Minutes of Meeting

The Board of Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors held a regular meeting on November 7 & 8, 2012 at the Board Office, 1510 E. Watertower, Ste. 110, Meridian, ID 83642 to conduct Board business. The meeting convened at 8:00 a.m. on Wednesday, November 7, 2012 with the following Board members present: David Bennion, John Howe, George Wagner and John Elle. Also present was David L. Curtis, Executive Director, Jim Szatkowski, Deputy Director and Jennifer Rowe, Administrative Assistant.

**IV. NEW BUSINESS**

4. The Board met with Deans and Representatives from the Idaho Colleges of Engineering. Each made a separate report to the Board on the status of their respective programs. Some of the items discussed included: enrollment, ABET accreditation status, curricula, and the progress of faculty licensure.

**i. AGENDA REVIEW**

Are there any new agenda items? Mr. Curtis requested that the Board review and discuss a draft NEWS BULLETIN. This item was added to the agenda as New Business #15. Mr. Howe received an email he wanted to discuss with the Board. This item was added to the agenda as New Business #16.

**I. READING OF MINUTES**

1. Review Minutes of the September 5 & 6, 2012 Board meeting.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Wagner to approve the minutes of the September 5 & 6, 2012 Board meeting as distributed. Motion passed with Mr. Murgel absent.

**II. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA**

1. The following items have been continued at previous meetings and staff is unaware of any activity relating to these matters:
  - a. FY11.11 Erickson, Chad, Standard of Care. Mr. & Mrs. Badertscher submitted a complaint regarding the survey work of Chad R. Erickson. The work included locating a previous corner which was apparently incorrectly and previously located by Carl Edwards and others. The location of this corner affects a Badertscher's property line as well as several others. Mr. Erickson submitted a detailed response to the complaint. Staff notified the Badertschers

that the complaint lacks the requirements for a formal complaint and will be considered a request for inquiry. Pending outcome of litigation.

  - h. FY13.02 Amy Woodruff, violations of the Rules of Professional Responsibility (ROPR). Pending outcome of litigation.
2. Mr. Flatz has submitted an update on the LHTAC speed limits and speed zones class.
  3. ISPLS voiced their support of the Legislative Ideas under consideration.
  4. Mr. Farrens resigned from Ada County.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Elle to note the items on the Consent Agenda with no further action. Motion passed with Mr. Murgel absent.

**III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

1. Review Strategic Plan Objectives.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Howe to note this item with no further action. Motion passed with Mr. Murgel absent.

## V. CONSIDERATION OF APPLICATIONS

Mr. Murgel joined the meeting.

### NON-STANDARD – COMITY

The Board met with Duke Bulanon to discuss his application for Professional Engineer by comity.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Elle to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Elle, yes; Mr. Wagner, yes; Mr. Murgel, yes and Mr. Bennion, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Wagner to waive the FE examination and assign Mr. Bulanon to the PE exam. Motion failed with Mr. Howe and Mr. Wagner voting in favor of the motion.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Murgel to direct staff to investigate the examination process in the Philippines and report back to the Board at the next meeting. Meanwhile, if Mr. Bulanon chooses to take the PE exam, he is assigned. Motion passed with Mr. Wagner voting against the motion.

## III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

2. Subcommittee Updates

- a. Item Writing (Mr. Howe, Mr. Elle and Mr. Young): The subcommittee is currently in the process of digitizing and reviewing the 110 items that were written during the last Item Writing Workshop. Approved items will then be sent to the psychometricians for inclusion in the item bank. The subcommittee continues to review items for inclusion in the item bank. The Board noted the information.
- b. CM at Risk Subcommittee (Mr. Bennion and Mr. Wagner): The subcommittee will study the Construction-Manager-at-Risk issue. Mr. Bennion contacted Patrick Grace, Deputy AG who reported that State of Idaho no longer wished to pursue CM-at-Risk type of contracting. The Chair dismissed the subcommittee.

- c. Structural Engineers Subcommittee (Mr. Bennion and Mr. Elle): The subcommittee will explore what type of projects should be restricted to structural engineers. Staff was directed to procure laws from other jurisdictions regarding structural engineering requirements. Mr. Bennion contacted several stakeholders and there will be a subcommittee meeting before the next Board meeting.
- e. FE/FS Exam Expense Subcommittee (Mr. Wagner and Mr. Elle): The subcommittee will study ways and means by which the expense of the FE and FS exams could be offset once we move to computer based testing in January 2014. The subcommittee contacted ISPE, ISPLS, ACEC-Idaho and the technical societies to see if they had any interest in taking up the banner on this matter to help students defray the increased cost of the FE and FS exams. ISPE has indicated an interest in promoting this issue. The Chair dismissed the Subcommittee.
- f. Surveying FAQ Page Subcommittee (Mr. Howe and Mr. Elle): The subcommittee will review recent changes to the surveying laws (effective July 2011) and assist staff with updating the Surveying FAQ web page. Mr. Howe and Mr. Elle are working with Mr. Szatkowski to keep the FAQ's current. Mr. Howe reported that he reviewed and suggested changes to the FAQ pages. Mr. Howe suggested we add the response to Gerald Briant to the FAQ.
- g. MOE for Engineers Subcommittee (Mr. Wagner and Mr. Murgel): The subcommittee will form a task force of interested and affected professional and technical societies to review potential legislation focused on MOE for engineers. Mr. Wagner and Mr. Murgel pursued the issue and see if a coalition of stakeholders (all disciplines and societies) can be developed. Mr. Wagner reported that he has a list of professional organizations that are stakeholders. Mr. Curtis conducted a survey of the NCEES Member Board Administrators regarding discipline versus generic licensing and whether there were variable requirements for licensure in different disciplines. The Board noted the information.
- h. Software Engineering Subcommittee: (Mr. Szatkowski and a Board Member): The subcommittee will study the issue of adding software engineering as a discipline. New Business #8 was discussed in conjunction with this item.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Murgel to notify NCEES that we will not make the Software Engineering PE exam available at this time but the Board may reconsider this decision in the future. Motion passed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Wagner to authorize the Chair to sign a letter to Mr. Paddock and inform him of the Board's decision. Motion passed unanimously.

3. Mr. Curtis prepared a draft job description/announcement with DHR for the Executive Director position.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Howe to authorize staff to have DHR post job announcement December 1, 2012 with receipt deadline of January 11, 2013. The Board directs staff to send announcement to NCEES, NSPE, ISPLS, NSPS, ISPE, ACEC-Idaho, ACEC National and publish it on our website. Staff directed to develop ranking criteria checklist using minimum qualifications from job announcement. Staff to query the Board Members for available dates for last week of February/first week of March. Motion passed unanimously.

The Board recessed for the evening at 5:30 p.m. The Board reconvened Thursday, November 8, 2012 at 8:05 a.m.

#### **IV. NEW BUSINESS**

1. Reports by Board Members and Staff of activities since the September Board meeting. Mr. Bennion attended the ACEC-Idaho annual meeting in McCall; attended the September ISPE Southwest Chapter meeting and attended the APEGBC annual meeting in Victoria, British Columbia. Mr. Elle worked on reviewing the PLS item bank and participated in MBA Committee meetings online. Mr. Curtis attended the September ACEC-Idaho monthly meeting; attended the ACEC-Idaho annual meeting in McCall; made a presentation on the Bachelors+30 at the September ISPE Southwest Chapter meeting; attended the ACEC-Idaho Trap and Skeet and proctored the NCEES October PE exam in Saudi Arabia. Mr. Szatkowski attended the ISPE Southwest Chapter meeting; attended the APEGBC annual meeting in Victoria, British Columbia and was a Board Observer for the BYU-Idaho ABET accreditation visit.

#### **III. UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

2. Subcommittee Updates
  - d. International Mobility Subcommittee (Mr. Wagner and Mr. Bennion): The subcommittee will study (1) NCEES administering and selling exams internationally the result of which may be outsourcing of engineering jobs. (2) Foreign engineering students gain their education in the US and then cannot stay. (3) Foreign engineering students gain their education outside the US but come to the US to practice. (4) Foreign engineering students gain their education outside the US, pass the NCEES exams, but do not

reside in the US but request licensure in the US. The subcommittee will focus on Idaho procedures. Attorney Kane reported his findings to the Board at the September meeting. Staff drafted possible amendments for consideration in the future and researched what all other US jurisdictions require in the way of US versus foreign experience.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Wagner to direct the subcommittee, staff and Board Counsel to further study the existing statutes and rules and see how they apply to consideration of applicants who have been educated and/or licensed in a foreign country and/or obtained their experience outside the United States. Motion passed unanimously. The Chairman removed himself from the Subcommittee and appointed Mr. Elle to replace him.

- i. Request for Inquiry vs. Formal Complaint Subcommittee: (Mr. Wagner and Mr. Howe): The subcommittee reviewed the Board's policy of allowing a Request for Inquiry in lieu of filing a Formal Complaint. Attorney Kane drafted a revised Complaint and Disciplinary guide for the Board's review. Mr. Howe reviewed Kane's draft and made a few revisions.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Murgel to adopt the complaint guidelines as presented by Attorney Kane and amended by Mr. Howe except for the "provoked" change. Motion passed unanimously.

- j. Principal Definition Subcommittee: (Mr. Wagner): The subcommittee will gather input from stakeholders regarding possible definitions for "principal" prior to rule promulgation. Meeting of stakeholders scheduled for 10:30 a.m., Monday, November 26<sup>th</sup>.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Elle to authorize Attorney Kane to further research Idaho Code requirements of conflict of interest of elected officials and develop suggested changes to the Rules of Professional Responsibility for consideration by the Subcommittee and stakeholders. Motion passed unanimously.

4. ACEC-Idaho requested that the Board discuss "Transportation Planning". There have been recent efforts and RFP's soliciting cost proposals for Transportation Planning that are of concern. The Board asked for additional information regarding previous RFP and changes to current RFP as well as Q and A from a pre-bid conference.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Howe to choose not to further investigate this matter as it appears to have been resolved. Motion passed unanimously.

5. Mr. Howe requested that the Board discuss the brokerage of surveying services. Title Companies are using a "survey broker" who may or may not be licensed in the state. The brokers advertise for bids from licensed surveyors. Mr. Howe is concerned that the brokers are offering surveying services when they are not licensed to do so. The Board noted the information.

#### **IV. NEW BUSINESS**

10. Moreno General Engineering Corp. requested that the Board allow them to use their business name in Idaho although they do not offer engineering services.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Murgel to authorize the Chair to sign a letter denying their request to use the name Moreno General Engineering Corp. in Idaho. Motion passed unanimously.

11. Northwest Nazarene University finalized their general engineering (electrical and mechanical) programs and requested that the Board review and approve their students for eligibility to take the FE as a student in the last two semesters of an approved academic program by the Board (Under Idaho Code 54-1212(3)a. vs. the (3)b. and IDAPA 10.01.01.017.02.b requirements pending their first ABET/EAC visit.)

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Elle to authorize Mr. Murgel and/or Mr. Milligan to review the programs and make a recommendation to the Board at the next meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

13. Pro Engineering and Manufacturing L.L.C. requested that the Board allow them to use their business name in Idaho.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Murgel to authorize the Chair to sign a letter approving under the concept of "grandfathering" but notify them that they are precluded from offering or practicing engineering. Motion passed with Mr. Wagner voting against the motion.

14. Bruce Anderson, PLS submitted questions for the Board's review.

Moved by Mr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Wagner to authorize the Chair to form a subcommittee of Mr. Howe and Mr. Elle to further study this matter and get advice from Attorney Kane. Motion passed unanimously.

#### **VI. CONSIDERATION OF DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS**

- FY10.09 Lund, Michael, Rules of Professional Responsibility. This matter was dismissed, then reconsidered. Attorney Naylor received a signed Stipulation and Consent Order for the Board's review. The Preliminary

Investigation is linked below and the Attorney General's investigative report is Attachment D to the Investigation. Under that attachment, Mr. Lund's letter to the Patrons of IBSD is attachment 1.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Elle to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Elle, yes; Mr. Wagner, yes; Mr. Murgel, yes and Mr. Bennion, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Wagner to authorize the Chair to sign the Stipulation and Consent Agreement and close this matter. Motion passed unanimously.

FY10.28 Allen, Brian J., Surveying Practices Standard of Care. A Petition for Judicial Review was filed relating to this matter. Attorney Kane will update the Board on the status of the appeal to the District Court.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Elle to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Elle, yes; Mr. Wagner, yes; Mr. Murgel, yes and Mr. Bennion, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

The Board noted the case schedule as described by Counsel.

FY13.05 Pampaian, Darrin, ROPR

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Wagner to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Elle, yes; Mr. Wagner, yes; Mr. Murgel, yes and Mr. Bennion, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Murgel to authorize the Chair to write to the Complainant and notify her that it appears that Mr. Pampaian was performing a review function as directed by his supervisors at DEQ that would not have to be performed by a licensed professional engineer. In any event, the Board does not find that the matters brought to our attention rise to a level justifying further action by the Board. To the extent that there may have been a conflict of interest, the Board is of the opinion that it appears that Mr. Pampaian did not comply with the letter of the rule by notifying his supervisors in writing of a possible conflict of interest, but he clearly did so verbally, and was told to proceed as directed. Motion passed unanimously.

FY13.06 Ruen, Darius, ROPR

Mr. Howe is recused from this matter.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Wagner to enter into executive session to consider records that are exempt from disclosure as provided for by Idaho Code 67-2345(1)(d). Roll call vote results; Mr. Howe, yes; Mr. Elle, yes; Mr. Wagner, yes; Mr. Murgel, yes and Mr. Bennion, yes. After meeting in executive session, the Chairman directed the Board to return to regular session.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Wagner to authorize the Chair to write to Mr. Bartolome and inform him that we have no authority to hold a licensee responsible for the acts of his or her attorney. The Board voted to continue the matter pending resolution of litigation and a determination of whether there are substantive matters to be further investigated. Motion passed unanimously with Mr. Howe recused.

#### IV. NEW BUSINESS

2. Staff presented an Expense Reimbursement Summary for the Executive Director for September 2012 through October 2012 for the Board's review.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Murgel to approve the expense reimbursement summary as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

3. Staff provided an update on the Board's financial status as of October 31, 2012. The Board noted the information.
5. Mr. Kempe submitted a question about ITD Right of Way Surveys.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Murgel to authorize Mr. Howe and Mr. Elle to develop an answer to this question consistent with previous communications from the Board to licensees. Motion passed unanimously.

6. ISPE requested a non-voting representative from the Board be placed on the 2013 ISPE nominating committee for the upcoming Board position.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Murgel to appoint Mr. Wagner to serve as requested. Motion passed unanimously.

7. NCEES 2013 Call for Awards Nominations

Moved by Mr. Murgel, seconded by Mr. Elle to nominate Mr. Howe for the NCEES Western Zone Distinguished Service Award. Motion passed unanimously.

9. Staff drafted the 2012 Annual Report for the Board's Review.

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Murgel to approve submittal of the 2012 Annual Report to the Governor. Motion passed unanimously.

12. Does the Board wish to send representative(s) to the PNWER meeting (pnwer.org) in Coeur d'Alene, ID, November 14-17, 2012?

Moved by Mr. Elle, seconded by Mr. Wagner to authorize Mr. Bennion and Mr. Szatkowski to attend the PNWER Meeting with Mr. Howe as an alternative to Mr. Bennion if necessary. Motion passed unanimously.

16. Mr. Howe received a question from Mr. Hathaway.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Murgel to authorize Mr. Howe and Mr. Elle to develop a letter suggesting that he remonument both alleged corners with all information on both and follow up with the surveyor he alleges made the error. Motion passed unanimously.

15. Mr. Curtis discussed a draft NEWS BULLETIN with the Board.

Moved by Mr. Wagner, seconded by Mr. Elle to authorize staff to complete a draft of the NEWS BULLETIN, circulate it to the Board Members and give them 3 days to respond with edits. Motion passed unanimously.




