Minutes of Meeting

The Board of Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors held a regular meeting on March 27 & 28, 2012 at the Canyon Crest Dining and Event Center, 330 Canyon Crest Dr., Twin Falls, ID 83301 to conduct Board business. The meeting convened at 8:00 a.m. on Tuesday, March 27, 2012 with the following Board members present: James H. Milligan, David Bennion, George Wagner, John Elle and John Howe. Also present was David L. Curtis, Executive Director, Jim Szatkowski, Deputy Director and Jennifer Rowe, Administrative Assistant.

i. AGENDA REVIEW

Are there any new agenda items? Staff requested the addition of a Stipulation and Consent Agreement for FY12.07. This item will be discussed under Disciplinary Actions FY12.07. Attorney Kane prepared a legal opinion on the use of the term "engineer" for the Board's review. This item will be discussed under Unfinished Business Item 5.

V. CONSIDERATION OF APPLICATIONS

NON-STANDARD – COMITY

Craig Marshall joined the meeting to discuss his application for Professional Engineer by comity.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Wagner to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Wagner, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Bennion, yes; and Mr. Elle, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session. The Chair postponed action on this application until such time as all applications are reviewed.

Mr. Marshall left the meeting.

I. READING OF MINUTES

1. Review Minutes of the February 13 & 14, 2012 Board meeting.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Elle to approve the minutes of the February 13 & 14, 2012 Board meeting as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

II. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA

1. The following items have been continued at previous meetings and staff is unaware of any activity relating to these matters:
 - a. FY11.09 Holladay Engineering, Conflict of interest, Standard of Care relating to Emmett Waste Water Treatment plant. Pending outcome of litigation.
 - b. FY11.11 Erickson, Chad, Standard of Care. Mr. & Mrs. Badertscher submitted a complaint regarding the survey work of Chad R. Erickson. The work included locating a previous corner which was apparently incorrectly and previously located by Carl Edwards and others. The location of this corner affects a Badertscher's property line as well as several others. Mr. Erickson submitted a detailed response to the complaint. Staff has notified the Badertschers that the complaint lacks the requirements for a formal complaint and will be considered a request for inquiry. Pending outcome of litigation.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Wagner to note the consent agenda with no further action.

Substitute Motion by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Howe to remove item 1(a) from Consent Agenda for discussion purposes. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Wagner to direct staff to look into the status of FY 11.09 to determine if litigation is still pending, and if it is not, proceed with the investigation. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Elle to note the remaining item on the Consent Agenda item with no further action. Motion passed unanimously.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Review Strategic Plan Objectives. Amend the deadline in Goal 3, Objective B to June 1, 2013. Amend Goal 5 and Benchmarks as it relates to Access Idaho.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Bennion to approve the changes made to the Strategic Plan at this meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

2. Subcommittee Updates

- a. Item Writing (Mr. Howe, Mr. Elle and Mr. Young): An Item Writing Workshop for the Idaho State Specific PLS exam was conducted on Sunday, March 25, 2012 and Monday, March 26, 2012. Mr. Curtis will

provide the Board with a review of the Workshop. Mr. Curtis reported on the results of the Item Writing Workshop. 110 items were written and need to be digitized by staff, reviewed by PLS members of the Board and submitted to the psychometricians for inclusion in the item bank. The Board noted the information.

- b. CM at Risk Subcommittee (Mr. Bennion and Mr. Wagner): The subcommittee will study the Construction-Manager-at-Risk issue. The subcommittee members had nothing new to report.
 - c. Structural Engineers Subcommittee (Mr. Bennion and Mr. Elle): The subcommittee will explore what type of projects should be restricted to structural engineers. Mr. Bennion spoke with Brian Gardner, President of SEAI, who expressed a desire to proceed with the study of this concept. Staff directed to procure laws and rules from other jurisdictions regarding their structural engineering requirements. Mr. Bennion to invite ACEC, ISPE, ASCE and SEAI to confer.
 - d. International Mobility Subcommittee (Mr. Wagner and Mr. Bennion): The subcommittee will study (1) NCEES administering and selling exams internationally the result of which may be outsourcing of engineering jobs. (2) Foreign engineering students gain their education in the US and then do not stay. (3) Foreign engineering students gain education outside the US but come to the US to practice. (4) Foreign engineering students gain their education outside the US, pass the NCEES exams, do not reside in the US but request licensure in the US. The subcommittee will work toward an action item that can be presented at the Western Zone meeting in 2012. The subcommittee had nothing to report. Mr. Wagner would like to rescope this issue to focus on Idaho procedures and will provide a report at the June Board meeting.
 - e. FE/FS Exam Expense Subcommittee (Mr. Wagner and Mr. Elle): The subcommittee will study ways and means by which the expense of the FE and FS exams could be offset once we move to computer based testing in January 2014. The subcommittee had nothing to report. Mr. Curtis will prepare an outline of possible courses of action.
4. The State of Washington brought to our attention the services of First American Title Insurance Company and their ExpressMap service. The Board sent a letter and a follow up letter to NSPS requesting any information they might have on the matter.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Howe to refer this matter to Attorney Kane for advice on the feasibility of pursuing this issue further. Motion passed unanimously.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

1. Reports by Board Members and Staff of activities since the February Board meeting. All Board Members and Mr. Curtis were present for the Board Hearing of Docket FY10.28. Mr. Bennion and Mr. Wagner attended the Engineer Week luncheon in Boise. Mr. Howe and Mr. Elle attended the Item Writing Workshop in Twin Falls. Mr. Milligan participated in an NCEES Exam Audit Committee meeting March 7-11, 2012 in Clemson, SC. Mr. Curtis made a presentation to the Boise State ME students and conducted the Item Writing Workshop.
2. Staff presented an Expense Reimbursement Summary for the Executive Director for the Board's review.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Wagner to approve the Expense Reimbursement Summary for the Executive Director as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

3. Staff provided an update on the Board's financial status as of February 29, 2012.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Elle to authorize the implementation of the 2% CEC to all staff members as early as possible. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Elle to note the financial information as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

5. The changes to the surveying laws that went into effect July 2011 may have changed the Surveying FAQ page. Staff requests guidance from the Board on which FAQ items should be added/deleted/modified. The Board Chair appointed Mr. Elle and Mr. Howe to address this issue.
8. An individual would like to know if the Board accepts the courses submitted as credits towards the additional college credits required under 54-1214(3).

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Wagner to accept all courses except *Intro to Engineering (EGR 307)*. Verify that *Engineering Math (EGR 220)* has calculus and differential equations background/prerequisites in order for it to be acceptable. A total of 12 semester credits must be completed. Motion passed unanimously.

10. Election of Board Officers.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Elle to nominate Mr. Bennion for Chairman. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Bennion abstained.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Wagner to nominate Mr. Howe for Vice Chairman and Mr. Wagner for Secretary. Motion passed unanimously.

The Board met with the ISPLS Board of Governors to discuss topics of mutual interest.

13. Staff drafted a NEWS BULLETIN for the Board's review.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Bennion to approve the NEWS BULLETIN as edited. Motion passed unanimously.

15. Due to a complication in the process of completing the online renewal system, staff requested Board authorization to hire an outside contractor to finish the project. A cost estimate is pending but our Operating Expense fund is in excellent shape for the remainder of the fiscal year so this would be the time to absorb any additional expense.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Bennion to authorize an additional \$7500 for this project. Motion passed unanimously.

9. Craig Reese did not complete his CPD and proposed a solution for the deficiency.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Elle to authorize the staff to negotiate a Stipulation and Consent Order for Mr. Reese's failure to comply with the Rules of Continuing Professional Development. Motion passed unanimously.

V. CONSIDERATION OF APPLICATIONS

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Wagner to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Wagner, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Bennion, yes; and Mr. Elle, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Elle to approve the application of Craig Marshall for licensure as a professional engineer especially qualified in civil engineering on the basis of comity with his license in Utah. Motion passed with Mr. Howe and Mr. Wagner voting against the motion.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Elle to deny the application of Tracy Brent Bono for licensure as a professional engineer especially qualified in civil engineering on the basis of comity with his license in Utah. Motion passed with Mr. Bennion voting against the motion.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Howe to continue the application of Jamal Abdullah Huwel for licensure as a professional engineer especially qualified in civil engineering on the basis of comity with his license in Texas pending receipt of additional information. Motion passed with Mr. Bennion voting against the motion.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Bennion to approve the application of David J. Leistiko for licensure as a professional engineer especially qualified in civil engineering on the basis of comity with his license in North Carolina. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Wagner to approve the application of Donath A. Picardo for licensure as a professional engineer especially qualified in structural engineering on the basis of comity with his license in Ohio and Illinois. Motion passed with Mr. Elle abstained.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Elle to deny the application of Paul Jestin Snarr for licensure as a professional engineer especially qualified in civil engineering on the basis of comity with his license in Utah. Motion passed unanimously.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

4. Raj Bajracharya and Mike Wheelock from Idaho State University and Steve Staab from Lewis-Clark State College met with the Board to discuss their respective college surveying programs.

V. CONSIDERATION OF APPLICATIONS

NON-STANDARD – SPECIALS

Aaron Bell joined the meeting to discuss his application for Professional Land Surveyor.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Elle to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Wagner, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Bennion, yes; and Mr. Elle, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize staff to work with Mr. Bell to better understand and document his experience that might substitute for the educational requirements. Motion passed unanimously.

III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

3. Staff was directed to outline a process where licensees are formally notified of their CPD deficiencies, given the opportunity to be heard or the opportunity to enter into a formal Stipulation and Consent Order.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Elle to authorize Attorney Kane to investigate the need to promulgate a rule requiring submittal of a CPD log with renewal. Motion passed unanimously.

5. A question was raised about the use of the term “engineer” in job titles at Idaho State University. Board authorized Attorney Kane to research any relevant statutes relating to this matter.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Wagner to authorize the Chair to write to Dr. Jacobson and inform him that so long as they are not using a title that implies “professional engineer” and are not offering services to the public, they may use a title that has the word “engineer” in it for internal identification purposes. However, if a person is practicing engineering as defined in Idaho Code, and is not otherwise exempt under Idaho Code, they must be licensed by the Idaho Board of Licensure of Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors or risk being found guilty of practicing engineering without a license, which is a criminal misdemeanor. The letter we received implies that these unlicensed persons are practicing engineering, and we share your concern about that practice unless they are exempt under some section of Idaho Code. We would welcome your additional input on this issue or your attendance at a future meeting of the Board to clarify if necessary. Motion passed unanimously.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

6. A Professional Engineer raised questions on a calculation cover sheet from Hoit Engineering.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Elle to authorize the Chair to write to Mr. Block and inform him that given that Mr. Hoit identified the scope of his services as “partial”, we do not have a concern with the cover sheet. There is nothing in Idaho Code or the Administrative Rules that require a single professional engineer provide services on the entire project. Motion passed unanimously.

11. Staff discussed CPD audits of Board members. What is the best way to handle the conflict of interest involved?

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Bennion to require each Board Member to submit to staff their PDH log and documentation annually and staff audit the same as they do for all licensees. Any Board member being audited will recuse him/her self from Board action on the matter. Motion passed unanimously.

12. Staff requested authorization to promulgate amendments to the Administrative Rules. Changes to the Rules of Procedure would be to define “resident” as used in the amendments to IC 54-1212 contained in House Bill No. 374. The Board needs to adopt these as “Temporary Rules” and concurrently publish them as Proposed Rules that would become permanent upon review of the legislature in 2013. Staff suggested changes to the Rules of Continuing Professional Development including removal of NCEES as the source of the Registered Continuing Education Provider program as they have discontinued their partnership with the American Council of Engineering Companies in that program; consider removing the requirement that CPD credits come from more

than one activity area; revise a newly inserted section that essentially exempts non-US resident licensees from the CPD requirement.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize staff to promulgate rules as modified in attachments. Motion passed unanimously.

14. Staff discussed Idaho Code Section 54-1221 with Board Counsel who suggested that it be amended. Specific strike-and-underscore changes have been provided for review.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Elle to authorize the staff to initiate the statute amendment process on this issue. Motion passed unanimously.

VI. CONSIDERATION OF DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS

- FY06.16 Vermeer, Louis, engineering practices. Mr. Vermeer submitted his comments to the Board's ruling in this matter and he requests that the Board reinstate his license.

Moved by Mr. Bennion, seconded by Mr. Howe to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Wagner, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Bennion, yes; and Mr. Elle, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Bennion to direct staff to change database to indicate that Mr. Vermeer surrendered his license. Authorize Chairman to send a letter to Mr. Vermeer notifying him of the action. Motion passed unanimously.

- FY10.09 Lund, Michael, Rules of Professional Responsibility. On advice of Counsel, this investigation was halted pending the outcome of an investigation by the Office of the Attorney General. An ORDER extending the time until 6 months after the end of litigation has been signed. A preliminary investigation was conducted. Staff was directed to work with Attorney Naylor on this docket as well as FY10.18 to evaluate the situation.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Howe to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). FY10.18 Forsgren Associates, Inc. Rules of Professional Responsibility. A preliminary investigation was conducted in this matter.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Bennion to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Wagner, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Bennion, yes; and Mr. Elle, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Wagner to dismiss this docket as unfounded. Motion passed unanimously.

FY10.22 Stearns, John, failure to complete CPD. Mr. Stearns has completed the CPD required and submitted the administrative penalty.

Roll call vote results; Mr. Wagner, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Bennion, yes; and Mr. Elle, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Bennion to reinstate Mr. Stearns PLS license and close this docket. Motion passed unanimously.

FY10.28 Allen, Brian J., Surveying Practices Standard of Care. An Administrative Hearing was conducted on this matter on March 5 & 6, 2012. The Board is scheduled to deliberate on the matter May 2 & 3, 2012. This matter is continued.

FY11.19 APEX Manufacturing Solutions, LLC, unlicensed practice. The Board continued this matter for more information on what "factory automation integration services" involves. The Board directed Attorney Kane and Mr. Szatkowski to meet with APEX, let them know that we view this as the practice of engineering and encourage them to get a Certificate of Authorization or face the prospect of litigation.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Howe to continue this docket. Motion passed unanimously.

FY12.06 Gay, Charles, Rules of Professional Responsibility. Staff conducted a preliminary investigation of this formal complaint concurrent with that of FY 12.03 as they relate to services performed by professional engineers on the same project. An ORDER extending the time for this docket was signed. A Stipulation and Consent Agreement was drafted for the Board's review.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Bennion to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Wagner, yes; Mr. Milligan, yes; Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Bennion, yes; and Mr. Elle, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

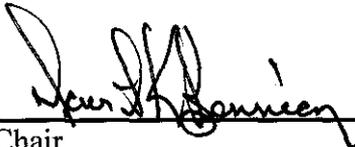

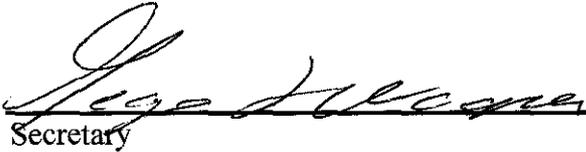
