designed with an Integrated Design process and have Fundamental Building Commissioning performed. The code also directs the Division of Building Safety to assist schools in accessing the technical and educational support needed to implement the processes of integrated design and fundamental commissioning. They've promulgated IDAPA Rule 07.03.01.038 to provide this information. It states that DBS maintains a list of qualified Commissioning Agents who are certified by the Building Commissioning Association (BCA). The BCA's Certification Program does not require the individual to be a PE, but PE's are able to become certified. The Board previously addressed this commissioning issue in response to an inquiry by DPW in 2001. Mr. Szatkowski reviewed the website and it seems that the offending material has been removed. Mr. Wagner and Mr. Bennion will liaise with ACEC-Idaho regarding possible conflict of statutes on building commissioning and engineering practice.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Bennion to continue this matter and contact ACEC-Idaho to discuss. Motion passed unanimously.

- d. Structural Engineers Subcommittee (David Bennion and John Elle): The subcommittee will explore what type of projects should be restricted to structural engineers. SEAI has been contacted and will provide feedback.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Bennion that, if SEAI responds affirmatively, authorize the subcommittee to explore the need for a discipline-specific SE license, then a coalition of the Board, ACEC-Idaho, Board of Architectural Examiners, etc. should be formed to put this effort forward. Motion passed unanimously.

- e. International Mobility Subcommittee (George Wagner and David Bennion): The subcommittee will study (1) NCEES administering and selling exams internationally the result of which may be outsourcing of engineering jobs. (2) Foreign engineering students gain their education in the US and then cannot stay. (3) Foreign engineering students gain their education outside the US but come to the US to practice. (4) Foreign engineering students gain their education outside the US, pass the NCEES exams, but do not reside in the US but request licensure in the US. The subcommittee will work toward an action item that can be presented at the Western Zone meeting in 2012.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Howe to continue this subcommittee. Motion passed unanimously.

- f. LCSC Course Content Subcommittee (John Elle and John Howe): The subcommittee is directed to obtain course content information from the faculty of LCSC as it relates to an applicant. An evaluation of the courses was received from John Dunn.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Wagner to authorize the Chair to write to applicant and notify him of deficiencies. Applicant to send proof of completion to Board for further review. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Elle to authorize the Chair to write to LCSC expressing the Board's concerns regarding course content and descriptions. The Board has expectations that the program will more closely align with the 27 prescriptive credits outlined in the Board's Administrative Rules. Motion passed unanimously.

5. Mr. Szatkowski provided the Board with an update from the ABET/EAC visitation he attended at Idaho State University.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Wagner to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Elle, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Bennion, yes; Mr. Howe, yes and Mr. Wagner, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Wagner to direct staff to place the status of Idaho State University engineering program accreditation on the agenda for the September 2012 meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize Chair to invite representatives from the Geomatics program at Idaho State University and the Lewis and Clark State College Engineering Technology program to make a presentation at March 2012 meeting in conjunction with ISPLS Annual Meeting.

6. ISPE sent a letter of support for the proposed Rule Amendments.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Bennion to authorize the Chair to write to ISPE and thank them for their support. Motion passed unanimously.

#### **IV. NEW BUSINESS**

1. Reports by Board Members and Staff of activities since the September Board meeting. Mr. Milligan participated in a Civil PE exam committee meeting in Clemson, SC; attended the APEGBC annual meeting in Kelowna, British Columbia and attended the EPE Committee meeting in Atlanta, GA. Mr. Elle fielded numerous phone calls relating to surveying matters and took the Idaho State Specific exam in order to review the questions for necessary changes. Mr. Bennion attended an SEAI Board meeting. Mr. Howe attended the ISPLS Northern Section meeting and took the Idaho State Specific exam in order to review the questions for necessary changes. Mr. Curtis attended the ACEC-Idaho September meeting; participated in a meeting of the NCEES Public Outreach and Communications Task Force in Washington, DC; attended the APEGBC annual meeting in Kelowna, British Columbia; participated in a teleconference relating to the Western Zone Budget; observed NCEES exams administered in Edmonton and Calgary, Canada, and provided a Senior Seminar for ECE students at the University of Idaho in Moscow. Mr. Szatkowski presented CPD training in a teleconference with ISPE and attended the Idaho State University EAC/ABET visitation as the State Board Observer.
2. Staff presented an Expense Reimbursement Summary for the Executive Director from August 16, 2011 through October 31, 2011 for the Board's review.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Bennion to approve the expense reimbursement summary as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

3. Staff provided an update on the Board's financial status as of October 31, 2011. The Board noted the information.
4. ACEC-Idaho wrote a letter in support of adoption of the NCEES Masters or Equivalent model in Idaho.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Wagner to authorize the Chair to write to ACEC-Idaho and thank them for their input and write to ISPE and ask them if they would review the issue and give us their thoughts. Motion passed unanimously.

#### **III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

2. Subcommittee Updates

- a. Item Writing (John Howe and John Elle): The Board directed Staff to conduct an Item Writing Workshop in conjunction with the ISPLS Annual Meeting Wednesday, March 28 through Friday, March 30, 2012. The Board is currently scheduled to meet Monday, March 26 through Wednesday March 28 in conjunction with that meeting in Twin Falls. Staff would like the Board to consider rescheduling its meeting in order to allow the Item Writing Workshop to occur Monday, March 26 and Tuesday, March 27 and still allow staff to participate in the Board meeting. The last time we conducted an Item Writing Workshop in conjunction with the ISPLS Annual Meeting the Board meeting was scheduled for Thursday through Saturday of the meeting. ISPLS Board of Governors meeting will be on Tuesday of that week.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Elle to direct staff to schedule the Item Writing Workshop beginning Sunday, March 25, 2012 at 1:00 p.m. and continuing through Monday, March 26, 2012. The Board will sponsor lunch for the participants on Monday. 12 PDH's will be awarded for those participating in both the Sunday and Monday sessions and 8 PDH's will be awarded for those participating in the Monday session only. Those participating in Monday only must have previously received the training. The Board meeting will be rescheduled for Tuesday, March 27, 2012 through Wednesday, March 28, 2012. Motion passed unanimously.

The Chairman assigned Mr. Elle to the subcommittee.

#### **IV. NEW BUSINESS**

6. Staff drafted a NEWS BULLETIN for the Board's review.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Bennion to approve the NEWS BULLETIN with addition of the actions taken at this meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

8. Mr. Hathaway submitted an inquiry about paved over monuments.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Elle to authorize the Chair to write to Mr. Hathaway and inform him that paving over monuments with an overlay or chip seal does not disturb them in the same way as "disturb" is used in IC 55-1613, nor is it "defaced," "injured," or "removed" as used in IC 54-1234. Prior to a "rotomilling" operation or other construction, the monument should have been located by a PLS so it can be reestablished if it is "disturbed" as required under IC 55-1613. Motion passed unanimously.

9. Joe Canning, PE/LS would like the Board to be aware that June 20-22, 2012 will be the dates for the 2012 ISPE Annual Meeting at the Grove Hotel in Boise.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Elle to authorize the Board Chair to attend the ISPE Annual Meeting in June. Motion passed unanimously.

10. Bruce Butler, PE/LS would like to know if real estate school coursework counts for CPD.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize the Chair to write to Mr. Butler and let him know that the Board does not pre-approve any courses. If the courses meet the definition of an "activity" then one may claim it, but you need to be prepared to defend it in the event your CPD credits are audited. Motion passed unanimously.

12. The State of Washington brought to our attention the services of First American Title Insurance Company and their ExpressMap service.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Bennion to authorize the Chair to write to NSPS and express concern over the services offered. Motion passed with Mr. Wagner voting against the motion.

John Falk, PE joined the meeting.

15. John Falk wanted to bring some proposed legislation relating to dam safety to the Board's attention. The Board met with Mr. Falk and made suggestions for changes in the draft legislation.

John Falk, PE left the meeting.

14. NCEES has sent out the 2012 Call for Nominations.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Howe to recommend that the Idaho Board nominate James Milligan for the Distinguished Service Award with Special Commendation. Motion passed with Mr. Milligan abstained.

### **III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

4. Mr. Monlux was selected for a CPD audit. The Board requested additional information from Mr. Monlux at the last meeting. As of October 25, 2011 we have not received a response from Mr. Monlux.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Wagner to authorize the staff to negotiate a Stipulation and Consent Order for failure to comply with the CPD requirements. Motion passed unanimously.

### **IV. NEW BUSINESS**

7. An individual asked whether an engineer working for one firm can stamp engineering documents for another.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Howe to direct staff to have the minutes reflect that the Request for Inquiry was from an anonymous individual. Board policy is that it will investigate anonymous Requests for Inquiry or complaints if the public health, safety or welfare appears to be in jeopardy. It does not appear that is the case in this situation so the Board elects to not take action. Motion passed unanimously.

11. The Division of Building Safety submitted legislation relating to Construction Manager At-Risk authorized contracting.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Wagner to authorize the Chair to write to DBS Administrator Kelly Pearce and express the Board's concerns that the legislation submitted to us could result in a project delivery model that may not be in the best interest of the public. Our Board would be interested in participating in the development of legislation that might overcome our concerns. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Bennion to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Elle, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Bennion, yes; Mr. Howe, yes and Mr. Wagner, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Elle to approve and authorize the Chair to sign the Stipulation and Consent Orders for FY08.23b and FY08.23c and close these dockets. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Wagner recused.

FY10.28 Allen, Brian J., Surveying Practices Standard of Care. The Administrative Hearing on this matter is scheduled for March 5 & 6, 2012 at the Board office.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Elle to continue this docket. Motion passed unanimously.

FY12.05 Anderson, Greg, CPD deficiency. Staff negotiated a Stipulation and Consent Agreement for the Board's review.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Elle to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d).

Roll call vote results; Mr. Elle, yes; Mr. Wagner, yes; Mr. Bennion, yes; Mr. Howe, yes and Mr. Milligan, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Elle to accept the Stipulation and Consent Agreement, authorize Chair to sign, and close the docket. Motion passed unanimously.

Attorney Kane joined the meeting.

FY12.02 All Seasons Landscaping, unlicensed practice. The complainant responded to the Board's dismissal.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Wagner to authorize Attorney Kane to write to the complainant and inform him that the Board exercised its prosecutorial discretion, chose to dismiss the matter, and chose not to reopen it. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Howe to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Bennion, yes; Mr. Elle, yes and Mr. Wagner, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Elle to authorize staff to conduct a preliminary investigation into this matter. Motion passed unanimously.

### **III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

3. The Board asked Mr. Kane to research the term "resident" as it might apply to the Board requirement that a person be a resident or student at an Idaho University in order to be assigned to an examination.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Wagner to proceed with the bill in the legislature then develop a temporary rule after the legislature acts on the legislation. Motion passed unanimously.

5. A company inquired about whether or not they would need to file for a Certificate of Authorization to perform EPA Spill Prevention Control and Countermeasures plans (SPCC). The EPA requires a PE certification.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Wagner to authorize Attorney Kane to write to Gavilon and inform them that Idaho law requires that an Idaho PE be in responsible charge of the engineering work involved and that the business entity needs to have a Certificate of Authorization. Motion passed unanimously.

FY11.15 Smetana, John D., standard of care. Staff was authorized to conduct a preliminary investigation into this matter.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Howe to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Bennion, yes; Mr. Elle, yes and Mr. Wagner, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Bennion to authorize the Chair to write to complainant and inform him that the Board concluded that since Mr. Smetana was not retained to perform construction observation, he cannot be disciplined for showing on Record Drawings erroneous or incomplete information provided by others. The Board also recognizes that the Standard of Care at the time this work was performed was not as well defined as it is now. The Board voted to dismiss this matter as unfounded. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe recused.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Bennion to authorize the Chair to write to DEQ and expresse a concern that the potential public health issue brought about by the water and sewer lines in the same trench be brought to the attention of the appropriate authorities. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe recused.

FY11.19 APEX Manufacturing Solutions, LLC, unlicensed practice. The Board continued this matter at the June meeting. As of October 25, 2011 we have not received an application from APEX for a Certificate of Authorization.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Elle to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Elle, yes; Mr. Wagner, yes; Mr. Bennion, yes; Mr. Howe, yes and Mr. Milligan, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Elle to authorize Attorney Kane to write to APEX, thank them for their efforts to date to clear up the matter, and ask them to explain what "factory automation integration services" involves. Motion passed unanimously.

FY12.01 Burton, Thomas, Failure to follow a Board Order. Mr. Burton's license to practice as a professional land surveyor in Washington was revoked for failing to follow an ORDER of the Washington Board. Mr. Burton is a licensee in Idaho. Staff was authorized to negotiate a Stipulation and Consent Order.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Wagner to continue this docket. Motion passed unanimously.

FY12.03      Morey, Charles & Gilbert, Troy, Standard of Care. Staff completed a preliminary investigation into this matter.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Howe to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Bennion, yes; Mr. Elle, yes and Mr. Wagner, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize staff and prosecutor to conduct further investigation and clarify issues raised by the Board during Executive Session discussion, then bring recommendation back to Board at next meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

Roll call vote results; Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Bennion, yes; Mr. Elle, yes and Mr. Wagner, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Elle to authorize staff to negotiate a Stipulation and Consent Agreement in this matter. Motion died for lack of a second.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize staff and prosecutor to conduct further investigation and clarify issues raised by the Board during Executive Session discussion, then bring recommendation back to Board at next meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

FY12.04      ITD, Alleged Failure to Preserve Survey Monuments. Staff conducted a preliminary investigation into this matter.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Elle to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Elle, yes; Mr. Wagner, yes; Mr. Bennion, yes; Mr. Howe, yes and Mr. Milligan, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Elle to authorize the Chair to write to the participants and notify all of them that since the root of the matter has been corrected, the Board chose to close the matter as it now does not rise to a level justifying disciplinary action. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize the Chair to write to Tom Cole, with a copy to Frances Hood at ITD and inform them that the Board conducted an investigation and is happy to see by the Memo that they are addressing the issue, but want to be sure that "project area" as used in the Memo includes the area within the ROW as well as the area on or outside the ROW. Motion passed unanimously.

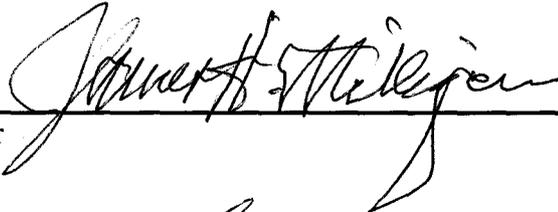
